G20 Summit 2024 Rio Declaration

The Rio de Janeiro Declaration, released at the G20 Leaders' Summit in Rio de Janeiro on November 18, 2024, emphasizes several core commitments, including the taxation of billionaires, energy transition, and support for global climate initiatives like COP30 in Brasil. This historic declaration marks the culmination of Brazil's presidency, led by President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, who outlined the achievements and progressive themes championed during the summit.

Key Outcomes of the 2024 G20 Summit Highlighted by **President Lula**

At the closing of the G20 Brasil Leaders' Summit, President Lula emphasized the substantial achievements of Brazil's presidency. These include:

- Creation of the G20 Social Summit: A platform dedicated to social issues, aimed at fostering cooperation among member nations.
- Roadmap for Enhancing Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs): A strategic guide to reform MDBs for better global financial governance.
- Focus on Africa and External Debt: Initiatives to address challenges faced by African nations and reduce external debt burdens.
- Women's Empowerment Working Group: Establishment of a dedicated group to advance gender equality and women's
- **Inclusion of SDG 18**: A newly introduced Sustainable Development Goal focusing on ethnic-racial equality.

Emphasis on Trade and Sustainable Development

The declaration outlines principles for trade and sustainable development, emphasizing the importance of fair and sustainable trade practices. It also commits to:

- Increasing Renewable Energy Production: Pledges to enhance renewable energy output by 2023.
- Coalition for Local and Regional Production of Vaccines and **Medicines**: A coalition to boost healthcare self-sufficiency in developing regions.
- Investment in Public Policies for Water and Sanitation: Promoting investments to ensure access to clean water and proper sanitation.

President Lula's Reflections

President Lula highlighted the exhaustive efforts of Brazil's presidency, noting, "We have worked hard, even though we know that we have only scratched the surface of the profound challenges facing the world." He underscored the significance of collaboration between the Sherpa and Finance Tracks, which led to more effective outcomes.

Transition to South Africa's Presidency

As the G20 presidency transitioned to South African President Cyril Ramaphosa, Lula acknowledged the shared cultural, political, and economic ties between Africa and Latin America. He remarked that by 2026, every G20 nation would have held the presidency at least once, stressing, "This is the right time to evaluate the role we have played so far and how we should act from now on."

Focus on Key Themes of the Declaration

Social Inclusion and Poverty Eradication

The Global Alliance Against Hunger and Poverty was a major highlight, aimed at eliminating world hunger by 2030. Key points

- Support from Global Leaders and Institutions: 81 countries, 26 international organizations, 9 financial institutions, and 31 philanthropic foundations have joined this effort.
- Inauguration Ceremony: Attended by global leaders, including President Joe Biden, Olaf Scholz, Xi Jinping, and Emmanuel Macron.
- FAO Statistics: Lula cited that 733 million people are undernourished in 2024, emphasizing that political decisions, rather than scarcity, perpetuate hunger and poverty.

Climate Action and Energy Transition

Reinforcement of Climate Commitments

The G20 leaders reiterated their commitments to the Paris **Agreement** and the pursuit of carbon neutrality. They emphasized:

- Mobilization Against Climate Change: Urgent actions needed to meet climate targets, with an emphasis on public and private green financing.
- Support for COP30: Endorsement of COP30, set to be held in Belém, Brasil, in 2025, and ongoing negotiations at COP29 in Baku, Azerbaijan.
- **New Quantified Collective Objective for Climate Financing** (NCQG): A goal to enhance climate financing mechanisms.







Energy Transition Measures

The declaration stressed:

- **Investment in Developing Countries**: Support for fair and sustainable energy transitions in the Global South.
- Phasing Out Fossil Fuel Subsidies: Commitment to eliminating inefficient subsidies while promoting renewable energy.
- Clean and Sustainable Energy Initiatives: Efforts to drive energy transitions in line with environmental sustainability.

Global Governance Reform

Strengthening International Institutions

The declaration calls for comprehensive reform in global governance, including:

- Modernization of the United Nations: Enhancing the UN's ability to address global crises.
- International Financial System Reform: Advocating for a more inclusive and resilient financial architecture.
- Inclusive Multilateral Trading System: Promoting fair trade policies to benefit all nations.
- Ethical Development of Artificial Intelligence: Guidelines to ensure that AI advancements align with global ethical standards.

