Solutions English

S1. (a): The error in the sentence is in part (A), specifically with the phrase "running in of battery power." The correct expression should be "running out of battery power" to correctly convey the idea of depleting the battery's energy. Therefore, the corrected part A should read "the fear of running out of battery power before reaching."

Hence, the correct sentence should be: "Range anxiety, the fear of running **out** of battery power before reaching the destination, is a common concern among trucking companies."

S2. (d): The error in the sentence is in part (D), where "transported global" is used. The correct phrase should include an adverb to describe the manner in which goods are transported, thus it should be "transported globally." Therefore, the corrected part D should read "shaping the way goods are transported globally."

Hence, the correct sentence should be: "The future of electric trucks holds promise, with a combination of technological advancements and environmental benefits shaping the way goods are transported **globally**."

- **S3. (d):** The most appropriate word to fill in the given blank will be "**benevolent**." The sentence is expressing that the woman was known for her nature of being kind and generous. "Benevolent" is the word that best conveys this meaning, as it refers to someone who is inclined to do good or show kindness.
 - The other options are incorrect:
 - (a) vicious: deliberately cruel or violent.
 - (b) malevolent: having or showing a wish to do evil to others.
 - (c) savage: fierce, violent, and uncontrolled.
 - (e) inclement: unpleasantly cold or wet weather.
- **S4. (b):** The most appropriate word to fill in the given blank will be "**profound**." The sentence is expressing that the psychologist's insights into human behaviour were deep and meaningful, indicating a thorough understanding of the subject matter. "Profound" is the word that best conveys this meaning, as it suggests a deep understanding or knowledge. The other options are incorrect:
 - (a) Shallow lacking depth of intellect, emotion, or knowledge; superficial
 - (c) Specious superficially plausible, but actually false or misleading

(d) **Cosmetic** - relating to the treatment of appearance, typically superficially rather than medically necessary

- (e) Peripheral relating to or situated on the edge or periphery of something
- **S5. (b):** The most appropriate word to fill in the given blank will be "**ingenuity**." The sentence is expressing that the entrepreneur's qualities of creativity and resourcefulness helped him build a successful business. "Ingenuity" is the word that best conveys this meaning, as it refers to the ability to come up with clever or inventive solutions to problems. The other options are incorrect:
 - (a) Ignorance refers to the lack of knowledge or awareness about something.
 - (c) Craziness refers to the state of being mentally unstable or insane.
 - (d) Inanity refers to the state of being foolish, senseless, or lacking in good judgment.
 - (e) Absurdity refers to something that is illogical, nonsensical, or ridiculous.













S2. (e): I follow as per Venn diagram II follow because of possibility case.
