India-Kuwait Elevate Ties to Strategic Partnership

India and Kuwait marked a historic milestone in their bilateral relations during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's first official visit to Kuwait on December 21-22, 2024. The visit culminated in the elevation of their ties to a "Strategic Partnership," signifying deeper cooperation across trade, defence, energy, and cultural domains. Kuwait also honored PM Modi with its highest civilian award, 'The Order of Mubarak Al-Kabeer,' in recognition of his role in fostering bilateral ties.

Key Highlights of the Visit

1. Formalizing Strategic Partnership

PM Modi and Kuwait's Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah agreed to deepen collaboration through the establishment of new Joint Working Groups (JWGs) in trade, technology, education, and defence. The leaders reiterated their commitment to advancing people-to-people ties and sustaining high-level ministerial interactions.

2. Defence and Security Cooperation

The signing of an MoU in defence marked a pivotal step in enhancing bilateral ties. Both nations agreed to conduct joint military exercises, bolster maritime safety, and facilitate coproduction of defence equipment. The leaders condemned terrorism in all forms and called for disrupting terror-financing networks and fostering cybersecurity collaboration.

3. Trade and Investment Opportunities

Kuwait lauded India's efforts to create a conducive environment for foreign investments and expressed interest in Indian infrastructure, technology, and food security sectors. Discussions focused on expediting the Bilateral Investment Treaty and strengthening trade linkages by diversifying the export-import portfolio.

4. Energy Partnership

Recognizing the potential for growth, both sides agreed to expand their energy ties beyond the buyer-seller dynamic. Kuwait expressed interest in India's Strategic Petroleum Reserve Program and committed to enhanced collaboration in oil, gas, and renewable energy sectors.

5. Cultural and Educational Exchanges

The renewal of the Cultural Exchange Programme (2025-2029) and Executive Programme on Sports (2025-2028) aimed at fostering deeper cultural ties. Both countries explored avenues for educational cooperation, including digital libraries and EdTech platforms.

Defence MoU: Strengthens bilateral defence ties.

Cultural Exchange Programme: Facilitates collaborations in arts and literature until 2029.

Sports Executive Programme: Strengthens cooperation in sports

New Consumer Protection Apps Launched on National Consumer Day 2024

On National Consumer Day 2024, the Department of Consumer Affairs launched three new apps aimed at enhancing consumer protection and addressing deceptive online practices. These apps are part of a larger initiative to empower consumers in the digital age, addressing emerging challenges such as dark patterns in e-commerce. This marks a significant step forward from the Consumer Protection Act of 1986, which laid the foundation for safeguarding consumer rights in India. The new tools highlight the government's ongoing commitment to consumer empowerment and digital transformation.

Jago Grahak Jago App

The Jago Grahak Jago App provides consumers with crucial information about e-commerce platforms, helping them identify potentially unsafe websites. The app alerts users to online shopping risks, aiming to raise awareness and empower consumers to make informed decisions when shopping online.

Jagriti App

Designed to encourage proactive consumer engagement, the Jagriti App allows users to report websites suspected of using deceptive online practices, such as dark patterns. These reports are sent to the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) for further investigation, making it easier for consumers to voice their concerns and take action against unfair practices.

Jagriti Dashboard

The Jagriti Dashboard aggregates data from the complaints submitted through the Jagriti App, offering a comprehensive view of consumer trends. It helps authorities track the prevalence of dark patterns across different platforms, enabling more effective regulation and intervention.

National Consumer Day 2024 Theme and Significance

The theme for National Consumer Day 2024, "Virtual Hearings & Digital Access to Consumer Justice," underscores the growing need for digital solutions in consumer protection. It highlights the importance of making consumer justice more accessible through virtual hearings, thus empowering consumers to seek redress without needing to be physically present.

Key Consumer Rights to Remember

National Consumer Day is also an opportunity to remind consumers of their rights under the Consumer Protection Act, **2019.** These rights include the right to safety, information, choice, being heard, seeking redressal, and consumer education—principles that guide the government's ongoing efforts to protect consumers in both the physical and digital marketplace.