Addressing Inequality and Promoting Racial Equality

New Initiatives to Combat Inequality

For the first time, the G20 committed to addressing racial inequality, through:

- Progressive Taxation Policies: Advocating for the taxation of billionaires to redistribute wealth and reduce inequality.
- Mobilizing Resources for Basic Sanitation: Investments aimed at ensuring access to clean water and proper sanitation.
- Support for Ethnic-Racial Equality: Introducing measures to combat racism and promote social cohesion.

Establishment of the Global Alliance Against Hunger and **Poverty**

Alliance Objectives and Framework

The Global Alliance aims to fast-track progress toward the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030. Key features include:

- Country-Driven and **Evidence-Based** Programs: Encouraging nations to tailor solutions to their unique challenges.
- Knowledge Exchange and International Cooperation: Facilitating collaboration among governments, NGOs, and financial entities.
- Policy Tools and Instruments: A set of rigorously evaluated strategies to guide nations in eradicating hunger.

Alliance Portal

The dedicated website provides comprehensive resources, including:

- Event Agendas and News Updates: Information on meetings and developments.
- Participation Guidelines: How countries and organizations can join the Alliance.
- Policy Programs: Tools available to adapt to local contexts for impactful results.

Global Initiative for Information Integrity on Climate Change

Addressing Climate Disinformation

This initiative, emerging from the G20 discussions, targets climate denialism and disinformation. It focuses on:

- Collaboration Among Countries and Researchers: Strengthening global efforts to counter false narratives on climate change.
- Funding Research and Strategic Actions: Collecting data to support informed decision-making and communication strategies.
- Support for COP30: Ensuring accurate information dissemination to bolster climate action ahead of the 2025 conference.

President Lula concluded, "Countries cannot tackle this problem individually. This initiative will bring together countries, international organizations, and networks of researchers to support joint efforts to combat disinformation."

Brazil, UN, and UNESCO Launch Global Initiative for Information Integrity on Climate Change

- Brazil, in collaboration with the United Nations (UN) and UNESCO, has launched the Global Initiative for Information Integrity on Climate Change.
- The initiative aims to tackle disinformation affecting climate change actions, financing research, and spreading accurate climate-related information.
- The initiative is supported by an initial fund target of \$10 to \$15 million, raised over 36 months and managed by UNESCO.

Fundraising and Use of Grants

- Funds will be raised with the participation of several countries, including confirmed partners like Chile, Denmark, France, Morocco, the United Kingdom, and Sweden.
- The fund will distribute grants to non-governmental organizations (NGOs) focusing on:
 - Conducting research on climate information integrity.
 - Developing effective communication strategies.
 - Running public awareness campaigns about climate change.



Global Support and Commitment

- UN Secretary-General António Guterres emphasized the need to combat disinformation, including denial, greenwashing, and harassment of climate scientists.
- UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay highlighted the importance of reliable information, supporting journalists and researchers who face risks while investigating climate issues.
- The initiative aligns with the Global Digital Compact, promoting assessments of disinformation's impact on achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Sustainability and Climate Change Action

- The Declaration demands firm commitments to reducing greenhouse gas emissions, preventing deforestation, and protecting oceans.
- It stresses that adaptation and mitigation strategies must respect scientific knowledge and indigenous wisdom.
- Efforts must be aligned with Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC) and the Paris Agreement to keep warming below 1.5°C.

Just Transition Principles

- The just transition framework emphasizes replacing fossil fuels with a low-carbon economy, addressing social and environmental disparities.
- The proposal calls for extensive environmental education and social participation to empower communities.
- Special focus is given to energy poverty, environmental racism, and providing equitable opportunities for workers.

Conservation Efforts and Financial Mechanisms

- The Tropical Forest Forever Fund (TFFF) is proposed to finance forest conservation and support local communities.
- A New Collective Quantified Goal (NCQG) on climate finance is recommended to secure ongoing support for biodiversity and climate resilience.

Tax Justice and Funding Reforms

Progressive Taxation of the Super-Rich

- Social movements advocate for progressive taxes on the wealthiest individuals to fund social and environmental initiatives.
- Funds must be transparently managed and involve civil society in oversight to ensure effective use.

Commitment to Inclusive Global Solutions

- The Declaration concludes with a call for transformative leadership, urging G20 heads of state to address climate change, hunger, and governance reforms.
- Civil society representatives highlight the essential role of inclusive and participatory governance in shaping a sustainable and equitable world.

