Jalvahak Scheme

India's inland waterways sector received a significant boost with the unveiling of the 'Jalvahak' scheme by the Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways (MoPSW), Shri Sarbananda Sonowal. Designed to promote long-haul cargo movement across National Waterways 1 (Ganga), 2 (Brahmaputra), and 16 (Barak), this initiative aims to transform waterways into a sustainable, efficient, and economical mode of transportation. Alongside the launch of this scheme, fixed scheduled cargo services were inaugurated, marking a step toward enhancing logistics and decongesting road and rail networks.

Launch of 'Jalvahak' Policy

- Incentivizes long-haul cargo transportation on National Waterways 1, 2, and 16.
- Provides a reimbursement of up to 35% of the operating expenditure incurred by cargo owners.
- Targets distances exceeding 300 km, focusing on bulk and containerized cargo.
- Encourages partnerships with private operators by allowing cargo owners to hire vessels outside government entities like IWAI or ICSL.
- Validity: Initially launched for a three-year period.

- Limited mechanized craft suitable for inland navigation.
- Need for greater private sector involvement.

Understanding La-Nina's Effect

La Niña, a phase of the El Niño Southern Oscillation (ENSO), has significant effects on global weather patterns. This climatic phenomenon is characterized by cooler-than-usual sea surface temperatures in the central and eastern Pacific Ocean. While La Niña typically leads to increased rainfall in India during the monsoon season, it can also cause disruptions in other parts of the world, such as droughts in Africa and intensified hurricanes in the Atlantic. The emergence of La Niña is a critical factor in determining India's seasonal weather, including its monsoons and winters. However, the delay in La Niña's expected onset in 2024 has raised questions about its eventual impact.

What is La Niña?

- La Niña is part of the El Niño Southern Oscillation (ENSO) and occurs when the central and eastern Pacific Ocean experiences cooler-than-normal sea surface temperatures.
- It often brings opposite weather effects compared to El **Niño**, which is marked by warmer sea surface temperatures.

Impact on India's Climate

- Monsoons: La Niña typically leads to normal or abovenormal rainfall during the monsoon season in India.
- Winter: La Niña winters tend to be colder, but not always uniformly across the country.
- Summer: La Niña generally mitigates extreme heat during the summer, contrasting with the hotter, drier conditions associated with El Niño.

Delayed La Niña in 2024

- The La Niña phase was expected to begin by July 2024, but it has not emerged as predicted.
- Forecasts suggest that La Niña may form by late 2024 or early 2025, but its strength may be weaker than usual.
- Historically, La Niña has formed more commonly in the monsoon or pre-monsoon periods. It has formed only twice between October and December since 1950.

Current Oceanic Niño Index (ONI) Values

- The ONI compares three-month average sea surface temperatures in the tropical Pacific to a 30-year average.
- For La Niña, ONI values must be below -0.5°C, and the current ONI value is around -0.3°C, indicating a weak La Niña.

La Niña Winter

- Southern India: Cities like Bengaluru and Hyderabad have experienced colder winters, though this may not be directly linked to La Niña, given the weak ONI values.
- Northern India: There has been a delay in the onset of winter, with above-normal temperatures observed.
- Air Quality: La Niña winters tend to have higher wind speeds, which help in dispersing pollutants and improving air quality. However, lower planetary boundary layer heights can trap pollutants near the ground.

Effects of La Niña on Air Pollution

- Faster wind speeds during La Niña winters help transport pollutants away, improving air quality.
- A lower planetary boundary layer height could potentially trap pollutants, worsening air quality, especially if people burn biomass for heating.

La Niña and Monsoon Outlook for 2025

- If La Niña persists into the summer of 2025, it could offer relief from extreme heat, unlike the intense heatwaves observed in El Niño years.
- La Niña generally supports a robust monsoon, leading to normal or above-normal rainfall in India.
- El Niño Impact: El Niño years, on the other hand, typically result in below-average rainfall during the monsoon, as seen in 2023.

