National News

UNION BUDGET 2025-26

Union Minister for Finance and Corporate Affairs Smt Nirmala Sitharaman presented Union Budget 2025-26 in the Parliament today. The highlights of the budget are as follows:

Budget Estimates 2025-26

- The total receipts other than borrowings and the total expenditure are estimated at ₹ 34.96 lakh crore and ₹ 50.65 lakh crore respectively.
- The net tax receipts are estimated at ₹ 28.37 lakh crore.
- The fiscal deficit is estimated to be 4.4 per cent of GDP.
- The gross market borrowings are estimated at ₹ 14.82 lakh crore.
- Capex Expenditure of ₹11.21 lakh crore (3.1% of GDP) earmarked in FY2025-26.

Agriculture as the 1st Engine of Development

- Prime Minister Dhan-Dhaanya Krishi Yojana Developing Agri Districts Programme: The programme to be launched in
 partnership with the states, covering 100 districts with low productivity, moderate crop intensity and below-average credit
 parameters, to benefit 1.7 crore farmers.
- Building Rural Prosperity and Resilience: A comprehensive multi-sectoral programme to be launched in partnership with states
 to address under-employment in agriculture through skilling, investment, technology, and invigorating the rural economy. Phase1 to cover 100 developing agri-districts.
- Aatmanirbharta in Pulses: Government to launch a 6-year "Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses" with focus on Tur, Urad and Masoor. NAFED and NCCF to procure these pulses from farmers during the next 4 years.
- **Comprehensive Programme for Vegetables & Fruits:** A comprehensive programme to promote production, efficient supplies, processing, and remunerative prices for farmers to be launched in partnership with states.
- Makhana Board in Bihar: A Makhana Board to be established to improve production, processing, value addition, and marketing
 of makhana.
- National Mission on High-Yielding Seeds: A National Mission on High Yielding Seeds to be launched aiming at strengthening the
 research ecosystem, targeted development and propagation of seeds with high yield, and commercial availability of more than
 100 seed varieties.
- **Fisheries:** Government to bring a framework for sustainable harnessing of fisheries from Indian Exclusive Economic Zone and High Seas, with a special focus on the Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep Islands.
- **Mission for Cotton Productivity:** A 5-year mission announced to facilitate significant improvements in productivity and sustainability of cotton farming, and promote extra-long staple cotton varieties.
- Enhanced Credit through KCC: The loan limit under the Modified Interest Subvention Scheme to be enhanced from ₹ 3 lakh to ₹ 5 lakh for loans taken through the KCC.
- Urea Plant in Assam: A plant with annual capacity of 12.7 lakh metric tons to be set up at Namrup, Assam.

MSME's as the 2nd Engine of Development

- **Revision in classification criteria for MSMEs:** The investment and turnover limits for classification of all MSMEs to be enhanced to 2.5 and 2 times respectively.
- Credit Cards for Micro Enterprises: Customized Credit Cards with ₹ 5 lakh limit for micro enterprises registered on Udyam portal, 10 lakh cards to be issued in the first year.
- Fund of Funds for Startups: A new Fund of Funds, with expanded scope and a fresh contribution of ₹ 10,000 crore to be set up.
- Scheme for First-time Entrepreneurs: A new scheme for 5 lakh women, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes first-time entrepreneurs to provide term-loans upto ₹ 2 crore in the next 5 years announced.
- Focus Product Scheme for Footwear & Leather Sectors: To enhance the productivity, quality and competitiveness of India's
 footwear and leather sector, a focus product scheme announced to facilitate employment for 22 lakh persons, generate turnover
 of ₹ 4 lakh crore and exports of over ₹ 1.1 lakh crore.
- Measures for the Toy Sector: A scheme to create high-quality, unique, innovative, and sustainable toys, making India a global hub for toys announced.
- Support for Food Processing: A National Institute of Food Technology, Entrepreneurship and Management to be set up in Bihar.
- Manufacturing Mission Furthering "Make in India": A National Manufacturing Mission covering small, medium and large
 industries for furthering "Make in India" announced.



Investment as the 3rd Engine of Development Investing in People

- Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0: The cost norms for the nutritional support to be enhanced appropriately.
- Atal Tinkering Labs: 50,000 Atal Tinkering Labs to be set up in Government schools in next 5 years.
- **Broadband Connectivity to Government Secondary Schools and PHCs:** Broadband connectivity to be provided to all Government secondary schools and primary health centres in rural areas under the Bharatnet project.
- **Bharatiya Bhasha Pustak Scheme:** Bharatiya Bhasha Pustak Scheme announced to provide digital-form Indian language books for school and higher education.
- **National Centres of Excellence for Skilling:** 5 National Centres of Excellence for skilling to be set up with global expertise and partnerships to equip our youth with the skills required for "Make for India, Make for the World" manufacturing.
- Expansion of Capacity in IITs: Additional infrastructure to be created in the 5 IITs started after 2014 to facilitate education for 6,500 more students.
- Centre of Excellence in AI for Education: A Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence for education to be set up with a total outlay of ₹ 500 crore.
- **Expansion of medical education:** 10,000 additional seats to be added in medical colleges and hospitals next year, adding to 75000 seats in the next 5 years.
- Day Care Cancer Centres in all District Hospitals: Government to set up Day Care Cancer Centres in all district hospitals in the next 3 years, 200 Centres in 2025-26.
- **Strengthening urban livelihoods:** A scheme for socio-economic upliftment of urban workers to help them improve their incomes and have sustainable livelihoods announced.
- **PM SVANidhi:** Scheme to be revamped with enhanced loans from banks, UPI linked credit cards with ₹ 30,000 limit, and capacity building support.
- **Social Security Scheme for Welfare of Online Platform Workers:** Government to arrange for identity cards, registration on e-Shram portal and healthcare under PM Jan Arogya Yojna, for gig-workers.

Investing in the Economy

- Public Private Partnership in Infrastructure: Infrastructure-related ministries to come up with a 3-year pipeline of projects in PPP mode, States also encouraged.
- Support to States for Infrastructure: An outlay of ₹1.5 lakh crore proposed for the 50-year interest free loans to states for capital expenditure and incentives for reforms.
- Asset Monetization Plan 2025-30: Second Plan for 2025-30 to plough back capital of ₹ 10 lakh crore in new projects announced.
- Jal Jeevan Mission: Mission to be extended until 2028 with an enhanced total outlay.
- **Urban Challenge Fund:** An Urban Challenge Fund of ₹ 1 lakh crore announced to implement the proposals for 'Cities as Growth Hubs', 'Creative Redevelopment of Cities' and 'Water and Sanitation', allocation of ₹ 10,000 crore proposed for 2025-26.
- Nuclear Energy Mission for Viksit Bharat: Amendments to the Atomic Energy Act and the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act to be taken up. Nuclear Energy Mission for research & development of Small Modular Reactors (SMR) with an outlay of ₹20,000 crore to be set up, 5 indigenously developed SMRs to be operational by 2033.
- **Shipbuilding:** The Shipbuilding Financial Assistance Policy to be revamped. Large ships above a specified size to be included in the infrastructure harmonized master list (HML).
- Maritime Development Fund: A Maritime Development Fund with a corpus of ₹ 25,000 crore to be set up, with up to 49 per cent contribution by the Government, and the balance from ports and private sector.
- UDAN Regional Connectivity Scheme: A modified UDAN scheme announced to enhance regional connectivity to 120 new
 destinations and carry 4 crore passengers in the next 10 years. Also to support helipads and smaller airports in hilly, aspirational,
 and North East region districts.
- **Greenfield Airport in Bihar:** Greenfield airports announced in Bihar, in addition to the expansion of the capacity of Patna airport and a brownfield airport at Bihta.
- Western Koshi Canal Project in Mithilanchal: Financial support for the Western Koshi Canal ERM Project in Bihar.
- Mining Sector Reforms: A policy for recovery of critical minerals from tailings to be brought out.
- **SWAMIH Fund 2:** A fund of ₹ 15,000 crore aimed at expeditious completion of another 1 lakh dwelling units, with contribution from the Government, banks and private investors announced.
- **Tourism for employment-led growth:** Top 50 tourist destination sites in the country to be developed in partnership with states through a challenge mode.



Investing in Innovation

- Research, Development and Innovation: ₹20,000 crore to be allocated to implement private sector driven Research, Development and Innovation initiative announced in the July Budget.
- Deep Tech Fund of Funds: Deep Tech Fund of Funds to be explored to catalyze the next generation startups.
- PM Research Fellowship: 10,000 fellowships for technological research in IITs and IISc with enhanced financial support.
- Gene Bank for Crops Germplasm: 2nd Gene Bank with 10 lakh germplasm lines to be set up for future food and nutritional security.
- National Geospatial Mission: A National Geospatial Mission announced to develop foundational geospatial infrastructure and data.
- Gyan Bharatam Mission: A Gyan Bharatam Mission for survey, documentation and conservation of our manuscript heritage with academic institutions, museums, libraries and private collectors to be undertaken to cover more than 1 crore manuscripts announced.

Exports as the 4th Engine of Development

- Export Promotion Mission: An Export Promotion Mission, with sectoral and ministerial targets, driven jointly by the Ministries of Commerce, MSME, and Finance to be set up.
- BharatTradeNet: 'BharatTradeNet' (BTN) for international trade to be set-up as a unified platform for trade documentation and financing solutions.
- National Framework for GCC: A national framework to be formulated as guidance to states for promoting Global Capability Centres in emerging tier 2 cities.

Reforms as Fuel: Financial sector reforms and Development

- FDI in Insurance Sector: The FDI limit for the insurance sector to be raised from 74 to 100 per cent, for those companies which invest the entire premium in India.
- Credit Enhancement Facility by NaBFID: NaBFID to set up a 'Partial Credit Enhancement Facility' for corporate bonds for infrastructure.
- Grameen Credit Score: Public Sector Banks to develop 'Grameen Credit Score' framework to serve the credit needs of SHG members and people in rural areas.
- **Pension Sector:** A forum for regulatory coordination and development of pension products to be set up.
- High Level Committee for Regulatory Reforms: A High-Level Committee for Regulatory Reforms to be set up for a review of all non-financial sector regulations, certifications, licenses, and permissions.
- Investment Friendliness Index of States: An Investment Friendliness Index of States to be launched in 2025 to further the spirit of competitive cooperative federalism anounced.
- Jan Vishwas Bill 2.0: The Jan Vishwas Bill 2.0 to decriminalize more than 100 provisions in various laws.

PART B

Direct Tax

- No personal income tax payable upto income of Rs 12 lakh (i.e. average income of Rs 1 lakh per month other than special rate income such as capital gains) under the new regime.
- This limit will be Rs 12.75 lakh for salaried tax payers, due to standard deduction of Rs 75,000.
- The new structure will substantially reduce the taxes of the middle class and leave more money in their hands, boosting household consumption, savings and investment.
- The new Income-Tax Bill to be clear and direct in text so as to make it simple to understand for taxpayers and tax administration, leading to tax certainty and reduced litigation.
- Revenue of about ₹ 1 lakh crore in direct taxes will be forgone.