Selection Process

- The Ministry of Defence emphasized that the selection of states and ministries was conducted in a fair, transparent, and merit-based manner. The process involved several steps to ensure high-quality representation,
- Proposals Invited: States, Union Territories, and Union ministries were invited to submit their proposals for the tableaux.
- **Expert Committee:** A panel of experts, including professionals in art, culture, music, architecture, and choreography, evaluated the submissions.
- **Selection Criteria:** The main criteria for selection included:
- **Originality:** The uniqueness of the tableau concept.
- Creativity: Innovative presentation of ideas.
- Aesthetic Composition: Visual appeal and balance in design.
- Heritage and Development: A clear representation of India's cultural heritage and progress.
- Incorporation of Feedback: Based on recommendations from a senior-level meeting held in April 2024, the selection process was enhanced to ensure better quality and diversity in the tableaux.
- **Exclusion of Repetitive Ideas:** Proposals that showcased similar ideas were excluded to ensure variety and uniqueness.

President Appoints New Governors For Five States

In a significant move aimed at reorganizing governance and addressing political and administrative challenges, President Droupadi Murmu announced the appointment of two new governors and reassigned three others across five states. The reshuffle reflects a strategic approach to strengthen leadership in regions grappling with political unrest, administrative challenges, and security concerns. The respective states are Kerala, Bihar, Odisha, Manipur and Mizoram.

Key Appointments and Transfers

1. Ajay Kumar Bhalla Appointed As a Manipur Governor

Background

- Replaces: Anusuiya Uikey
- Former Union Home Secretary with a distinguished career as a 1984-batch IAS officer of the Assam-Meghalaya cadre.
- Retired on August 22, 2024, after over five years in the position, making him one of the longest-serving Home Secretaries.
- Played a pivotal role in drafting key legislations like the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019, and the three new criminal laws.

Significance

- Brings first-hand knowledge of the security situation in Manipur, which has been embroiled in ethnic violence between the Meitei and Kuki communities since May 2023.
- The conflict has claimed over 250 lives and continues to challenge the state's governance.

2. Arif Mohammed Khan Transferred To Bihar

Background

- Previous Role: Governor of Kerala
- Known for his intellectual stance and political acumen.
- Had frequent confrontations with the Pinarayi Vijayan-led Left Front government in Kerala over various issues.

Significance

- His transfer marks a politically significant move, potentially to ease tensions in Kerala.
- Succeeds Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar in Bihar.

3. Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar Resassigned To Kerala

Background

- Previous Role: Governor of Bihar
- An experienced administrator with an understanding of political dynamics.

Significance

This exchange of governors between Kerala and Bihar is seen as a strategic decision to balance governance in both states.



4. Hari Babu Kambhampati Transferred To Odisha

Background

- Previous Role: Governor of Mizoram
- A seasoned leader with administrative experience in Mizoram.

Significance

- Replaces Raghubar Das, whose resignation has been accepted.
- 5. General Dr. Vijay Kumar Singh Appointed As Governor of Mizoram

Background

- Replaces: Hari Babu Kambhampati
- A decorated retired Army officer and former Union Minister.
- Twice elected MP from Ghaziabad on a BJP ticket (2014, 2019).

Significance

His military and administrative experience is expected to contribute to the development and stability of Mizoram.

National Affairs

- Nitin Gadkari, Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways, inaugurated India's first bio-bitumen-based National Highway stretch on NH-44 in Mansar, Nagpur, Maharashtra. The stretch uses lignin-based bio-bitumen technology developed by Praj Industries in collaboration with CSIR-CRRI, NHAI, and Oriental. This milestone represents a significant advancement in sustainability and self-reliance in India's road development sector. (Click here to read article)
- The **Indian government** abolished the **No-detention policy** for Class 5 and 8 students, which previously ensured automatic promotion. Under the new amendment to the Right to Education rules, 2010, students failing their yearend exams must retake them within two months. If they fail again, they will have to repeat the academic year. This rule affects over 3,000 centrally run schools, including Kendriya Vidyalayas, Sainik Schools, and Navodaya Vidyalayas. (Click here to read article)