Historical La Niña and El Niño Trends

- India has received less rainfall during intense El Niño events (e.g., 1980s, 1990s), with more pronounced effects in north and south India.
- In contrast, La Niña years (e.g., 2020, 2021, 2022) have generally provided normal or above-normal rainfall.

Potential Impact of La Niña in 2024-2025

If La Niña forms as expected, it could lead to,

- A milder winter, with cooler temperatures in southern India.
- A more moderate summer with less intense heat.
- A stronger monsoon season, with higher rainfall across India, benefiting agriculture and water resources.

Gadhimai Festival

The Gadhimai Festival, held every five years in southeastern Nepal, is one of the world's most controversial religious observances, known for the mass slaughter of animals. This quinquennial event, rooted in centuries of tradition, draws hundreds of thousands of Hindus who believe the ritual will appease the Hindu goddess Gadhimai, bringing them prosperity. However, the festival's massive scale and the cruelty involved have sparked fierce debates between animal rights activists and devotees. Despite legal challenges and public outcry, the festival's bloodshed continues, raising important questions about the intersection of religion, tradition, and animal welfare.





Key Points on the Gadhimai Festival

Origins and Beliefs

- Founder: Bhagwan Chowdhary, founder of the Gadhimai temple in Bariyarpur, Bara District, Nepal.
- **Mythology:** According to the legend, Gadhimai, the goddess of power, promised prosperity to Chowdhary in exchange for a blood sacrifice.
- Animal Sacrifice: Initially, human blood was desired, but animal blood was substituted, which became the foundation of the tradition.

Rituals and Scale of the Sacrifice

- Animal Sacrifice: The festival includes the slaughter of a variety of animals, including rats, pigeons, goats, and water buffaloes.
- Estimates: In the 2019 festival, around 250,000 animals were sacrificed. In 2009, the figure was as high as 500,000
- Involvement: Animals are sometimes brought from India, and the Nepalese government has historically supported the event.

Efforts to End the Sacrifices

Petitions and Legal Challenges: Animal welfare groups and individuals, including former actress Brigitte Bardot, have petitioned the courts in Nepal and India to stop the festival's animal sacrifices.

Supreme Court Rulings

- India (2014): The Supreme Court ordered that neighboring Indian states restrict the transport of animals for the Gadhimai festival.
- Nepal (2016): The Supreme Court ruled that the government should phase out and discourage animal sacrifices. However, this ruling has been largely ignored, and the sacrifices continue.

Government Responses

- The Nepalese government has stated that it would not use force to prevent the sacrifices, citing religious sentiments.
- In 2015, temple caretakers promised a blood-free festival in 2019, but the killings went ahead as planned.

Ongoing Debate

- Supporters: Devotees view the Gadhimai festival as an important, untouchable religious tradition essential for gaining blessings from the goddess.
- Criticism: Activists argue the festival exploits both animals and impoverished communities, calling the sacrifices cruel, violent, and inhumane.

Current Status

- 2024 Festival: The animal sacrifices began on December 8, despite ongoing legal and ethical concerns.
- Global Attention: The Gadhimai Festival remains a flashpoint for discussions about animal rights, cultural practices, and the role of religion in modern society.

India Promotes AYUSH Systems Globally

The Ministry of AYUSH has launched a scheme for the promotion of international cooperation to enhance awareness and recognition of AYUSH systems worldwide. As part of this initiative, India has established AYUSH Chairs at five foreign universities—Bangladesh, Australia, Mauritius, Latvia, and Malaysia. This effort is aimed at advancing academic exchange, research, and public awareness of Ayurveda, Yoga, Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha, Sowa-Rigpa, and Homoeopathy, contributing to their global acceptance.