Revised tax rate structure

In the new tax regime, the revised tax rate structure will stand as follows:

Income Range	Tax Rate
0 – 4 lakh rupees	Nil
4 – 8 lakh rupees	5%
8 – 12 lakh rupees	10%
12 – 16 lakh rupees	15%
16 – 20 lakh rupees	20%
20 – 24 lakh rupees	25%
Above 24 lakh rupees	30%



TDS/TCS rationalization for easing difficulties

- Rationalization of Tax Deduction at Source (TDS) by reducing number of rates and thresholds above which TDS is deducted.
- The limit for tax deduction on interest for senior citizens doubled from the present Rs 50,000 to Rs 1 lakh.
- The annual limit of Rs 2.40 lakh for TDS on rent increased to Rs 6 lakh.
- The threshold to collect tax at source (TCS) on remittances under RBI's Liberalized Remittance Scheme (LRS) increased from Rs 7 lakh to Rs 10 lakh.
- The provisions of the higher TDS deduction will apply only in non-PAN cases.
- Decriminalization for the cases of delay of payment of TCS up to the due date of filing statement.

Reducing Compliance Burden

- Reduction of compliance burden for small charitable trusts/institutions by increasing their period of registration from 5 years to 10 years.
- The benefit of claiming the annual value of self-occupied properties as nil will be extended for two such self-occupied properties without any condition.

Ease of Doing Business

- Introduction of a scheme for determining arm's length price of international transaction for a block period of three years.
- Expansion of the scope of safe harbour rules to reduce litigation and provide certainty in international taxation.
- Exemption of withdrawals made from National Savings Scheme (NSS) by individuals on or after the 29th of August, 2024.
- Similar treatment to NPS Vatsalya accounts as is available to normal NPS accounts, subject to overall limits.

Employment and Investment

Tax certainty for electronics manufacturing Schemes

- Presumptive taxation regime for non-residents who provide services to a resident company that is establishing or operating an electronics manufacturing facility.
- Introduction of a safe harbour for tax certainty for non-residents who store components for supply to specified electronics manufacturing units.

Tonnage Tax Scheme for Inland Vessels

The benefits of existing tonnage tax scheme to be extended to inland vessels registered under the Indian Vessels Act, 2021 to promote inland water transport in the country.

Extension for incorporation of Start-Ups

Extension of the period of incorporation by 5 years to allow the benefit available to start-ups incorporated before 1.4.2030.

Alternate Investment Funds (AIFs)

Certainty of taxation on the gains from securities to Category I and Category II AIFs which are undertaking investments in infrastructure and other such sectors.

Extension of investment date for Sovereign and Pension Funds

Extension of the date of making investments in Sovereign Wealth Funds and Pension Funds by five more years, to 31st March, 2030, to promote funding from them to the infrastructure sector.

Indirect Tax

Rationalisation of Customs Tariff Structure for Industrial Goods

Union Budget 2025-26 proposes to:

- Remove seven tariff rates. This is over and above the seven tariff rates removed in 2023-24 budget. After this, there will be only eight remaining tariff rates including 'zero' rate.
- Apply appropriate cess to broadly maintain effective duty incidence except on a few items, where such incidence will reduce marginally.
- Levy not more than one cess or surcharge. Therefore Social Welfare Surcharge on 82 tariff lines that are subject to a cess, exempted.

Revenue of about ₹ 2600 crore in indirect taxes will be forgone.

Relief on import of Drugs/Medicines

- 36 lifesaving drugs and medicines fully exempted from Basic Customs Duty (BCD).
- 6 lifesaving medicines to attract concessional customs duty of 5%.
- Specified drugs and medicines under Patient Assistance Programmes run by pharmaceutical companies fully exempted from BCD; 37 more medicines added along with 13 new patient assistance programmes.



Support to Domestic Manufacturing and Value addition

- Critical Minerals: Cobalt powder and waste, the scrap of lithium-ion battery, Lead, Zinc and 12 more critical minerals fully exempted from BCD.
- Textiles: Two more types of shuttle-less looms fully exempted textile machinery; BCD rate on knitted fabrics revised from "10% or 20%" to "20% or `115 per kg, whichever is higher.
- **Electronic Goods:**
 - 1. BCD on Interactive Flat Panel Display (IFPD) increased from 10% to 20%.
 - 2. BCD reduced to 5% on Open Cell and other components.
 - 3. BCD on parts of Open Cells exempted.
- Lithium Ion Battery: 35 additional capital goods for EV battery manufacturing, and 28 additional capital goods for mobile phone battery manufacturing exempted.
- Shipping Sector: Exemption of BCD on raw materials, components, consumables or parts for the manufacture of ships extended for another ten years. The same dispensation to continue for ship breaking.
- Telecommunication: BCD reduced from 20% to 10% on Carrier Grade ethernet switches.

Export Promotion

- Handicraft Goods: Time period for export extended from six months to one year, further extendable by another three months, if required. Nine items added to list of duty-free inputs.
- Leather sector: BCD on Wet Blue leather fully exempted. Crust leather exempted from 20% export duty.
- Marine products:
 - BCD reduced from 30% to 5% on Frozen Fish Paste (Surimi) for manufacture and export of its analogue products.
 - 2. BCD reduced from 15% to 5% on fish hydrolysate for manufacture of fish and shrimp feeds.
- **Domestic MROs for Railway Goods:**
 - Railways MROs to benefit similar to the aircraft and ships MROs in terms of import of repair items.
 - 2. Time limit extended for export of such items from 6 months to one year and made further extendable by one year.

Trade facilitation

- Time limit for Provisional Assessment: For finalising the provisional assessment, time-limit of two years fixed, extendable by a
- Voluntary Compliance: A new provision introduced to enable importers or exporters, after clearance of goods, to voluntarily declare material facts and pay duty with interest but without penalty.
- **Extended Time for End Use:**
 - 1. Time limit for the end-use of imported inputs in the relevant rules extended from six months to one year.
 - 2. Such importers to file only quarterly statements instead of a monthly statement.

Economic Survey 2025: Key Highlights, Summary, and Important Points

Chapter 1: State of the Economy: Getting Back into the Fast Lane

- India's real GDP growth is estimated at 6.4 per cent in FY25 (as per first advance estimates of national income), which equates nearly to its decadal average.
- Real gross value added (GVA) is also estimated to grow by 6.4 per cent FY25.
- The global economy on an average grew by 3.3 per cent in 2023 against the IMF projection of 3.2 per cent growth in the next five
- The real GDP growth in FY26 is expected to grow between 6.3 and 6.8 per cent, keeping in mind the upsides and downsides to growth.
- Thrust on grassroots-level structural reforms and deregulation to reinforce the medium-term growth potential and boost global competitiveness of Indian economy.
- Geopolitical tensions, ongoing conflicts and global trade policy risks continue to pose significant challenges to the global economic outlook.
- Retail headline inflation has softened from 5.4 per cent in FY24 to 4.9 per cent in April December 2024.
- Capital expenditure (CAPEX) improved continuously from FY21 to FY24. Post general elections, CAPEX grew YOY by 8.2 per cent during July -November 2024.
- India accounts for seventh-largest share in global services exports, underscoring India's global competitiveness in the sector.
- During April to December 2024, non-Petroleum and non-Gems & Jewellery exports went up by 9.1 per cent reflecting resilience of India's merchandise exports amid volatile global conditions.

Chapter 2: Monetary and Financial Sector Developments: The Card and the Horse

- Bank credit has grown at a steady rate with credit growth converging towards deposit growth.
- Profitability of Scheduled Commercial Banks improved, reflected in a fall in gross non-performing assets (GNPAs) and rise in capital to risk weighted asset ratio (CRAR).
- Credit growth outpaced nominal GDP growth for two successive years. The credit-GDP gap narrowed to (-) 0.3 per cent in Q1 of FY25 from (-) 10.3 per cent in Q1 of FY23, indicating sustainable bank credit growth.
- Banking sector exhibits improvement in asset quality, robust capital buffers, and strong operational performance.
- The gross non-performing assets (GNPAs) of Scheduled Commercial Banks declined to a 12-year low of 2.6 per cent of gross loans and advances at the end of September 2024.
- Under Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, ₹3.6 lakh crore realized in resolution of 1,068 plans till September 2024. It amounts to 161 per cent against the liquidation value and 86.1 per cent of the fair value of the assets involved.
- Indian stock markets outperformed its emerging market peers despite election-driven market volatility challenges.
- The total resource mobilisation from primary markets (equity and debt) stands at ₹11.1 lakh crore from April to December 2024, five per cent more than the amount mobilised during FY24.
- BSE stock market capitalisation to GDP ratio stood at 136 per cent at the end of December 2024, far higher than other Emerging Market Economies like China (65 per cent) and Brazil (37 per cent).
- India's insurance market continued its upward trajectory, with total insurance premiums growing by 7.7 per cent in FY24, reaching
- India's pension sector experienced significant growth, with the total number of pension subscribers growing by 16 per cent (YoY) as of September 2024.

Chapter 3: External Sector: Getting FDI Right

- India's external sector continues to display resilience amidst global uncertainties and headwinds.
- Overall exports (merchandise + services) grew by 6 per cent (YOY) in the first nine months of FY25. Services sector by 11.6 per cent during the same time.
- India commands 10.2 per cent of the global export market in 'Telecommunications, Computer, & Information Services', ranking 2nd largest exporter in the world, as per UNCTAD.



- India's current account deficit (CAD) stood at 1.2 per cent of GDP in Q2 of FY25, supported by rising net services receipts and an increase in private transfer receipts.
- Gross Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) inflows recorded a revival in FY25, increasing from USD 47.2 billion in the first eight months of FY24 to USD 55.6 billion in the same period of FY25, a YoY growth of 17.9 per cent.
- India's FOREX reserves stood at USD 640.3 billion as of the end of December 2024, sufficient to cover 10.9 months of imports and approximately 90 per cent of the country's external debt.
- India's external debt remained stable over the past few years, with the external debt to GDP ratio standing at 19.4 per cent at the end of September 2024.

Chapter 4: Prices and Inflation: Understanding the Dynamics

- As per the IMF, the global inflation rate moderated to 5.7 per cent by 2024 from its peak of 8.7 per cent in 2022.
- Retail inflation in India saw a reduction from 5.4 per cent in FY24 to 4.9 per cent in FY25 (April-December 2024).
- RBI and the IMF project India's consumer price inflation will gradually align with the target of around 4 per cent in FY26.
- Development of climate-resilient crop varieties and enhanced farming practices are essential to mitigate the effects of extreme weather events and achieve long-term price stability.

