

S47. Ans.(c)

Sol. As the last part of the given passage is talking about the rise in the crude oil prices, which will lead to the increase in the price of the fuel, so the correct filler for the given blank will be 'Gains'. Hence, the correct answer choice is option (c)

S48. Ans.(b)

\$51. Ans.(a)

Sol. To get the correct filler refer the first line of the second paragraph in which it is mentioned that 'The NRC exercise has left almost everyone dismayed'. Here, 'dismayed' means cause (someone) to feel concern and distress. From this we can infer that the appropriate filler for the given blank would be 'Flawed'. Remaining options fails to make the given sentence either grammatically or contextually correct. Hence, the correct answer choice would be option (a) **Delegated** means entrust (a task or responsibility) to another person





S52. Ans.(b)

Sol. Taking hint from the use of 'while' which is used when comparing things, situations, or people and showing how they are different. So, the appropriate filler for the given blank would be 'Included'. Hence, the correct answer choice would be option (b)

S53. Ans.(c)

Sol. To get the correct answer refer to the last line of the same sentence which is talking about the country's poor documentation culture. From this and the given options, we can infer that the appropriate filler would be 'inevitable' which makes the sentence both grammatically and contextually correct. Also, remaining options fails to do so. Hence, the correct answer choice would be option (c)

S54. Ans.(d)

Sol. Unprecedented refers to something that has never been done or known before. Among the given options, only this option fits the blank most appropriately.

S55. Ans.(a)

Sol. This blank needs a word that resembles 'rough guess' because the sentence is trying to convey 'according to analyst's evaluation or 'estimates'.

S56. Ans.(c)

Sol. Streak refers to something that happens or is done over a period of time without a break which is exactly what the sentence is trying to convey: that the latest quarter broke the trend that continued in the last four quarters.

S57. Ans.(b)

Sol. While all the three options are synonyms of the word 'participate', only option (b) i.e. *participated* is in the past tense which is what the blank needs because the protest happened on a previous date.

S58. Ans.(a)

Sol. While affect means 'to make a difference to' or 'influence something, effect means 'a change which is a result or consequence of an action or other cause'. Affect means to have an effect on making it the most appropriate answer. The other two options are in the past tense and the sentence is in simple present.

\$59. Ans.(c)

Sol. 'Taken a hit to' means 'hurt'. What the sentence is trying to say is: 'an increase in operating expenses has hurt revenue/profits/earnings.' Both disbursement and outlay are synonyms for expenditure and hence not appropriate.

S60. Ans.(e)

Sol. Brick and mortar is a phrase used to describe existing as a physical building, especially a shop, rather than doing business only on the internet. The sentence is trying to convey that Amazon is trying to match the speed that conventional shopkeepers have because online delivery takes more time. None of the options can hence be appropriately used.







S61. Ans.(b)

Sol. The presence of 'in' makes 'time' and 'times', inappropriate choices. Era can only be used to define a significant period of time and since the following line compares it to another 'quarter', it is the best and most appropriate answer choice.

S62. Ans.(d)

Sol. Stem means 'originate in or be caused by' which is also what the sentence is trying to convey that the profit problem seems to originate from the fact that growth 'is no longer creating the operating leverage it once did'. Rise could also have been a good fit but not raise.

S63. Ans.(b)

Sol. Remains to be seen is used to express the notion that something is not yet known making option (b) our best choice. Had there been an 'is' preceding the blank, "left" could also have been a good option.

S64. Ans.(b)

Sol. Fiasco is described as a disastrous situation or a complete failure and because the sentence is talking about a particular incident and that too a total 'wipe-out', none of the other options describe it as well as fiasco.

S65. Ans.(e)

Sol. The sentence is trying to convey that even while managing fast-paced growth, the country was able to ensure that it does not compromise its natural heritage. Hence we need a word like 'amid' (which means 'in an atmosphere or against a background of') to fill the blank.

S66. Ans.(c)

Sol. Had number and sighting been in their plural form, they could have been grammatically suitable options and because the passage is talking about tiger population and not the number of tiger reserves, option (c) is also not as suitable. Between abundance which is a noun and abundant which is an adjective, former is meaningful and grammatically correct.

S69. Ans.(b)

Sol. Since the blank is followed by the word 'grounds' neither (a) method nor (b) methods are suitable options. Between methodology which is a noun and methodological which is an adjective, the latter is both grammatically and meaningfully correct.





\$70. Ans.(a)

Sol. Peer Review refers to evaluation of scientific, academic or professional work by others working in the same field. The passage talks about gaps in the assessment and hence it is important to have the data 'thoroughly' reviewed by people in the same field. Hence, option (a) rigorous is the most suitable option.

S71. Ans.(b)

Sol. The previous line refers to putting the data through a rigorous evaluation. This line carries forward this meaning and asks the study to be put under critical observation or examination. Out of all the words, only scrutiny provides this meaning and also makes the sentence grammatically correct.