India-Australia 2nd Annual Summit Highlights

On November 19, 2024, Prime Minister Narendra Modi of India and Prime Minister Anthony Albanese of Australia held the 2nd India-Australia Annual Summit in Rio de Janeiro, alongside the G20 Summit. This summit marked a pivotal moment in the bilateral relationship, showcasing significant progress in diverse areas under the India-Australia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership (CSP). The leaders discussed shared regional and global challenges, emphasizing the importance of peace, stability, and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific region.

Key Highlights from the Summit

Strengthening Economic and Trade Relations

- Increased Bilateral Trade: Two-way trade surged, supported by the India-Australia Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (ECTA).
- Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA): Leaders expressed intent to finalize an ambitious, balanced CECA to unlock full economic potential.
- **Investment Synergies:** Emphasis on collaborative programs like 'Make in India' and 'Future Made in Australia.'
- Australia-India Business Exchange (AIBX): Extended until 2028 to promote business partnerships.

Advancing Energy, Science, and Technology

- Renewable Energy Partnership (REP): Framework for cooperation in solar PV, green hydrogen, energy storage, and workforce training.
- Critical Minerals Collaboration: Progress under the MoU between India's KABIL and Australia's Critical Minerals Office for clean energy transitions.
- **Space Cooperation:** Joint projects, including Gaganyaan support and the planned 2026 launch of Australian satellites by India.

Defense and Security Cooperation

- Enhanced Defense Collaboration: Plans to renew the Joint Declaration on Defence and Security Cooperation in 2025.
- **Defense Exercises:** Increased frequency and complexity of joint exercises to enhance interoperability.
- Maritime Security: Development of a joint roadmap for maritime security collaboration, including increased information-sharing.
- Defence Industry Engagement: Indian participation in the 2024 Perth Defence Conference and Melbourne Exposition.

Parliamentary Cooperation

Leaders emphasized the importance of inter-parliamentary exchanges as a component of the CSP.



Education, Sports, and People-to-People Ties

- Consulate Openings: New Consulate-General offices in Bengaluru and Brisbane to bolster cultural and trade ties.
- Mobility Programs: Launch of Australia's Working Holiday Maker Visa and the MATES scheme for STEM graduates.
- Educational **Collaboration:** Australian universities established campuses in India, strengthening bilateral educational partnerships.
- **Sports Diplomacy:** Engagement in sports workforce training, science, and event management.

Regional and Multilateral Cooperation

- Indo-Pacific Focus: Reiterated commitment to an open, inclusive, stable Indo-Pacific aligned with UNCLOS principles.
- Quad Cooperation: Strengthened ties within the Quad framework to address challenges like pandemics, maritime security, and climate change.
- Indian Ocean Collaboration: Joint efforts under the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA).

Commitment to Global Peace and Security

- Terrorism: Joint condemnation of terrorism and focus on combating financing through FATF and other mechanisms.
- Global Conflicts: Advocated resolution of conflicts via diplomacy and dialogue.

Looking Forward

- Commemoration of the CSP's Fifth Anniversary (2025): Celebratory initiatives planned to mark five years of strengthened ties.
- Future Summit: India to host the 3rd Annual Summit in 2025.

ALTT EFF 2024 Film Festival

The All Living Things Environmental Film Festival (ALT EFF) returns to Mumbai for its 2024 edition, running from November 22 to December 8 at Liberty Cinema. Since its inception in 2020, ALT EFF has become a significant platform for environmental storytelling, bringing global issues of sustainability and climate change to the forefront through cinema. The festival is expanding its reach, with screenings in over 70 cities across India, including villages, fostering a wider conversation on environmental challenges.

A Growing Platform for Environmental Storytelling

ALT EFF was launched in Panchgani, Maharashtra, and quickly grew into India's leading environmental film festival, screening over 50 films annually. It features a mix of international and Indian films across genres like documentaries, fiction, and animated films, all exploring themes such as climate change, biodiversity, and sustainability. The festival's hybrid format includes both in-person and virtual screenings to maximize its impact.

Notable Partnerships and Film Highlights

Prominent figures like Bollywood actor Jackie Shroff, serving as the brand ambassador, and acclaimed director Richie Mehta, who advocates for environmental consciousness, support the festival. Notable films this year include Poacher (directed by Richie Mehta), focusing on illegal wildlife trade, and The Last Forest, a documentary on India's indigenous tribes fighting deforestation. These films highlight the intersection of human activity and environmental destruction, encouraging activism and reflection.

A Vision for Change Through Cinema

Kunal Khanna, co-founder and festival director, emphasizes the festival's mission to make environmental films accessible to people across India. With his experience in sustainability policies from his time in Australia, Khanna advocates for climate justice and highlights critical issues like marine life, indigenous cultures, and the cost of capitalism. The festival not only entertains but also sparks conversations, inspiring audiences to reflect on their own roles in addressing climate change.