Chapter 5: Medium-Term Outlook: Deregulation Drives Growth

- Indian economy is in the middle of a change that represents an unprecedented economic challenge and opportunity. Geo-Economic Fragmentation (GEF) is replacing globalization leading to imminent economic realignments and readjustments.
- To realize the vision of Viksit Bharat by 2047 India will need to achieve a growth rate of around 8 per cent at constant prices, on average, for about a decade or two.
- The Medium-term growth outlook for India must consider the new global realities GEF, China's manufacturing prowess, and dependency of efforts for energy transition on China.
- India to focus on systematic deregulation to reinvigorate the domestic levers of growth and empower individuals and organisations to pursue legitimate economic activity with ease.
- Systemic deregulation or enhancing economic freedom for individuals and small businesses is arguably the most important policy **priority** to bolster India's medium-term growth prospects.
- Focus of reforms and economic policy must now be on systematic deregulation under Ease of Doing Business 2.0 and creation of a viable Mittelstand, i.e. India's SME sector.
- In the next step, States must work on liberalising standards and controls, setting legal safeguards for enforcement, reducing tariffs and fees, and applying risk-based regulation.

Chapter 6: Investment and Infrastructure: Keeping it Going

- The central focus of the Government in the last five years was on increasing public spending on infrastructure, and speeding up approvals and resource mobilization.
- The Union Government's capital expenditure on key infrastructure sectors has grown at a rate of 38.8 per cent from FY20 to FY24.
- Under railway connectivity, 2031 km of railway network was commissioned between April and November, 2024, and 17 new pairs of Vande Bharat trains were introduced between April and October 2024.
- Under road network, 5853 km of National Highways was constructed in FY25 (April-Dec).
- Under National Industrial Corridor Development Programme, a total of 383 plots covering 3788 acres have been allotted for **industrial use** for various sectors in phase 1.
- Operational efficiency improved reduction in average container turnaround time in major ports from 48.1 hours in FY24 to 30.4 hours during FY25 (Apr-Nov), significantly improving port connectivity.
- A 15.8 per cent year-on-year increase in renewable energy capacity of solar and wind power by December 2024.
- The share of renewable energy in India's total installed capacity now stands at 47 per cent.
- Government's schemes like the DDUGJY and the SAUBHAGYA improved electricity access in rural areas, electrifying 18,374 villages and providing electricity to 2.9 crore households.
- The government's digital connectivity initiatives have gained traction, particularly with the rollout of 5G services across all states and union territories by October 2024.
- Efforts to provide 4G mobile services to remote areas under the Universal Service Obligation Fund (now Digital Bharat Nidhi) have made significant strides, with over 10,700 villages covered by December 2024.
- Under the Jal Jeevan Mission, over 12 crore families have gained access of piped drinking water since its launch.
- Under Phase II of the Swachh Bharat Mission-Grameen, during April to November 2024, 1.92 lakh villages were incrementally declared ODF Plus under the model category, taking the total number of ODF Plus villages to 3.64 lakh.



- In urban areas, the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana has completed over 89 lakh houses.
- City transportation network is expanding rapidly, with metro and rapid rail systems operational or under construction in 29 cities, covering over 1,000 kilometers.
- Real Estate (Regulation & Development) Act, 2016, ensured regulation and transparency of Real Estate sector. By January 2025, over 1.38 lakh real estate projects registered, and 1.38 lakh complaints were resolved.
- India currently operates 56 active space assets. The government's Space Vision 2047 includes ambitious projects like the **Gaganyaan** mission and the **Chandrayaan-4** Lunar Sample Return Mission.
- Public sector investment alone cannot meet the requirements of infrastructure, and private sector participation will be crucial to bridge the gap.
- The government has created mechanisms such as the National Infrastructure Pipeline and National Monetisation Pipeline to facilitate private sector involvement in infrastructure.

Chapter 7: Industry: All about Business Reforms

- The industrial sector expected to grow by 6.2 per cent in FY-25 (first advance estimates), driven by robust growth in electricity and construction.
- The government has been actively promoting Smart Manufacturing and Industry 4.0, supporting the establishment of SAMARTH Udyog centres.
- In FY24, the Indian automobile domestic sales grew by 12.5 per cent.
- The domestic production of electronic goods has grown at a CAGR of 17.5 per cent from FY15 to FY24.
- 99 per cent smartphones now manufactured domestically, drastically reducing India's dependence on imports.
- The total annual turnover of pharmaceuticals in FY24 was ₹4.17 lakh crore, growing at an average rate of 10.1 per cent in the last
- As per the WIPO Report 2022, India ranks sixth among the top 10 patent filing offices globally.
- Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector has emerged as a highly vibrant sector of the Indian economy.
- To provide equity funding to MSMEs with the potential to scale up, the government launched the Self-Reliant India Fund with a corpus of ₹50,000 crore.
- The government is implementing the Micro and Small Enterprises-Cluster Development Programme to develop clusters across the country.

Chapter 8: Services -New Challenges for the Old War Horse

- The service sector's contribution to total GVA has risen from 50.6 per cent in FY14 to 55.3 per cent in FY25 (First Advance Estimates).
- The average growth rate of the services sector was 8 per cent in the pre-pandemic years (FY13 -FY20). It stood at 8.3 per cent in the post-pandemic period (FY23-FY25).
- India held a 4.3 per cent share in global services exports in 2023, ranking seventh worldwide.
- India's services export growth surged to 12.8 per cent during April-November FY25, up from 5.7 per cent in FY24.
- Information and computer-related services grew at a trend rate of 12.8 per cent over the last decade (FY13–FY23), increasing their share of overall GVA from 6.3 per cent to 10.9 per cent.
- Indian Railways recorded an 8 per cent growth in passenger traffic originating in FY24. Revenue-earning freight in FY24 grew by 5.2 per cent.
- The tourism sector's contribution to GDP returned to its pre-pandemic level of 5 per cent in FY23.

Chapter 9: Agriculture and Food Management: Sector of the Future

- The 'Agriculture and Allied Activities' sector contributes approximately 16 per cent of the country's GDP for FY24 (PE) at current prices.
- High-value sectors like horticulture, livestock, and fisheries have become key drivers of overall agricultural growth.
- Kharif foodgrain production for 2024 is expected to reach 1647.05 Lakh Metric Tonnes (LMT), an increase of 89.37 LMT from the previous year.
- For the fiscal year 2024-25, the MSP for Arhar and Bajra has been increased by 59 per cent and 77 per cent over the weighted average cost of production, respectively.
- The fisheries sector has shown the highest compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 8.7 per cent, followed by livestock with a CAGR of 8 per cent.
- National Food Security Act (NFSA) 2013 and the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) marked a fundamental shift in the approach to food security.



- The provision of free food grains under PMGKAY for another five years, reflects the long-term commitment of Govt towards food and nutrition security.
- As of 31st October, over 11 crore farmers have benefitted under PM-KISAN, while 23.61 lakh farmers are enrolled under PM Kisan Mandhan.

Chapter 10: Climate & Environment: Adaptation Matters

- India's ambition to achieve developed nation status by 2047 is fundamentally anchored in the vision of inclusive and sustainable development.
- India has installed electricity generation capacity of 2,13,701 megawatts from non-fossil fuel sources, which accounts for 46.8 per cent of the total capacity as of 30 November 2024.
- As per the Forest Survey of India 2024 an additional carbon sink of 2.29 billion tonnes CO2 equivalent has been created between 2005 and 2024.
- The India-led global movement, Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE), aims to enhance the country's sustainability efforts.
- By 2030, it is estimated that LiFE measures could save consumers around USD 440 billion globally through reduced consumption and lower prices.

Chapter 11: Social Sector -Extending the reach and driving empowerment

- The social services expenditure of the government (combined for Centre and States) increased at a compound annual growth rate of 15 per cent from FY21 to FY 25.
- Gini coefficient, a measure of inequality in consumption expenditure, is declining. For rural areas it declined to 0.237 in 2023-24 from 0.266 in 2022-23, and for urban areas, it fell to 0.284 in 2023-24 from 0.314 in 2022-23.
- Various fiscal policies of the government are aiding in reshaping the income distribution.
- Government health expenditure increases from 29.0 per cent to 48.0 per cent; share of out-of-pocket expenditure in total health expenditure declines from 62.6 per cent to 39.4 per cent, reducing financial hardship endured by households.
- The Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) has played a decisive role in the significant reductions in expenditure with over ₹1.25 lakh crore in savings being recorded.
- The strategy of —Localisation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) has been adopted to ensure that budgets at the Gram Panchayat levels align with the SDG objectives.

Chapter 12: Employment and Skill Development: Existential priorities

- Indian labour market indicators have improved with unemployment rate declining to 3.2 per cent in 2023-24 (July-June) from 6.0 per cent in 2017-18 (July-June).
- With around 26 per cent of the population in the age group of 10-24 years, India stands at the cusp of a unique demographic opportunity, as one of the youngest nations globally.
- To give a fillip to women's entrepreneurship, the government has launched several initiatives in terms of easier access to credit, marketing support, skill development, and support to women start-ups, etc.
- The growing digital economy and renewable energy sectors are providing enhanced opportunities for job creation, essential for achieving the Viksit Bharat's vision.
- The government is establishing a resilient and responsive skilled ecosystem to keep pace with emerging global trends such as automation, generative AI, digitalisation, and the effects of climate change.
- The Government has implemented measures to boost employment, foster self-employment, and promote worker welfare.
- The recently launched PM-Internship Scheme is emerging as a transformative catalyst for employment generation.
- The net payroll additions under EPFO have more than doubled in the past six years, signalling healthy growth in formal employment.

Chapter 13: Labour in the AI Era: Crisis or Catalyst?

- Developers of Artificial Intelligence (AI) promise to usher in a new age, where a bulk of the economically valuable work is automated.
- Al is anticipated to surpass human performance in critical decision-making across various fields, including healthcare, research, criminal justice, education, business, and financial services.
- Barriers to large-scale AI adoption persist in the present, which include concerns over reliability, resource inefficiencies, and infrastructure deficits. These challenges, along with Al's experimental nature, create a window for policymakers to act.
- Fortunately, due to AI presently being in its infancy, India is afforded the time necessary to strengthen its foundations and mobilise a nation-wide institutional response.
- Leveraging its young, dynamic, and tech-savvy population, India has the potential to create a workforce that can utilise AI to augment their work and productivity.



- The future revolves around 'Augmented Intelligence', where the workforce integrates both human and machine capabilities. This approach aims to enhance human potential and improve overall efficiency in job performance, ultimately benefiting society as a whole.
- Collaborative effort between government, private sector, and academia essential to minimise adverse societal effects of Al-driven transformation.



- International Expansion: Encourage Indian PSUs and private companies to acquire critical mineral assets abroad and strengthen trade with resource-rich countries.
- Mineral Processing Parks: Development of parks to support critical mineral processing and recycling.
- Research & Innovation: Establish a Centre of Excellence for critical mineral research and support start-ups and MSMEs in innovation.

Recent Developments & Achievements:

- Amendment to Mines and Minerals Act (1957): Increased exploration and mining of critical minerals.
- GSI Exploration Projects: 368 critical mineral exploration projects, with 195 ongoing and 227 more planned for FY 2025-26.