Key Objectives and Scope of the Scheme

The scheme's objectives are to promote international awareness of AYUSH, facilitate its development and recognition abroad, foster interaction among stakeholders, and support the market development of AYUSH products, services, education, and research globally. In addition, the Ministry supports the establishment of AYUSH academic chairs in foreign countries to boost academic collaboration and research.

Strategic Partnerships and Initiatives

The Ministry has signed 24 MoUs with foreign countries for cooperation in traditional medicine, including 15 MoUs with international institutes for setting up AYUSH Chairs. This is part of a broader effort to strengthen the global presence of AYUSH. The Ministry also offers scholarships for foreign nationals to study AYUSH in India and has established 42 **AYUSH Information Cells in 38 countries.**

AYUSH Chairs' Role and Function

- The AYUSH Chairs are part of India's ongoing efforts to integrate AYUSH into global health systems. These Chairs promote research and education on AYUSH systems, advancing their recognition in the host countries. Under this
- Indian experts are deployed at foreign institutions, and the Ministry provides financial support, including salaries and travel expenses, while the host university offers accommodation and local hospitality.


Sahitya Akademi Awards 2024

55th GST Council Meeting Key Highlights and Proposals

The 55th GST Council meeting, chaired by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, convened ministers from 28 states, two Union Territories, and key stakeholders. The discussions centered on vital tax reforms impacting consumers and businesses across sectors, focusing on luxury items, essential services, and rationalizing the tax structure.

Key Highlights

Luxury Items Under Spotlight

- Proposal to increase GST rates on high-end products,
- Wristwatches priced above ₹25,000 and shoes costing over ₹15,000 per pair may attract a 28% GST (up from 18%).
- Premium garments above ₹10,000 might also face a steep 28% tax, while,
- Garments below ₹1,500 remain at 5%.
- Garments between ₹1,500 and ₹10,000 may see a jump to
- Aim: Align taxation with pricing structures of luxury goods.

Reforms for Food Delivery Platforms

- GST rate for platforms like Swiggy and Zomato may be
- From 18% with Input Tax Credit (ITC) to a simplified 5% without ITC.

Impact

- Lower delivery charges, benefiting consumers.
- Address disparity between dining out and food delivery taxation.

GST on Insurance Products

- Proposals to reform GST on insurance premiums to make policies affordable:
- Health insurance plans with ₹5 lakh coverage and term life insurance may be exempted from GST.
- Current GST on health and life insurance premiums is 18%, while endowment and annuity plans have variable rates.
- Recommendations: Exemptions for senior citizen-focused policies.
- Rationale: Align with international practices where insurance products are largely tax-free.

Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) in GST

Proposal to bring ATF under the GST regime

- Airlines could claim input tax credit, reducing operational costs.
- Resistance likely from states due to revenue concerns.
- Rate Rationalization on 148 Items

Proposed increase in GST for certain goods

Items like compact vehicles and pre-owned electric vehicles may move from the 12% to 18% bracket.



Sin Goods

 Aerated beverages, cigarettes, and tobacco could see GST rates rise to 35% (from 28%), with additional cess.

Current GST Structure

- **Four main GST slabs:** 5%, 12%, 18%, and 28%, alongside zero percent and special rates for precious metals.
- Law permits a maximum combined GST rate of 40% (20% CGST + 20% SGST).

Challenges with Proposed Changes

- High taxation on items like cigarettes may increase smuggling and tax evasion, causing greater revenue loss.
- Differentiated tax slabs based on price could lead to administrative complexity and evasion tactics.

Concerns with Revenue and Compliance

- Quality of revenue remains poor due to high social costs of raising additional tax revenue.
- Evasion persists despite increased GST collections, necessitating better analytics and enforcement.

Broader Recommendations

- Expanding the GST base by including petroleum products like ATF and natural gas.
- Reducing litigation and arrears to enhance efficiency.
- Ensuring minimal disruption to the current stability in GST compliance and collections.