ALT EFF (All Living Things Environmental Film Festival)

Inception & Growth: Launched in 2020 in Panchgani, Maharashtra, ALT EFF has grown into India's leading environmental film festival.

Dates & Location: The 2024 edition takes place from November 22 to December 8 at Liberty Cinema in Mumbai.

Film Selection: Screens approximately 50 films annually, blending Indian and international works focused on environmental and socio-ecological issues.

Festival Format: Hybrid approach with both in-person screenings and virtual events.

Themes: Covers climate change, biodiversity, conservation, sustainability, and the impact of human activity.

Prominent Figures: Actor Jackie Shroff is the brand ambassador; director Richie Mehta is an advocate for environmental consciousness.

Notable Films: Highlights include Poacher (on illegal wildlife trade) and The Last Forest (on indigenous tribes defending the environment).

Reach & Accessibility: Expands to over 70 cities across India, including 30+ villages, making the festival accessible to diverse communities.

Vision: Aims to inspire environmental activism and spark meaningful conversations on climate justice through cinema.

Global Hunger and Poverty Alliance

On November 18, 2024, Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva officially launched the Global Alliance Against Hunger and **Poverty** during the opening of the G20 Summit in Rio de Janeiro. This landmark initiative, involving 148 founding members, including 82 countries and a variety of international organizations, financial institutions, and NGOs, aims to accelerate efforts to eradicate hunger and poverty globally by 2030.



Key Highlights of the Global Alliance

Background and Objectives

- Hunger Statistics: Currently, 733 million people face undernourishment globally, equivalent to the combined populations of Brazil, Mexico, Germany, the UK, South Africa, and Canada.
- Alliance Goal: Eradicate hunger and poverty by 2030, reduce inequalities, and foster sustainable development through international cooperation.
- Inspirational Programs: The Alliance draws from Brazil's successful programs like Bolsa Família, the National School Feeding Program, and the Food Acquisition Program.

Founding Members

- Countries: 82 member nations, including Brazil, India, China, the US, and European nations.
- International Organizations: Includes the African Union, EU, UNICEF, FAO, and WTO.
- Financial Institutions: World Bank Group, African Development Bank, and others committed to mobilizing funds.
- NGOs and Philanthropies: Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, BRAC, and Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative among others.

Strategic Pillars

- National: Develop and adapt policies for local realities.
- **Financial:** Mobilize funds for programs, including cash transfers and grants.
- **Knowledge:** Promote evidence-based practices and knowledge sharing among members.

Key Initiatives and Commitments

- Cash Transfers: Extend cash transfer programs to 500 million people in low- and lower-middle-income countries by 2030.
- School Meals: Expand access to high-quality school meals to 150 million children in poverty-stricken areas.
- **Funding:** Multilateral development banks to raise billions in credit and grants to support the Alliance's programs.

Governance and Operations

- Oversight: Regular Summits Against Hunger and Poverty and a High-Level Champions Council will monitor progress.
- Support Mechanism: A dedicated technical body hosted by the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) to provide strategic support.
- **Funding Commitment:** Brazil will finance half of the Support Mechanism's costs through 2030, with contributions from other nations like Germany and Norway.

Impactful Sprints

 Ahead of the formal launch, the Alliance achieved early commitments in six priority areas of its agenda during the G20 Social Summit on November 15. These "2030 Sprints" represent a large-scale effort to combat hunger and extreme poverty.

The Brazilian Example

 Lula highlighted Brazil's achievements in reducing hunger, particularly through social programs that lifted over 24.5 million people out of extreme poverty. He reaffirmed Brazil's commitment to eradicating hunger and leaving the FAO Hunger Map by 2026.

Vision and Legacy

- The Alliance aspires to be a global platform for change, transcending its G20 origins to ensure a coordinated global effort to combat hunger and poverty.
- Lula described the Alliance as "humanity's collective responsibility", emphasizing the need to prioritize justice and equality to achieve a more peaceful and prosperous world.

PM Modi Receives Highest Honors from Guyana and Dominica

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been conferred prestigious awards by Guyana and Dominica in recognition of his significant contributions during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as his efforts in strengthening international ties, especially between India and these Caribbean nations. These awards highlight the deepening diplomatic relations and the global recognition of Modi's leadership in global health, climate resilience, and development cooperation.