 - o The administered ex-mill price of ethanol from C Heavy Molasses (CHM) has been fixed at ₹57.97 per litre for the period 1st November 2024 to 31st October 2025, up from ₹56.58 per litre in the previous year.

 - Price Stability & Remunerative Prices: Ensures fair prices for ethanol suppliers and boosts the ethanol supply chain.

State-wise October Month Important Events

Andhra Pradesh

- PM Modi laid the foundation for the NTPC Green Energy Limited (NGEL) Green Hydrogen Hub in Pudimadaka, near Visakhapatnam. A collaboration between NGEL and NREDCAP, it is the first hub under India's National Green Hydrogen Mission, boosting the country's commitment to sustainable energy and the green hydrogen economy.
- The three-day Flamingo Festival 2025 in Andhra Pradesh concluded on January 20, 2025, with calls to protect the rich biodiversity of the region, specifically in Pulicat Lake and Nelapattu Bird Sanctuary. The event, which attracted numerous visitors, particularly bird watchers and photographers, was hailed as a major success. The closing ceremony saw the participation of Ministers Anam Ramanarayana Reddy and Anagani Satya Prasad, who expressed their gratitude to Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu for the revival of the festival, which had been dormant for some time.
- The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the construction of a third launchpad at ISRO's Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh, with an investment of ₹3,985 crore. This project aims to enhance India's space transportation capabilities, supporting Next Generation Launch Vehicles (NGLVs) and future human spaceflight missions, including an Indian crewed lunar landing by 2040.



Assam

- Assam's Elephant Population Estimate 2024 reveals an estimated 5,828 elephants, marking a rise of 109 from 2017. The
 estimation, conducted from February 20-27, 2024, involved 5,743 personnel across 1,536 survey blocks in 43 forest divisions.
 Despite challenges like habitat fragmentation and human-elephant conflicts, the findings highlight the role of Elephant Reserves
 and emphasize the need for improved conservation efforts.
- The Assam government launched **Gunotsav 2025**, an education evaluation program aimed at improving **learning outcomes** for **14.11 lakh students** in **16,056 schools**. The program, themed "Ensuring Quality Education," will be conducted in **three phases**: Phase 1 (January 6-9, 2025) covers **11 districts**, including **Barpeta**, **Kamrup**, and **Nagaon**. The initiative involves **external evaluators** and aims to assess and enhance **education quality** across the state.

Bihar

Arif Mohammad Khan was sworn in as the 42nd Governor of Bihar on January 2, 2025, succeeding Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar, now Governor of Kerala. The oath was administered by Patna High Court Chief Justice K. Vinod Chandran, with Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and Tejashwi Yadav in attendance.

Chhattisgarh

- Chhattisgarh has become the first Indian state to adopt the Green GDP model, integrating ecological services of forests into its
 economic framework. This initiative links environmental contributions like clean air, water conservation, and biodiversity to
 economic growth, ensuring sustainable development. The Green GDP model considers environmental costs, offering a more
 holistic view of economic health. The initiative aims to enhance budget planning, support sustainable policies, and recognize the
 economic value of forests.
- The Adani Group will invest ₹75,000 crore in Chhattisgarh, with ₹60,000 crore dedicated to expanding energy operations, including a 6,120 MW increase in power generation across Raipur, Korba, and Raigarh. This move strengthens the state's energy role.
- Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Dev Sai has launched a scheme to provide Rs 10,000 annually to landless labourers in the state, continuing his commitment to support vulnerable sections. This initiative is part of a larger series of welfare measures promised during the pre-poll campaign. The scheme aims to benefit approximately 7.5 lakh landless agricultural labourers in Chhattisgarh, reflecting the government's focus on improving their financial stability. The CM's announcement builds on past promises made during elections and further strengthens the state's social welfare framework.

Gujarat

- On Good Governance Day, Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel launched the SWAR (Speech and Written Analysis Resource)
 platform to enhance communication and accessibility for citizens, overcoming language barriers. Developed with the Ministry
 of Electronics and Information Technology's Bhashini Team, the platform uses AI for inclusive government services. Key features
 include speech-to-text integration for easier communication and an indigenous AI system (Bhashini) for effective speech
 recognition.
- The Union Ministry of Culture and Gujarat State Government inaugurated a state-of-the-art Archaeological Experiential
 Museum in Vadnagar, a town with over 2,500 years of history. The event, presided over by Union Home Minister Amit Shah and
 attended by Gujarat CM Bhupendrabhai Patel and Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, highlights Vadnagar's rich
 cultural and historical heritage.

Haryana

• The Haryana government, led by Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, announced key decisions to improve employee benefits and governance. Highlights include a 25% increase in Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity to ₹25 lakh, effective January 1, 2025, and reforms in External Development Charges (EDC) with a 10% annual increase. Aadhaar authentication will now be mandatory for candidates in HPSC exams. Additionally, crop damage reports due to heavy rains can be submitted on the e-reimbursement portal for affected regions.

Himachal Pradesh

Himachal Pradesh (H.P.) celebrates its Statehood Day on 25th January every year, marking the day when it officially became the
18th state of the Indian Union in 1971. On this occasion, the Prime Minister of India extended greetings to the people of H.P.,
acknowledging its unique cultural and historical heritage.

Kerala

Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar took oath as the 23rd Governor of Kerala on January 2, 2025, at Raj Bhavan, Thiruvananthapuram.
 He succeeds Arif Mohammed Khan, now Governor of Bihar. The oath was administered by Chief Justice Nitin Madhukar Jamdar, with Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and other dignitaries present.



- Kerala's renowned Kappad beach in Kozhikode and Chal beach in Kannur have been awarded the prestigious Blue Flag
 certification by the Denmark-based Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE). This certification recognizes beaches that
 meet high standards in environmental protection, safety, and sustainability. The Blue Flag status enhances Kerala's appeal as a
 sustainable tourism destination and serves as a global benchmark for eco-friendly tourism practices. This achievement marks a
 significant milestone in the state's efforts to preserve its natural beauty while promoting responsible tourism.
- Kottayam, Kerala, India unveiled the Indian Sustainable Natural Rubber (iSNR) initiative, aiming to establish new global benchmarks in sustainable rubber production. The launch event was graced by George Kurian, Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, Dairying, and Minority Affairs, and presided over by Thiruvanchur Radhakrishnan, Member of the Legislative Assembly.

Maharashtra

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Sri Sri Radha Madanmohanji Temple in Kharghar, Navi Mumbai on January 15, 2025. Built over 12 years at a cost of ₹170 crore, it is Asia's second-largest ISKCON temple. The temple embodies spirituality and knowledge, featuring various facilities aligned with ISKCON's mission. The event was attended by Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis, Deputy CM Eknath Shinde, Governor CP Radhakrishnan, and MP Hema Malini.
- Guillain-Barré Syndrome (GBS), a rare neurological disorder where the immune system attacks the peripheral nervous system, has seen a rise in cases in Pune, Maharashtra. Symptoms include muscle weakness, numbness, and paralysis in severe cases. Authorities are investigating the causes and implementing measures, while GBS typically affects adults and males.

Manipur

• Every year on January 21, the northeastern states of Manipur, Meghalaya, and Tripura celebrate their Statehood Day, marking the historic moment they attained full statehood under the North Eastern Region (Reorganization) Act of 1971. This day holds significant importance for the region, not only as a commemoration of their statehood but also as a celebration of their rich cultural heritage, vibrant history, and significant contributions to India's identity. The northeastern states, often referred to as the "Seven Sisters," are renowned for their unique culture, history, and natural beauty, and this day serves as a reflection of their growth into integral and empowered states within the Union of India.

Mizoram

• Mizoram has become the first state in Northeast India to distribute property cards under the Survey of Villages Abadi and Mapping with Improvised Technology in Village Areas (SVAMITVA) scheme. On January 18, 2025, Governor Gen (Dr) VK Singh virtually participated in the distribution event from Raj Bhavan, Aizawl. Prime Minister Narendra Modi also attended, distributing over 65 lakh property cards to beneficiaries across 10 states and two Union Territories. Among these, 1,754 property cardholders from 18 villages in Mizoram received their cards.

Odisha

- The Odisha government has announced a ₹15 crore sponsorship deal for the Indian national kho kho team, running from January 2025 to December 2027. The ₹5 crore annually will be funded through the Odisha Mining Corporation. The sponsorship aims to enhance team development, improve training infrastructure, and support participation in national and international competitions, reflecting Odisha's continued commitment to sports development.
- On January 13, 2025, Odisha became the 34th state to implement Ayushman Bharat PM-JAY, formalized through an MoU with the National Health Authority. The scheme will converge with Odisha's Gopabandhu Jan Arogya Yojana (GJAY), offering ₹5 lakh health coverage per family, plus an additional ₹5 lakh for women. Around 1.03 crore families will benefit, with 67.8 lakh families supported by the Union Government.
- The Odisha government has announced a monthly pension of ₹20,000 for surviving detainees of the 1975-1977 Emergency under
 the Maintenance of Internal Security Act (MISA). This welfare measure, effective from January 1, 2025, also includes medical
 coverage and other benefits, honoring those imprisoned during the Emergency period.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the 'Utkarsh Odisha Make in Odisha Conclave 2025' in Bhubaneswar on January 28. The event, Odisha's largest business summit, was attended by Odisha CM Mohan Charan Majhi, Union Ministers Dharmendra Pradhan and Ashwini Vaishnaw, and global business leaders. The two-day conclave aimed to promote investment, boost industrial growth, and position Odisha as an economic hub, with delegates from 16 countries.

Rajasthan

• The Sambhar Festival began on January 24, 2025, at Sambhar Lake in Rajasthan. Organized by the Rajasthan Tourism Department, the 5-day event celebrates the region's culture, heritage, and natural beauty. The festival highlights Rajasthani cuisine, folk arts, and the rich traditions of the area, with a special focus on the picturesque Sambhar Lake.



Sikkim

• India's first organic fisheries cluster was launched in Soreng District, Sikkim, by Union Animal Husbandry Minister Rajiv Ranjan Singh. This initiative promotes sustainable, antibiotic-free, chemical-free, and pesticide-free fish farming practices, aligning with Sikkim's reputation for organic agriculture. The cluster aims to cater to eco-conscious global markets.

Telangana

• On January 26, 2025, Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy launched four welfare schemes for farmers, landless laborers, and marginalized communities. Key initiatives include Rythu Bharosa, offering ₹12,000 per acre to farmers; Indiramma Aathmeeya Bharosa, providing ₹12,000 annually to landless labor families; and Indiramma Indlu, a housing scheme offering ₹5 lakh for constructing homes for homeless Dalits, Tribals, and backward classes, with a target of 4,50,000 houses and a ₹22,500 crore budget.

Tripura

On January 28, 2025, Tripura became the first northeastern state to sign an MoU with the Digital India Bhashini Division (DIBD) of MeitY. The agreement aims to enhance the use of regional languages in governance, making public services more accessible and inclusive. This partnership reflects Tripura's commitment to bridging the digital divide and strengthening governance through language technology.