- The Indian government launched the 'Udaan Yatri Cafe' initiative to address concerns over overpriced food at airports. The pilot project, located at Kolkata's Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport, offers **affordable refreshments** like water, tea, coffee, and snacks. If successful, the initiative will expand to other Airports Authority of India (AAI)-run airports. (Click here to read article)
- Queen's University Belfast and Coventry University have applied to set up international campuses at GIFT City in Gujarat, marking a significant step as India relaxes regulations for foreign institutions. Queen's University plans to offer postgraduate programs, while Coventry University, with existing global campuses, will expand its presence in India. (Click here to read article)
- Union Home Minister **Amit Shah** chaired a review meeting of Bhartiya Beej Sahkari Samiti Limited (BBSSL) in New Delhi, highlighting its role in realizing PM Modi's vision of "Sehkar Se Samriddhi" by empowering farmers through traditional seed preservation. Key objectives included expanding the cooperative network by connecting with 20,000 additional cooperatives by 2025-26, focusing on sustainable seeds with lower water and pesticide needs, and evaluating the nutritional value of indigenous and hybrid seeds through organizations like IFFCO and KRIBHCO. 

International Affairs

- Donald Trump, US President-elect, has appointed Indian-American entrepreneur and venture capitalist Sriram Krishnan as Senior Policy Advisor for Artificial Intelligence (AI) at the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy. Krishnan will work with David Sacks, the White House Al & Crypto Czar, to ensure America's leadership in AI, shape AI policy, and collaborate with the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology. - Rodrigo Rato, former IMF Chief and Spain's Deputy Prime Minister, was sentenced to four years, nine months, and one day in prison by a Madrid court for corruption, tax offences, and money laundering. He was convicted on three counts and ordered to pay over €2 million in fines, along with €568,413 in penalties to tax authorities. Rato denies wrongdoing and plans to appeal the decision. - Aisake Valu Eke has been elected as Tonga's new Prime Minister following the abrupt resignation of Siaosi Sovaleni. This political transition comes amid challenges such as strained monarchy-government relations, economic hardships, and the aftermath of natural disasters. (Click here to read article)



- An Azerbaijan Airlines Embraer 190 jet crashed near Aktau, Kazakhstan, after being rerouted due to heavy fog. The flight, en route from **Baku** to **Grozny**, had 62 passengers and 5 crew members onboard. Several passengers were injured in the emergency landing, with a passenger capturing footage of the incident. The crash underscores the risks of rerouting and the unpredictability of air travel emergencies. (Click here to read article)
- China has approved the construction of the world's largest dam on the Yarlung Zangbo (Brahmaputra) River in Tibet, raising strategic and environmental concerns for India and Bangladesh. Estimated at \$137 billion, the dam could give China control over water flow, potentially flooding Indian border areas during conflicts. In response, India is building its own dam in Arunachal Pradesh. Both countries have a data-sharing framework through the Expert Level Mechanism (ELM), which was reaffirmed during talks between India's NSA and China's Foreign Minister. (Click here to read article)
- On Christmas Eve 2024, President Joe Biden signed a historic law officially recognizing the bald eagle as the national bird of the United States. While the eagle has symbolized the country since 1782, it was never formally designated until this legislation, led by Minnesota lawmakers. The move honors the eagle's representation of strength, courage, and freedom, as well as its remarkable recovery from near extinction. (Click here to read article)
- The Ocean Anoxic Event 1a (OAE 1a), occurring 120 million years ago, was triggered by massive volcanic eruptions releasing CO₂, causing global warming and oceanic anoxia. This event disrupted marine ecosystems, leading to plankton extinction and the formation of black shale deposits. Volcanic activity, particularly from the Ontong Java Nui complex, caused oceanic oxygen depletion, creating anoxic marine basins like the Black Sea. OAE 1a offers insights into modern climate change and its potential impacts on marine life. (Click here to read article)



A federal-level emergency was declared in Russia following a catastrophic oil spill on December 15, caused by damage to two Russian-flagged oil tankers near the Kerch Strait. The spill released thousands of tons of mazut into the Black Sea, affecting 55 kilometers of coastline. Despite local cleanup efforts, the crisis escalated, prompting federal intervention as the regional authorities lacked sufficient resources to handle the disaster. The spill has severely impacted marine ecosystems, local communities, and the coastal economy. (Click here to read article)

Agreements/MoUs Signed

ISRO and the European Space Agency (ESA) have signed a landmark agreement to boost collaboration in human space exploration. - The Indian government will inject ₹500 crore into Industrial Finance Corporation of India (IFCI) to improve its financial health ahead of restructuring. This infusion is expected to raise the government's stake in IFCI, currently at 71.72% (as of September 2024). 