Guyana's 'The Order of Excellence' Award

- PM Modi was awarded 'The Order of Excellence,' Guyana's highest honor, by President Irfaan Ali.
- The award acknowledges his exceptional contributions during the COVID-19 pandemic and his global leadership.
- Modi dedicated the honor to the people of India, highlighting the long-standing ties between India and Guyana.
- The award emphasizes the strengthening of India-Guyana relations, with Modi's visit seen as a testament to India's commitment to these ties.

Dominica's 'Award of Honour'

- Modi was also conferred the 'Dominica Award of Honour' by President Sylvanie Burton of Dominica.
- The award recognizes Modi's leadership and India's support during the COVID-19 pandemic, including the provision of 70,000 AstraZeneca vaccines to Dominica.
- Modi dedicated the award to the people of India and emphasized the unbreakable bond between India and Dominica, especially in times of crisis.
- Dominica's Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit praised Modi for his global partnership and South-South collaboration, recognizing the enduring legacy of his leadership.

Recognition of Global Leadership

 Both awards highlight Modi's statesmanship, resilience in the face of global challenges, and commitment to human solidarity.





- Modi's actions during the pandemic, particularly the provision of vaccines and other forms of support, are central to the recognition by both nations.
- The awards reflect shared values between India, Guyana, and Dominica, such as democracy, resilience, and unity in addressing global issues like climate change and sustainable development.

Future Implications

- These awards underscore the growing influence of India in global diplomacy, particularly in the Caribbean and South-South cooperation.
- Modi's contributions to healthcare, education, and climate resilience have strengthened India's global standing and bilateral ties with these nations.

Upcoming Recognition

Barbados is set to confer its top award on Modi, bringing his international awards tally to 19.

UN Climate Change Conference COP 29 in Baku, November

The 2024 UN Climate Change Conference (COP 29) will be held in Baku, Azerbaijan, in November 2024. This pivotal event will address crucial issues such as the enhanced transparency framework, the collective quantified goal on finance, and the next round of Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).

Alongside COP 29, other significant meetings will take place, including the 19th session of the Kyoto Protocol (CMP 19), the sixth session of the Paris Agreement (CMA 6), and the 61st sessions of the Subsidiary Bodies for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA 61) and Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI 61). The summit aims to push the climate agenda forward by focusing on achieving the 1.5°C target, ensuring climate transitions, and securing robust support for NDCs.

Key Themes and Pillars of COP 29 Presidency

Azerbaijan's COP 29 Presidency, led by Minister Mukhtar Babayev, has outlined a bold vision under the theme "In **Solidarity for a Green World."** This vision focuses on two primary pillars:

Enhancing Ambition – Fostering greater international cooperation to boost climate action in line with the 1.5°C goal. **Enabling Action** – Ensuring the necessary financial and technical support is in place for effective NDC implementation.

Roadmap to Mission 1.5°C

In March 2024, a letter was sent by the Presidencies of COP 28 (UAE), COP 29 (Azerbaijan), and COP 30 (Brazil), outlining a 'Roadmap to Mission 1.5°C.' The roadmap aims to significantly ramp up global cooperation to enhance ambition in the next round of NDCs. High-level political meetings will be held, including the Germany-hosted Petersberg Climate Dialogue and a special session during COP 29, to address barriers to NDC development and ensure that the international community supports climate transitions.

Strategic Support for NDC Development

The Presidencies emphasize the need for targeted financial and political support to ensure that NDCs can deliver on climate goals. Discussions will focus on the quantity and quality of resources required to help countries achieve their climate targets. The G20 and other platforms will play a vital role in channeling existing knowledge and resources toward ambitious NDC development.

Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar For 2022 and 2023

The Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar (UBKUP) is a prestigious award instituted by the Sangeet Natak Akademi in 2006 to honor outstanding young performing artists across India. Named after Bharat Ratna Ustad Bismillah Khan, the award aims to encourage and motivate young practitioners in music, dance, drama, folk and tribal arts, puppetry, and other performing arts. On 22nd November 2024, Union Minister of Culture and Tourism, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, will confer the awards for the years 2022 and 2023 in a special ceremony at the Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, New Delhi. The ceremony will be presided over by **Dr. Sandhya Purecha**, Chairman of Sangeet Natak Akademi, and Smt. Uma Nanduri, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Culture.


About the Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar

- The United States has returned over 1,400 looted artifacts worth \$10 million to India as part of an ongoing effort to repatriate stolen cultural items from **South and Southeast** Asia. 