Tamil Nadu

- The first Jallikattu event of 2025 took place on January 4 at Thatchankurichi village, Pudukkottai district. Over 600 bulls and 350 bull-tamers participated, marking the start of Pongal celebrations. The event is a significant part of Tamil Nadu's cultural heritage, showcasing bravery and strength. The rituals included an oath-taking ceremony with District Collector M. Aruna, and the term "Jallikattu" refers to rewards given to tamers in the form of silver and gold coins.
- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin announced a \$1 million prize for deciphering the Indus Valley script, marking the centenary of the Indus Valley Civilization discovery. Speaking at an International Conference in Chennai, he emphasized the significance of decoding this ancient script and affirmed the state's support for research and archaeological efforts.

Uttarakhand

- Uttarakhand become the first state in India to implement the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), as the state government has approved the UCC rules manual. The state's Cabinet, headed by Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami, cleared the manual and decided on key provisions related to registration services, the facilitation of live-in relationships, and the introduction of Tatkal services. The government is also implementing advanced digital platforms to ensure efficient and widespread access to these services. Training of officials is underway, with a statewide mock drill planned to prepare the stakeholders for smooth implementation.
- Uttarakhand became the first state in independent India to implement the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), effective January 27, 2025.
 A key BJP election promise, the UCC aims to ensure uniformity in personal laws, offering equal rights and responsibilities for all citizens, regardless of religion or community. Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami emphasized the law's focus on fairness, equality, and social harmony, not targeting any individual or group.

Uttar Pradesh

- On January 10, 2025, UP CM Yogi Adityanath launched 'Kumbhvani' (103.5 MHz), an FM channel by All India Radio, to enhance the Maha Kumbh 2025 experience. The channel broadcasts from 5:55 AM to 10:05 PM daily, from January 10 to February 26, 2025. Dr. L. Murugan attended online.
- Uttar Pradesh is considering the privatization of two power distribution companies, Dakshinanchal Vidyut Vitran Nigam and
 Purvanchal Vidyut Vitran Nigam, to tackle challenges like power losses and poor infrastructure. The UP Power Corporation Ltd
 (UPPCL) has issued a tender for consultants and advisers to explore privatization or PPP to improve efficiency and service quality.
- Uttar Pradesh, India's most populous state, commemorates its Foundation Day every year on January 24. This occasion reflects
 the state's rich cultural heritage, remarkable contributions to India's development, and its historical journey. In 2025, Uttar
 Pradesh celebrates its 76th Foundation Day, with grand events scheduled from January 24 to January 26 at Awadh Shilp Gram
 in Lucknow. Let us delve into the historical significance, achievements, and contributions of Uttar Pradesh on this momentous
 occasion.
- The Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) granted the Banke Bihari Temple in Vrindavan, Uttar Pradesh, a license under the
 Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act (FCRA), allowing it to receive foreign funds. This approval follows a court intervention and
 the formation of a management committee, which applied for the license to manage the temple's international donations and
 foreign currency receipts.



West Bengal

The Tribal Students' Federation (TSF) in Tripura has renewed its protest, demanding the adoption of the Roman script for the Kokborok language. This long-standing demand seeks to have exam papers prepared in both Bengali and Roman scripts to address challenges faced by students. Kokborok, a Sino-Tibetan language spoken by 24% of Tripura's population, has been officially recognized since 1979. Despite its recognition, students face difficulties as exams are currently conducted only in the Bengali script.

Union Territories

- On January 13, 2025, PM Modi inaugurated the Z-Morh Tunnel in Jammu and Kashmir, enhancing connectivity between Srinagar and Ladakh. The 6.5 km, bi-directional tunnel, at 8,652 feet, bypasses avalanche-prone areas, reducing travel time from 2+ hours to 15 minutes. The ₹2,400 crore project, started in 2015, was led by NHAI.
- Dr. Jitendra Singh announced the establishment of a Regional Meteorological Centre in Jammu during the 150th anniversary of the India Meteorological Department (IMD). This initiative aims to enhance weather forecasting, disaster preparedness, and climate resilience in Jammu & Kashmir. The event highlighted IMD's journey and India's leadership in climate action under PM Modi.
- In the 118th "Mann Ki Baat" episode on January 19, 2025, PM Narendra Modi highlighted the empowerment of women in the
 Andaman and Nicobar Islands through SHGs producing Virgin Coconut Oil (VCO). The recent GI tag for VCO from Nicobar district
 marks a significant step in promoting local products globally and boosting the economic empowerment of tribal communities via
 specialized training in marketing and branding.
- The Jammu & Kashmir Forest Research Institute (JKFRI) launched the 'Digital Tree Aadhar' initiative to protect and monitor
 Kashmir's chinar trees, threatened by urbanization and infrastructure projects. Modeled after India's Aadhaar system, each tree
 receives a unique digital identity with geo-tagging, QR codes, and metal cards for public scanning, aiming to preserve biodiversity
 and raise awareness about these iconic trees.

January Month Launches & Inaugurations:

- The Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation (MBMC), in partnership with NITI Aayog's Women Entrepreneurship Platform (WEP), launched the 'Faral Sakhi' initiative to empower women entrepreneurs in traditional snack production. It provides training, a central kitchen, and sales support for SHGs. During Diwali, the initiative sold over 3 tons of snacks, highlighting its success through quality and promotion.
- The National Commission for Women (NCW), in partnership with the Lok Sabha Secretariat and Ministry of Tribal Affairs, launched 'Panchayat Se Parliament 2.0' at Samvidhan Sadan to mark Bhagwan Birsa Munda's 150th birth anniversary. The event gathered 502 elected women representatives from STs across 22 states/UTs. It aims to empower women leaders by enhancing their knowledge of constitutional provisions, parliamentary procedures, and governance through workshops, sessions, and guided tours of key government sites.
- In a landmark development for India's electronics manufacturing sector, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw inaugurated Syrma
 SGS Technology's advanced laptop assembly line in Chennai. This new facility symbolizes India's growing dominance in IT
 hardware production, expanding its success in mobile manufacturing to high-value electronics like laptops. With initiatives
 under the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) 2.0 scheme, India is taking significant steps towards becoming a global IT hardware
 hub.
- Piyush Goyal launched the Bharat Cleantech Manufacturing Platform at the Bharat Climate Forum 2025 in New Delhi, aiming to
 strengthen India's cleantech sectors like solar, wind, hydrogen, and battery storage. The platform fosters collaboration,
 innovation, and financing to make India a global sustainability leader. Goyal emphasized self-sustaining growth and the need for
 innovation and scaling in the sector.
- South Eastern Coalfields Limited (SECL) has launched a Post-Retirement Benefit (PRB) Cell to enhance the welfare of its retired employees. This single-window solution consolidates post-retirement services, improving the experience for retirees. The initiative aligns with Mission Sambandh, SECL's program to foster better communication and stakeholder engagement.
- On January 14, 2025, Piyush Goyal, Union Minister of Commerce, inaugurated the National Turmeric Board in New Delhi and appointed Shri Palle Ganga Reddy as its first Chairperson. Headquartered in Nizamabad, Telangana, the Board will support turmeric farmers across 20 states, focusing on farmer welfare, production enhancement, and research on new varieties. It will also promote value addition for global markets and highlight turmeric's health benefits, with a focus on Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.



- Union Minister Shri Piyush Goyal launched the Bharat Cleantech Manufacturing Platform on January 11, 2025, at the Bharat Climate Forum. The initiative aims to strengthen India's cleantech value chains in solar, wind, hydrogen, and battery storage sectors. Goyal emphasized the importance of innovation, self-reliance, and reducing dependence on government support, encouraging long-term **growth** in the **clean energy** industry.
- On January 17, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Bharat Mobility Global Expo 2025 at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. India's largest mobility expo, running from January 17-22, 2025, spans three venues: Bharat Mandapam, Yashobhoomi, and India Expo Centre & Mart. The event features 9+ shows, 20+ conferences, and state sessions on regional mobility policies, promoting industry-government collaboration.
- On January 15, 2025, coinciding with Army Day, the government launched the "Bharat Ranbhoomi Darshan" app and website in Pune, Maharashtra. Developed by the Ministries of Defence, Tourism, and the Indian Army, the app allows civilians to visit key battlefield locations from the 1962, 1971, and 1999 wars, as well as significant conflict zones like Siachen base camp and Galwan valley. This initiative aims to transform border regions into tourist hubs, fostering a deeper connection to India's military history and the sacrifices of its soldiers.
- The Department of Science and Technology, under the Union Ministry of Science and Technology, has inaugurated the first astronomical observatory in Eastern India atop Panchet Hill in the Garpanchkot area of Purulia district, West Bengal. This marks an important milestone in the advancement of astronomical research in India. It is the sixth astronomical observatory in the country, following observatories in locations such as Ladakh, Nainital (Uttarakhand), Mount Abu (Rajasthan), Girbani Hills (Pune), and Kavalur (Tamil Nadu).
- Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated India's first-of-its-kind CSIR Mega Innovation Complex in Mumbai, marking a significant milestone in the nation's innovation landscape. This state-of-the-art facility is designed to bolster start-ups, micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs), and industry stakeholders by providing high-end scientific infrastructure and expertise.
- The "Hamara Samvidhan Hamara Swabhiman" campaign, launched on January 24, 2024, by the Hon'ble Vice President of India at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar International Centre in New Delhi, commemorates the 75th anniversary of India's Constitution and its establishment as a Republic. This year-long initiative aims to deepen citizens' understanding of the Constitution and promote legal empowerment across the nation.

Important Festival

- On January 4, 2025, PM Narendra Modi inaugurated the Grameen Bharat Mahotsav 2025 at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, organized by DFS and NABARD. Themed "Building a Resilient Rural India for a Viksit Bharat 2047," with the motto "गांव बढ़े, तो देश बढ़े," the event aims to enhance rural infrastructure, promote self-reliance, and foster innovation. Key focus areas include women's entrepreneurship, financial inclusion, and sustainable agriculture in North-East India. The festival runs from January 4 to 9, 2025.
- The 18th Elephant and Tourism Festival in Sauraha, Chitwan, Nepal, draws both local and international visitors. Held near Chitwan National Park, it coincides with New Year and Christmas celebrations, running for five days and concluding on December **30**. The event serves as a key driver for **tourism** in the region, offering diverse and unique attractions.
- The International Pashmina Festival in Nepal, organized by the Nepal Pashmina Industries Association and Confederation of Nepalese Industries, showcased Nepal's expertise in producing authentic Pashmina from the Chyangra goat. The event celebrated traditional weaving methods and highlighted the global recognition of Chyangra Pashmina as a premium product.
- The Nagoba Jatara festival in Keslapur, Telangana, drew nearly one lakh devotees from across India to celebrate the Nagoba temple. This seven-day event is a key religious and cultural gathering for the Mesram clan and other aboriginal tribes. Devotees from Telangana, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, and Odisha participated in the vibrant celebrations.
- The Pangsau Pass International Festival (PPIF) 2025, held in Nampong, Arunachal Pradesh, is a vibrant celebration of the region's rich cultural heritage and its historical significance during World War II. This year's festival is particularly special as it coincides with the 80th anniversary of the war's conclusion. Chief Minister Pema Khandu emphasized plans to bolster tourism by restoring World War II remnants in the region, underscoring the festival's role in promoting economic growth, cultural exchange, and historical remembrance.
- The Sci-Fi Science Film Festival of India was inaugurated by Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on January 30, 2025, in Panaji. Organized by Vidnyan Parishad Goa, the festival celebrates science, innovation, and curiosity. This year's theme, "Green Revolution," honors Dr. M. Swaminathan and aims to inspire youth toward a sustainable future. The 4-day event promotes scientific engagement for India's progress.