National Affairs

- The Ministry of Textiles, Government of India is hosting the Viraasat Sari Festival 2024 from 15th to 28th December at Handloom Haat, Janpath, New Delhi. Building on previous success with 20,000 visitors, the festival celebrates India's handloom heritage and sari weaving traditions. It aims to unite weavers, designers, enthusiasts, and buyers, showcasing the cultural and economic significance of the handloom sector and providing artisans a platform to display and sell their creations. The Chief Minister emphasized women's empowerment and called for peace and unity across the state. - Uber has launched the 'Moto Women' pilot program in Bengaluru, offering an on-demand bike taxi service exclusively for female riders and drivers. - Mikheil Kavelashvili, a 53-year-old former footballer, was elected President of Georgia on December 16, 2024, signaling a shift in the country's politics. His win, supported by the Georgian Dream party, comes amid concerns over Georgia's growing alignment with Russia and constitutional changes replacing direct presidential elections with a 300seat electoral college. Critics fear this election could harm Georgia's European Union aspirations and reflect increasing authoritarianism. (Click here to read article)
- Mount Semeru in East Java, Indonesia, erupted on 15th December, releasing a thick column of ash up to 1,000 meters high. The eruption triggered an aviation warning from Indonesia's Center for Volcanology and Geological Hazard Mitigation, issuing an orange Volcano Observatory Notice. Flight restrictions were enforced within a 5kilometer radius of the volcano. (Click here to read article)
- On December 15, 2024, the United Kingdom became the first European nation to join the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP). This move is part of the UK's post-Brexit strategy to boost its economy through new business opportunities and trade benefits in the Indo-Pacific region. The CPTPP, originally formed by 11 countries, aims to reduce trade barriers and accounts for 15% of global GDP, including fastgrowing markets. (Click here to read article)
- The U.S. military successfully tested its Long-Range Hypersonic Weapon (LRHW), also known as "Dark Eagle," at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station, Florida. The missile reached speeds over 3,800 miles per hour (Mach 5) and demonstrated its ability to strike distant, well-defended targets. This milestone in hypersonic technology brings the weapon closer to operational deployment by 2025. (Click here to read article)
- Cyclone Chido, a Category 4 storm, caused widespread destruction in Mayotte before making landfall in Mozambique's Cabo Delgado province on December 15, 2024. The storm caused severe damage in Mayotte with winds exceeding 220 km/h. After crossing the Mozambique Channel, it intensified, impacting northern Mozambique with winds over 200 km/h and heavy rainfall, threatening lives and properties. (Click here to read article)
 - The Gympie-Gympie (Dendrocnide moroides) is the most toxic plant in the world, found in Australia, Indonesia, and the Moluccas. Despite its heart-shaped leaves, it is covered with neurotoxin-laden trichomes that cause excruciating pain upon contact, described as a combination of burning with hot acid and electrocution, with effects lasting weeks or months. - Javier Milei, Argentina's President, was granted Italian citizenship due to his Italian ancestry, sparking criticism in Argentina. The decision highlights Italy's citizenship by descent policy, which offers citizenship to descendants of Italian emigrants. - Israel has approved a settlement expansion plan in the **Golan Heights**, allocating **\$11.13 million** to enhance infrastructure and double the population in this strategically significant region. 

- On December 12, 2024, ISRO successfully conducted a sealevel hot test of its CE20 cryogenic engine at the ISRO Propulsion Complex in Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu. This critical test demonstrated the engine's restart systems and showcased innovations like the Nozzle Protection System to mitigate challenges. The CE20 engine, with a thrust of 19 tonnes (upgraded to 22 tonnes), enhances India's space exploration capabilities, enabling heavier payload launches and contributing to missions like Chandrayaan-3 and Gaganyaan. This positions India among the few countries with indigenous cryogenic engines. (Click here to read article)
- China has set a new global record in space exploration, with astronauts Cai Xuzhe and Song Lingdong completing a 9-hour spacewalk aboard the Tiangong space station.