S72. Ans.(e)

Sol. The line continues to refer to the vast expanse of the study. To describe this scale of study, only staggering (which means astonishing) can be used. All futile, pointless, nugatory and unproductive mean the same as useless and hence neither can be our answer.

S73. Ans.(c)

Sol. From a grammatical standpoint, all options are suitable options. But because the sentence talks about wild animals and the efforts to revive them, only charismatic will suitably fill the blank to provide contextual accuracy.

S74. Ans.(c)

Sol. 'Spell' is a short period of time during which something lasts. Trending means something that is currently popular or widely discussed online. It's an adjective and has no plural form. 'Happenings' is not an appropriate word to describe weather patterns. Shortcoming is fault or failure to meet a certain standard. Hence spells is the most appropriate option.

S75. Ans.(d)

Sol. While all the words are near synonyms of each other only 'forecasts' does complete justice to the sentence. Portend refers to a sign or warning that (something, especially something momentous or calamitous) is likely to happen. This word especially in its continuous form does not provide complete meaning to the sentence. Prophecy does mean 'to say that (a specified thing) will happen in the future' but for this word to be used 'Met Office's' should've been given. Speculate means 'to form a theory or conjecture about a subject without firm evidence'. Hence, forecasts is the answer which provides both contextual meaning and grammatical justice to the sentence.

\$76. Ans.(e)

Sol. Grapple, wrestle, spar and fight all mean the same but none provides any meaning to the sentence. In order to convey their dwindling population in the past 'struggling' is the best choice.

\$77. Ans.(b)

Sol. Both comparison and relation need to be preceded by 'in' in order to be grammatically suitable options. When we say something has changed with respect to the past, we either use 'compared' or 'in relation with'. Related doesn't help put the two time periods in contrast with each other which the sentence is trying to do. Compared provides both grammatical and contextual meaning to the sentence.





\$78. Ans.(e)

Sol. All tinge, hue, shade and tint mean the same i.e. a trace of a colour, in this case blue colour and are all correct both with respect to meaning and grammatical correctness.

S79. Ans.(c)

Sol. The passage talks about how the Arctic region was recently grappling with a heatwave that had taken over the entire region. It then goes on to talk about what needs to be done to make things better. It enlists a fairly simple idea of trying to bring down the level of greenhouse emissions.

The second paragraph then talks how the countries had all signed a pact to make efforts to limit global warming and how that translates to maintaining zero emissions by every sector in every country of the world. The final passage talks whether such a goal would be attainable in all areas or not. The first blank is immediately followed by 'European heatwave' which tells us that the blank must be an adjective and definitely not a positive one like balmy or peasant. Hurtful means causing distress to someone's feelings. Between harm and scorching, the latter better describes a heatwave.

S80. Ans.(b)

Sol. 'Crisis' is singular and 'crises' is its plural form. Hence crisis needs to be followed by verbs ending with 's' making increase, manifold and manifest wrong answers. Manifold is an adjective meaning 'many and various'. Mount on the other hand is a verb meaning to gradually increase, rise, or get bigger, making 'mounts' the correct answer.

S81. Ans.(a)

Sol. Evasive is an adjective for dodging a question by answering in an indirect manner. Devious again is an adjective defined as 'showing a skilful use of underhand tactics to achieve goals'. Deceitful means 'guilty of or involving deceit; deceiving or misleading others'. But the word we are looking for has to be the same in meaning as 'simple' and hence, straightforward (which means uncomplicated) is our best choice

S82. Ans.(e)

Sol. All salubrious, salutary, productive and remedial mean 'producing a beneficial effect'. The sentence is talking about bringing down greenhouse gas levels, the lower will be the stabilised temperature and lesser the devastating or disastrous consequences we'll have to face.

\$83. Ans.(d)

Sol. Both seek and strive are verbs and since pursue itself is a verb, they aren't the correct answers. Since the sentence talks about multiple goals that need to be achieved, both endeavour and attempt are also not correct options. 'To pursue efforts' means to seek or strive to attain (some object, goal etc.) making 'efforts' the correct option.

S84. Ans.(d)

Sol. Emissions mean the production and discharge of something, especially gas or radiation. Outrush refers simply to a violent outflow. Leak doesn't make grammatical sense while an overflow doesn't make contextual sense.

S85. Ans.(a)

Sol. The sentence talks about halving the emissions for which every sector in every country needs to be producing about zero emissions. Because of the presence of 'on', none of the words approximation, standard, estimate or rate is a suitable option for the blank. Only 'average' provides both grammatical accuracy and meaning to the sentence.





S86. Ans.(c)

Sol. The blank is preceded by the article 'an' and hence, only a word beginning with a vowel can fill the blank which is only option (c).