- The International Saraswati Mahotsav 2025 will be celebrated in Haryana from January 29 to February 4, 2025, at Pehowa Saraswati Tirtha Sthal. Inaugurated by Haryana CM Nayab Singh Saini, the event will showcase Haryana's culture, craftsmanship, and traditional heritage, with programs at both state and national levels. The festival aims to boost tourism and provide a platform for local artisans and craftsmen.
- The **Boda Tyohar**, or **Magho ko Tyohar**, is the largest annual festival of the **Hatti tribes** in **Himachal Pradesh's Trans-Giri region**. Celebrated by over **three lakh** community members, this **month-long festival** marks the end of the **Magha** month, featuring unique **cultural practices**, **rituals**, and promoting **community unity**. It holds significant cultural importance, showcasing **Hatti traditions** and beliefs.
- The Gaan-Ngai festival, the largest post-harvest celebration of the Zeliangrong community, began on January 12, 2025 in
 Manipur. Celebrated for five days, it features vibrant cultural performances and traditional rituals, symbolizing the transition
 from the old year to the new. The festival emphasizes peace, prosperity, and community healing.
- The Kagyed Chaam Dance Festival in Gangtok, Sikkim, is a significant Buddhist celebration held annually at Tsuklakhang Palace. Featuring masked dances by monks and lamas, it symbolizes the destruction of negative forces and the arrival of peace and prosperity for the new year. Held on the 28th and 29th day of the 10th month of the Tibetan Lunar Calendar, the festival attracts both locals and tourists. It concludes with the ritualistic burning of effigies, symbolizing the victory of good over evil.
- The Avaniyapuram Jallikattu began on January 14, 2025, in Madurai, celebrating Tamil Nadu's cultural heritage during the Pongal festival. The event featured 1,100 bulls and 900 bull-tamers, with the best bull winning a ₹11 lakh tractor and the top bull-tamer receiving an ₹8 lakh car.

Miscellaneous National News

- The PM CARES Fund, created in March 2020 for the COVID-19 crisis, saw a sharp decline in contributions, dropping from ₹7,184 crore in 2020-21 to ₹912 crore in 2022-23. Voluntary donations fell to ₹909.64 crore, and foreign donations dropped drastically from ₹495 crore to ₹2.57 crore. The fund's contributions peaked during the pandemic, with support waning as the crisis subsided.
- The **813th Urs** of **Hazrat Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti** has begun, marking a major religious event in **Ajmer**. The **flag ceremony** is scheduled for **December 28, 2024**, at the **Dargah Khwaja Saheb**. The annual **Urs**, commemorating the saint's death anniversary, attracts millions of devotees for **prayers** and **blessings**. This event holds immense significance for followers of **Sufi** traditions.
- Kaamya Karthikeyan, a 17-year-old student from Mumbai, became the youngest female to conquer the Seven Summits, scaling the highest peaks across all seven continents. Her achievement includes summiting Mount Vinson in Antarctica on December 24, 2024. Kaamya's climbs include Mount Kilimanjaro (Africa), Mount Elbrus (Europe), Mount Kosciuszko (Australia), Mount Aconcagua (South America), Mount Denali (North America), and Mount Everest (Asia). She was accompanied by her father, Cdr S. Karthikeyan, during the final climb.
- Blinkit CEO Albinder Dhindsa announced the launch of an instant ambulance service in Gurgaon, allowing residents to book Basic
 Life Support (BLS) ambulances via the Blinkit app, with arrival within 10 minutes. The service aims to provide quick emergency
 medical transport in urban areas.
- The Indian government is considering the introduction of honorary senior ranks for retiring Central Armed Police Force (CAPF) personnel who haven't been promoted due to organizational constraints. Proposed by Anish Dayal Singh, the initiative would allow eligible personnel to wear the insignia of their next higher rank in their final month of service and receive the corresponding pay. Home Minister Amit Shah has approved the proposal, which is expected to be implemented across all CAPFs soon.
- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin inaugurated India's first-ever glass bridge in Kanniyakumari, connecting the Vivekananda Rock Memorial and the Thiruvalluvar Statue. Built under a ₹37-crore initiative, the bridge aims to enhance the tourist experience and boost local tourism. The project coincides with the silver jubilee of the Thiruvalluvar Statue's unveiling and is expected to attract domestic and international tourists.
- Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah, launch the BHARATPOL portal developed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on January 7, 2025, at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. The portal aims to facilitate real-time international police assistance and enhance India's efforts to combat transnational crimes. Developed by the CBI, which acts as the National Central Bureau (NCB) for INTERPOL in India, the portal will improve communication between law enforcement agencies (LEAs) across India and INTERPOL.
- From January 3 to 5, 2025, **Gujarat's Jamnagar district** hosted **India's inaugural census of coastal and wader birds.** This significant event aimed to enhance understanding of bird populations and their habitats along the state's coastline.
- On January 6, 2025, Nadi Tarangini, an Al-powered pulse diagnostic device developed by Atreya Innovations, received approval from the Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO), making it India's first ayurvedic medical device to be officially recognized. The device, which combines modern technology with ancient Ayurvedic practices, was created after over six years of research, and aims to revolutionize traditional Ayurvedic diagnostic methods by offering precise health insights through pulse examination.



- NITI Aayog, established on January 1, 2015, emerged as a visionary reform in India's governance structure, replacing the Planning Commission to better address the needs of a growing, market-driven economy. In his first Independence Day speech in 2014, Prime Minister Narendra Modi introduced NITI Aayog as an institution with a new design and structure, emphasizing a shift towards decentralization and competitive federalism. Over the past decade, NITI Aayog has evolved into a platform for policy innovation, addressing the country's development challenges and promoting inclusive growth through collaborative governance. This article examines NITI Aayog's evolution over the last 10 years, its key principles, major initiatives, and future challenges.
- On January 9, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi flagged off the **Pravasi Bharatiya Express**, a special **state-of-the-art tourist train for the Indian diaspora**, from Bhubaneswar, Odisha. The launch coincides with the 110th anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi's return to India from South Africa on this date in 1915. The train, designed under the Pravasi Teerth Darshan Yojana (PTDY), aims to connect Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) with India's rich cultural and religious heritage by offering a fully sponsored tour across the country.
- On January 5, 2025, PM Narendra Modi inaugurated a 13-km section of the Delhi-Meerut Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS), connecting Sahibabad (Uttar Pradesh) to New Ashok Nagar (Delhi). This forms part of the 82-km Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut Namo Bharat corridor, aiming to reduce travel time. The section includes a 6 km underground stretch, with Anand Vihar station serving as a major transit hub.
- The DGFT has amended the Foreign Trade Policy (FTP) 2023 to promote inclusivity and transparency in trade policy. The
 amendment mandates consultations with stakeholders like importers, exporters, and industry experts during the policy
 formulation or amendment process. A structured mechanism will provide feedback on why certain suggestions aren't accepted,
 fostering trust and clarity between the government and trade participants.
- Recent reports highlight a significant decline in rural-to-urban migration in India, with migration dropping by 53.7 million in 2023, reflecting a 11.8% decrease from 2011. This has led to increased ruralization and associated economic challenges. The migration rate fell from 37.6% in 2011 to 28.9% in 2023, with a decrease in economic migration. The workforce has become more reliant on agriculture, with 46.1% of people employed in the sector in 2023-24, up from 42.5% in 2017-18. This has led to food inflation, disguised unemployment, and stagnant wages, especially among women, whose real wages fell by 2.3% annually over the past five years.
- On January 6, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi virtually inaugurated the Jammu Railway Division, the 69th division under the Northern Railway Zone. The division, headquartered in Jammu, covers 742.1 route kilometers, including key sections like Pathankot-Jammu-Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla and others, aimed at boosting connectivity and socio-economic development in northern India.
- As of January 2025, India's metro rail network has surpassed 1,000 kilometers, making it the third-largest in the world, after China and the United States. India's metro journey began with Kolkata Metro in 1984, followed by the Delhi Metro in 2002, which is now the country's largest with a network of 395 km.
- Aero India 2025, Asia's premier aerospace exhibition, will be held from February 10-14, 2025, in Bengaluru under the theme "The Runway to a Billion Opportunities." The event aims to enhance India's aerospace sector and foster global partnerships. Key highlights include the Defence Ministers' Conclave for strategic partnerships and the CEOs' Round-Table for global leaders and Indian defence manufacturing executives to explore OEM opportunities in India.
- The Central Government has approved a memorial for former President Pranab Mukherjee at Rashtriya Smriti Sthal in Rajghat,
 Delhi. This tribute, honoring his contributions to Indian politics, was announced on January 1, 2025, and was appreciated by his daughter, Sharmistha Mukherjee.
- Frankie Remruatdika Zadeng, born on January 1, 2025, in Aizawl, Mizoram, is India's first Generation Beta baby. Weighing 3.12 kg, Frankie symbolizes the beginning of a new chapter in India's progress. Generation Beta, a term coined by Australian futurist Mark McCrindle, refers to those born from the mid-2020s, marked by rapid technological advancements and a focus on sustainability. Frankie's birth reflects the hope and progress of this generation, which will thrive in a digitally connected and Aldriven world.
- Justice B.N. Srikrishna has been appointed as the Chairman of the Advisory Board for Equal and its investee OneMoney, focused on identity verification and data-sharing. The board includes notable figures such as Jagdish Capoor, Rakesh Mohan, Anand Sinha, J. Satyanarayana, Ajay Prakash Sawhney, P.H. Ravikumar, Anitha Ramachandran, and Sunil Kulkarni. This appointment comes amid the government's push for stronger data security with the release of the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act draft rules.
- The Indian government has announced a ₹50,000 crore investment over five years to enhance inland water transport, focusing
 on new national waterways, green shipping, and the introduction of 1,000 green vessels. The plan includes expanding Water
 Metro projects to 15 cities, including Guwahati, and developing infrastructure like floating steel jetties on the Godavari River,
 boosting urban connectivity and trade.



- Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute (BMCRI) has been selected by ICMR to establish South India's first Infectious
 Disease Research and Diagnostic Laboratory (IRDL). The lab will focus on bacterial, fungal, and parasitic diseases, aiming for
 faster diagnosis and improved healthcare outcomes. It will enhance research on antibiotic resistance, fungal infections, and
 tropical diseases, reducing the need for out-of-state sample testing.
- The appointment process for India's Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and Election Commissioners (ECs) has been reformed under the 2023 Act to enhance transparency and accountability. A three-member Selection Committee, including the Prime Minister, a nominated Cabinet Minister, and the Leader of the Opposition, will oversee appointments, supported by a Search Committee. The Act also allows external candidates to bring diverse perspectives. Influenced by a Supreme Court ruling advocating balanced appointments, the exclusion of the Chief Justice of India and concerns over potential partisan nominations have drawn criticism. The upcoming selection of the next CEC, post-Rajiv Kumar's tenure ending February 18, 2025, will test these reforms' impact on the Election Commission's independence and effectiveness.
- The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the constitution of the 8th Central Pay Commission, which will evaluate and recommend revised salary structures and allowances for central government employees and pensioners. This early initiative ensures readiness for implementing the recommendations by January 1, 2026. The commission's scope encompasses over one crore employees and pensioners, aiming to address compensation, pensions, and welfare enhancements.
- Dr. S. Jaishankar, India's External Affairs Minister, represent India at Donald Trump's swearing-in on January 20, 2025, marking
 his second term as the 47th President of the U.S. This visit highlights the strengthening of India-U.S. relations.
- India added a record **30 GW** of **renewable energy** capacity in 2024, a **113% increase** from 2023. This milestone supports India's goal of reaching **500 GW** by 2030, emphasizing its commitment to **clean energy** and reducing **carbon footprint**.
- The INROAD project, backed by ₹100 crore, aims to improve natural rubber quality in India's North-East. It focuses on skill
 development for rubber growers and building model infrastructure, with support from the tyre industry, highlighting
 collaboration between agriculture and manufacturing.
- India's Railway Minister, Ashwini Vaishnaw, announced the development of the world's most powerful hydrogen fuel-run train
 engine by Indian Railways during the 18th Pravasi Bharatiya Divas. Built with indigenous technology, this achievement sets a
 new benchmark in green energy and sustainable development in the railway sector.
- Justice Krishnan Vinod Chandran was sworn in as the newest judge of the Supreme Court of India on January 16, 2025. Chief
 Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna administered the oath of office. With this appointment, the Supreme Court's judicial strength has
 risen to 33, just one short of its full sanctioned capacity.
- The 9th Foundation Day of Startup India celebrated India's progress as a global innovation hub. Union Minister Piyush Goyal launched the PRABHAAV Factbook and Bharat Startup Challenge, highlighting the country's startup growth, with 1.59 lakh startups, 76 IPOs in 2024, and ₹13 trillion in government funding.
- The world's first Mahamrityunjaya Yantra, measuring 52 feet, has been installed at Tapovan Ashram in Prayagraj, a sacred site of the Maha Kumbh. This spiritual marvel, known as the Victory over Death Yantra, helps devotees overcome fear of death, disease, and danger, while enhancing courage, positivity, and connecting them to Lord Shiva's higher energy.
- India's textile industry has long been a cornerstone of its economy, renowned for its rich heritage and diverse products. In recent years, the sector has experienced significant growth, positioning India as a formidable player in the global textile market.
- On January 16, 2025, Startup India celebrated its 9th anniversary as National Startup Day, marking India's emergence as the 3rd largest startup ecosystem globally with over 1.59 lakh startups. Launched in 2016, the initiative has fostered growth in fintech, edtech, health-tech, and e-commerce, driving India's transformation into a global hub for innovation and entrepreneurship.
- Kalagram, located in Prayagraj during Mahakumbh 2025, is a cultural hub created by the Ministry of Culture to showcase India's
 rich heritage. It offers an immersive experience with crafts, cuisine, and cultural performances, reflecting India's diverse cultural
 legacy and spiritual significance. Kalagram serves as a cultural jewel that celebrates the essence of Bharat.
- On January 16, 2025, the Lokpal of India celebrated its inaugural **Foundation Day** at the **Manekshaw Centre in New Delhi,** marking 11 years since its establishment on January 16, 2014, under the **Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013.**
- On January 17, 2025, the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) launched National Broadband Mission 2.0 (NBM 2.0) and the Sanchar Saathi mobile app. Building on NBM 1.0, NBM 2.0 aims to connect 1.7 lakh villages, ensuring 60% of rural households have access to 100 Mbps broadband. This initiative is designed to bridge the digital divide and promote inclusive growth across India.
- The Prime Ministers' Museum & Library (PMML) has restructured its leadership, expanding its executive council from 29 to 34 members to bring in diverse expertise. Nripendra Mishra has been reappointed as chairperson for another five-year term, while new members include Smriti Irani (former Union Minister), Shekhar Kapur (filmmaker), Rajiv Kumar (former NITI Aayog Vice-Chairman), Syed Ata Hasnain (retired Army General), and Vasudev Kamath (cultural representative). The reshuffle sees the exclusion of Anurag Thakur and Rajat Sharma, indicating a strategic shift in governance. Originally the Nehru Memorial Museum & Library (NMML), PMML was renamed in 2023 to represent the legacies of all Indian Prime Ministers, aligning with the government's vision of a comprehensive political repository.



- The Musi River Historic Buildings in Hyderabad have been added to the prestigious 2025 World Monuments Watch list by the World Monuments Fund (WMF). This inclusion underscores the urgent need to preserve these structures amid environmental challenges, such as the degradation of the Musi River and urban development. The recognition aligns with the Telangana government's efforts to rejuvenate the river and its heritage, promoting both heritage conservation and environmental sustainability.
- The sacred city of Ayodhya in Uttar Pradesh is resonating with devotion and festivity as it marks the first anniversary of the 'Pran Pratishtha' of Ram Lalla at the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Mandir. The milestone event, celebrated on Wednesday, January 22, 2025, reflects the city's spiritual legacy and the culmination of centuries of devotion and struggle.
- The Centre has made a significant decision to increase the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for raw jute by Rs 315, setting it at Rs 5,650 per quintal for the 2025-26 marketing season. This move, approved by the Union Cabinet, aims to provide farmers with a return of 66.8 per cent over the all-India weighted average cost of production, thus encouraging farmers to invest in jute cultivation.
- The recent decision by the Neutral Expert, appointed by the World Bank under the terms of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT), marks
 a significant diplomatic win for India. The Expert deemed himself "competent" to adjudicate the technical differences raised
 between India and Pakistan regarding the design of two hydroelectric projects in Jammu and Kashmir. This outcome vindicates
 India's long-standing position and opens a new chapter in the resolution of disputes under the IWT framework.
- Union Minister Piyush Goyal set an ambitious target of achieving 10,000 Geographical Indication (GI) Tags by 2030 during the GI Samagam in New Delhi. With 605 GI tags issued so far, Goyal emphasized a whole-of-government approach and the formation of a dedicated committee for implementation. He highlighted initiatives like One District One Product (ODOP) and the Anusandhan National Research Foundation Fund to strengthen India's Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) ecosystem, focusing on the dual goal of development and heritage preservation.
- India has been a leader in the global fight against tuberculosis (TB), starting with the National Tuberculosis Program (NTP) in 1962 and evolving to the National Tuberculosis Elimination Program (NTEP) in 2020, aiming to eliminate TB by 2025. Despite significant progress, India still accounts for 27% of the global TB burden with an incidence rate of 210 per 100,000 in 2021, and faces challenges such as drug-resistant TB, including MDR and XDR TB.
- Indore and Udaipur have become the first Indian cities to join the global list of accredited Wetland Cities under the Ramsar Convention. This recognition underscores India's commitment to sustainable urban development and ecological conservation.
 Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated the cities, emphasizing the importance of balancing urban growth with environmental sustainability, and recognizing the vital role of wetlands in providing ecological, social, and economic benefits.
- Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Civil Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu, Prayagraj Airport has been transformed into a modern hub for the Maha Kumbh Mahotsav 2025. The airport now boasts expanded terminals, enhanced passenger amenities, and improved connectivity, accommodating millions of devotees from January 13 to February 26, 2025. The project was closely overseen through regular inspections and efficient planning.
- The Union Cabinet approved the National Critical Mineral Mission (CMM) with an outlay of Rs 16,300 crore to boost the domestic production of essential minerals for technology and defense manufacturing. The mission focuses on critical minerals like lithium, cobalt, copper, nickel, and rare earth elements, aiming to reduce import dependence, enhance resource security, and streamline regulatory processes. It will cover the entire value chain, from exploration to recovery, promoting public and private sector participation.
- The MSME Trade Enablement and Marketing (TEAM) Initiative has been launched by the Ministry of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MoMSME) with a ₹277.35 crore budget over three years. The initiative aims to onboard 5 lakh micro and small enterprises, focusing on women-led businesses, and enhance their digital presence. In partnership with the Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC), it aims to empower MSMEs, reduce operational barriers, and create growth opportunities in India's digital economy.
- On January 31, 2025, the Ministry of Railways launched the 'SwaRail' SuperApp to integrate multiple railway services into one
 platform. Currently in beta, the app offers ticket bookings, platform and parcel bookings, train and PNR inquiries, food ordering,
 and Rail Madad for complaints and assistance. This app aims to enhance the user experience and reduce the need for multiple
 apps.
- India has added **four new sites** to the **Ramsar List of Wetlands of International Importance**, bringing the total to 89. The new additions include **Udhwa Lake** in **Jharkhand** (the state's first Ramsar site), **Sikkim's inaugural Ramsar site**, a **wetland in Gujarat**, and a site from **Northeast India**. This highlights India's dedication to **wetland conservation** and preserving its **biodiversity** across diverse regions.
- A High-Level Committee (HLC), led by Amit Shah, has approved Rs 3,027.86 crore for disaster mitigation projects across India.
 The funding will support initiatives in lightning safety, drought-prone regions, and forest fire management. Key members, including Nirmala Sitharaman, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, and the Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog, aim to enhance disaster preparedness and reduce the impact of natural disasters.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