S87. Ans.(b)

Sol. This sentence talks about reaching a particular target which is not something which can be managed or unmanaged, tolerated or not etc. Reaching a target can be easy or difficult or possible or impossible and in this case it is the latter.

S88. Ans.(c)

Sol. In the last sentence it is given: *long-haul on an electric plane any time soon*. Long-haul means for longer time or distance and even if you ignore the phrase you realize that the sentence is trying to convey that there doesn't seem to be any recent chances of flying or going airborne on an electric airplane anytime soon. But because the blank is not preceded by the words 'being' or 'going', neither airborne nor windborne are suitable options. Flying is both grammatically fitting and also provides the required meaning.

S89. Ans.(c)

Sol. This passage talks about how the climate crisis is reducing the available land's ability to sustain humanity. It cites a recent report by the UN, according to which because of climate change, there is an increase in soil erosion and droughts and a simultaneous drop in crop yield. It also states how increasing temperature in future will further lead to hunger, migration and conflict. It then goes on to suggest that bringing down meat consumption and food waste was the need of the hour and also that the practice of burning fossil fuels needed to stop. Cascading can often be used to mean successive. Even if the meaning of this word is not known, method of elimination can be used to see that none of the other options make any sense in the first blank and (c) can easily be marked as an answer.

S90. Ans.(e)

Sol. Had the first two options been in their past participle forms i.e. written and made respectively, they could have been good alternatives. Comprised means 'consists of' and hence is obviously not the right answer. Compile is a verb that means assembling information collected from other sources in this case which means collected from top scientists.

S91. Ans.(a)

Sol. This line talks about how global heating is having two simultaneous effects, one of increasing soil erosion, droughts and wildfires and the other of decreasing crop yield. The presence of the word 'while' tells us that the word in this blank will be the opposite of 'increasing' as mentioned in the first part of the sentence. It also tells us that the word will also be in its continuous form. Only diminishing is the word which fulfils both the criteria. Burgeoning means beginning to grow or increase rapidly.

S92. Ans.(b)

Sol. Evitable means avoidable and unprecedented refers to something that's never been done or known before. Evitable cannot be used because it doesn't provide contextual meaning to the sentence or the paragraph and neither does 'increasing' or 'decreasing'. Unprecedented can be used because then the sentence would mean that further heating will cause climate conditions that no one has ever seen before.





S93. Ans.(b)

Sol. When we look at the words 'stark (which means extreme) choice' we understand that the two choices are on the extreme ends of the spectrum. Virtuous itself means beneficial and hence the other blank can also not be beneficial itself. Even irreproachable means 'flawless'. Homicidal means murderous and hence can't be our answer. The blank also needs to be an adjective which is why even grimly isn't the correct answer. Vicious is the correct answer by process of elimination. The terms virtuous circle and vicious circle are used very often refer to complex chains of events that reinforce themselves through a feedback loop. A virtuous circle has favourable results, while a vicious circle has detrimental results.

S94. Ans.(d)

Sol. The following lines elaborate on the previously mentioned phrase of 'vicious and virtuous cycle'. The immediate next line talks about the vicious cycle and the line with the blank tells us that if we made efforts in time, we can help save the planet. Hence the word in the blank would be a positive one and not 'degenerate' or even 'degrade' or 'corrupt'. The word needs to be in simple present because the action hasn't happened yet. Regenerate is hence, the correct and only answer.

S95. Ans.(c)

Sol. The sentence is suggesting helpful tips that people should adopt in order to tackle climate change. Focus should be on the word 'tackle', hence we know that the blank after climate should not be a positive word like consistencies, possibilities or congruity. Crisis is an appropriate option.

S96. Ans.(c)

Sol. All hinder, obstruct and impede are verbs that mean the same i.e. make it difficult for (someone) to do something or for (something) to happen. Tackle on the other hand means to make determined efforts to deal with (a problem or difficult task) and hence, in this case it is the most appropriate option. Since we are dealing with huge losses (plural), the verb should be sans 's' which is why 'fights' is also incorrect.

\$97. Ans.(a)

Sol. Perfect storm is actually a phrase which means an especially bad situation caused by a combination of unfavourable circumstances. The next line talks about really bad unfavourable situations which give a hint that it has to be something negative which is difficult to deduce because of the word 'perfect'. But perfect storm sums it up pretty accurately.

S98. Ans.(b)

Sol. The blank is preceded by the article 'a' and not 'an' hence, the answer cannot be engulfing or enveloping. In fact because of the word 'wrapped', even surrounding and swaddling (this also means wrap) would be incorrect answers because the sentence would then look like 'wrapped in a wrapping blanket' which is not right. Suffocating is the best option because not only does it best describe the metaphorical blanket but also makes the whole situation look like a climate emergency.

S99. Ans.(c)

Sol. From the given options, only option (c) fits the given blank to make a contextually meaningful sentence remaining options fails to do so. Hence, the correct answer choice is option (c)





S100. Ans.(b)