- South Korea's political crisis deepened on December 27, 2024, when parliament voted to impeach Acting President Han Ducksoo. This followed the impeachment of President Yoon Suk Yeol on December 14, 2024, after he imposed martial law on December 3. Han's refusal to appoint three judges to the Constitutional Court sparked opposition calls for his impeachment, marking a historic moment as the first time an acting president has been impeached in South Korea.
- China has introduced the CR450, the world's fastest high-speed train prototype, achieving test speeds of 450 km/h. It surpasses the previous CR400 Fuxing trains (350 km/h) and combines speed, energy efficiency, safety, and passenger comfort. The CR450 aligns with China's goal to expand its high-speed rail network to 70,000 km by 2035, reinforcing its leadership in global rail systems. The CR450's maximum operating speed is 400 km/h, after extensive testing.
- Starting January 1, 2025, Russia introduced a new tourist tax, replacing the earlier resort fee, aimed at boosting regional tourism infrastructure. The phased plan begins with a 1% charge on lodging costs, increasing to 3% by 2027. The tax applies to hotels and accommodations, with costs passed on to tourists. Regional authorities can implement this as a local levy to enhance Russia's tourism landscape.
- Starting January 1, 2025, Switzerland introduces significant changes, including a facial coverings ban in public, impacting burqas, niqabs, and similar face coverings. Violations could lead to fines up to CHF 1,000 (\$1,143). Other reforms include inheritance law changes, increased pensions, and measures to boost bank solvency and liquidity, aligning with European norms and addressing past financial crises.
- China is facing a surge in human metapneumovirus (HMPV) cases, raising concerns of a potential health crisis similar to COVID-19. Hospitals are overcrowded, with HMPV, influenza A, Mycoplasma pneumoniae, and COVID-19 potentially contributing to the situation. HMPV, identified in 2001, causes respiratory infections and primarily affects young children, the elderly, and those with weakened immune systems. No official emergency has been declared by Chinese authorities.
- On January 1, 2025, Pakistan began its two-year tenure as a non-permanent member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), its eighth term. Pakistan secured its seat with 182 votes in the General Assembly. During its term, Pakistan will preside over the UNSC in July 2025 and serve on the ISIS and Al Qaeda Sanctions Committee, focusing on terrorist designations and sanctions. Ambassador Munir Akram highlighted Pakistan's commitment to an active and constructive role.
- Mike Johnson, a Republican from Louisiana, was re-elected as the Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives in a tense vote
 on the first day of the new Congress. Despite opposition from hard-right Republicans and challenges from a slim majority, Johnson
 secured the position with support from President-elect Donald Trump. His re-election comes amid internal GOP divisions and
 increased political stakes as the party prepares for ambitious policy initiatives under Trump's leadership.
- Tomiko Itooka, recognized as the world's oldest person by Guinness World Records, passed away at 116 in January 2025. Born in May 1908, she lived through major historical events, including both World Wars and significant technological advancements. Her remarkable life story serves as a testament to resilience and longevity.
- Hanoi, Vietnam's capital, was recently reported as the world's most polluted city on January 3, 2025, with PM2.5 levels reaching 266 micrograms per cubic meter. The major sources of pollution include heavy traffic, trash burning, and industrial emissions, raising serious health concerns among residents.
- Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced his resignation as leader of the Liberal Party after nearly a decade in power, citing internal conflicts and declining public support. He will remain in a caretaker role until a new leader is elected. This comes amid growing support for Pierre Poilievre and the Conservative Party.



- Sister Inah Canabarro Lucas, from Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil, has been confirmed as the world's oldest living person at 116 years old. Born on June 8, 1908, she is a lifelong nun, teacher, and soccer enthusiast. Lucas is also the 20th oldest person ever recorded and the second-oldest nun in history. She is the great-granddaughter of General David Canabarro, a leader in the Ragamuffin War.
- On January 9, 2025, General Joseph Aoun was elected Lebanon's new president, ending a two-year political vacuum. The election concluded Lebanon's political paralysis that began after Michel Aoun's term ended in October 2022. General Aoun, who has led the Lebanese Armed Forces since 2017, secured 99 out of 128 votes in the second round, overcoming divisions within the Lebanese parliament, particularly between Hezbollah and its opponents.
- Southern California, particularly Los Angeles County, is grappling with some of its most destructive wildfires in January 2025. Key fires, including the Pacific Palisades and Eaton fires, have destroyed thousands of structures, with over 179,000 residents evacuated. At least 10 deaths have been confirmed, and looting has led to arrests. Firefighting efforts are ongoing, with some fires uncontained, such as the Kenneth and Eaton fires. Power outages, traffic congestion, and school closures, including at UCLA, are further disrupting daily life. Climate change continues to intensify fire risks in the region.
- Japan has imposed new sanctions on Russia, targeting 11 individuals, 29 organizations, and 3 banks within Russia, as well as entities in other countries aiding in sanction evasion. Japan has also enforced export bans on 22 Russian organizations and 31 non-Russian groups in countries like China, Turkey, and Hong Kong. Additionally, from January 23, Japan will ban the export of 335 items including construction vehicle engines, motorized bicycles, and communication devices, aiming to hinder Russia's military and industrial capabilities.
- Mount Ibu, situated in North Maluku, Indonesia, erupted on January 11, 2025, sending ash clouds up to 4,000 meters high and ejecting glowing lava up to two kilometers from its crater. This event has prompted authorities to issue warnings and implement safety measures for the public.
- On January 13, 2025, a magnitude 6.9 earthquake struck southwestern Japan, with its epicenter in the Hyuga-Nada Sea near Miyazaki Prefecture. The Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA) issued a tsunami advisory for Miyazaki and Kochi Prefectures, warning of waves up to 1 meter. The advisory was later lifted, and no significant damage or injuries were reported.
- Nicolas Maduro, the 46th President of Venezuela, was sworn in for a third term after a disputed election. His opponent, Edmundo Gonzalez, alleged voter fraud and declared himself the winner. Despite international pressure, including U.S. sanctions, Maduro's inauguration occurred amid controversy and public protests.
- Hindenburg Research, founded by Nate Anderson in 2017, has announced its closure. Known for exposing corporate fraud and mismanagement, it impacted companies like Nikola Corp., Icahn Enterprises, and the Adani Group. Anderson cited personal **reasons** for shutting down the firm.
- Tarun Das, former Director General of CII, was awarded Singapore's Honorary Citizen Award for his pivotal role in strengthening Singapore-India relations. Notably, in 1993, he led an Indian industrialist delegation to Singapore, advancing India's "Look East" policy and fostering continuous engagement between the two nations' political leaders and businesses.
- India and Spain will celebrate 2026 as a 'dual year', focusing on culture, tourism, and advancements in artificial intelligence (AI). Announced by External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, this initiative aims to strengthen bilateral ties and promote mutual understanding between the two nations.
- The U.S. Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) updated its Entity List, removing three Indian organizations—Indian Rare Earths, IGCAR, and BARC—due to national security concerns. The removal aims to enhance energy cooperation and joint research for shared **energy security** goals. Eleven **Chinese firms** were added to the list.

On January 17, 2025, China successfully launched Pakistan's first indigenous Electro-Optical (EO-1) satellite, PRSC-EO1, from the

Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center. The satellite, designed for Earth observation using electro-optical sensors, was deployed into orbit by a Long March-2D carrier rocket at 12:07 pm Beijing Time.

In January 2025, TikTok faced a brief shutdown in the U.S. due to a law mandating ByteDance to sell the app over national security concerns. The law, passed with bipartisan support, aimed to ensure TikTok's operations were controlled by a U.S.based entity. The app was swiftly restored after President-elect Donald Trump intervened with an executive order, delaying the ban. TikTok now faces ongoing challenges in securing its long-term presence in the U.S. market.

China has completed the construction of the Tianshan Shengli Tunnel, the world's longest expressway tunnel, marking a significant advancement in infrastructure development and enhancing connectivity within the Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region.





- Donald Trump was sworn in as the 47th President of the United States on January 20, 2025, marking his return to the White House after four tumultuous years. The inauguration, held indoors at the Capitol Rotunda due to extreme cold, symbolizes one of the most extraordinary political comebacks in American history. Trump is only the second president after Grover Cleveland in 1893 to regain the presidency after losing it. At 78 years old, Trump also replaces Joe Biden as the oldest president to take the oath of office.
- President Donald Trump signed an executive order initiating the United States' withdrawal from the World Health Organization (WHO) and suspending all foreign aid for 90 days. This decision has sparked significant global concern and debate.
- President Donald Trump initiated the United States' second withdrawal from the Paris Climate Agreement, a move that has significant implications for both domestic and international climate policies. Adopted in 2015, the Paris Agreement is a global accord aimed at limiting global warming to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels, with efforts to limit the increase to 1.5°C. The agreement encourages countries to set and achieve their own emission reduction targets, known as Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).
- Nigeria was officially admitted as a partner country of the BRICS bloc, which includes Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa. This strategic move aims to bolster Nigeria's economic and diplomatic ties with leading emerging economies. The announcement was made by Brazil's Foreign Ministry, highlighting Nigeria's significant role in strengthening South-South cooperation and advocating for global governance reforms.
- Usha Vance made history by becoming the first Indian-American and Hindu Second Lady of the United States. Her husband, J.D. Vance, was sworn in as the 50th Vice President of the United States, marking a significant milestone in American politics. Usha's journey, deeply rooted in her Indian heritage and her remarkable accomplishments, has garnered widespread attention and admiration.
- The **Stargate AI Project**, announced by **US President Donald Trump** at the White House, marks a monumental step in the evolution of artificial intelligence (AI). Touted as the largest AI infrastructure initiative in history, this ambitious project has garnered support from some of the world's biggest tech and business names. With an investment of \$500 billion over the next four years, the Stargate AI Project aims to develop world-class AI infrastructure, create jobs, and boost the US economy.
- Trump administration has officially changed the name of the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf of America as part of a series of executive actions aimed at fulfilling campaign promises. This decision was announced by the Interior Department on a Friday, hours after President Donald Trump took office, marking the beginning of a new chapter for U.S. territorial names and symbols. Another prominent change was the renaming of **Denali**, Alaska's towering peak, back to its former name, **Mount McKinley**. These actions reflect the administration's focus on reaffirming the nation's historical heritage and honoring the legacy of significant figures and places.
- U.S. President Donald Trump took significant steps towards reshaping the nation's cryptocurrency regulations, fulfilling his promise to overhaul U.S. crypto policy quickly. The executive order laid out the creation of a cryptocurrency working group with a primary focus on proposing new digital asset regulations and exploring the possibility of creating a national cryptocurrency stockpile. This action marks a bold move to make the U.S. a leader in the cryptocurrency space, contrasting sharply with the regulatory stance taken by former President Joe Biden's administration, which had pursued a more restrictive approach.
- The United States has suspended all USAID funding to Bangladesh following President Donald Trump's directive for a 90-day review of foreign aid programs. The decision halts USAID activities in Bangladesh, impacting various development projects. This suspension is part of a broader review of U.S. foreign development assistance, with exceptions for military funding to allies like Israel and Egypt.
- Alexander Lukashenko won a seventh term as President of Belarus on January 26, 2025, with 86.8% of the vote, a result widely criticized as fraudulent. Opposition candidate Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya received around 3% and called the election a "farce", urging global rejection of the results.
- Chinese AI startup DeepSeek has surpassed OpenAI's ChatGPT as the most-downloaded free app in the U.S. on Apple's App Store. Founded in 2023, DeepSeek is gaining attention with its advanced AI models, especially R1, a reasoning model that competes with OpenAI's technology. This milestone highlights the growing competition in the generative AI market, which is expected to reach \$1 trillion in revenue within the next decade. However, the company faces challenges, including cybersecurity threats and regulatory scrutiny.
- India and Oman are strengthening their economic ties by expediting discussions for a Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) and amending their Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA). The amendment aligns the tax treaty with international standards on cross-border taxation, aiming to simplify procedures and enhance cooperation between the countries' tax authorities, benefiting businesses engaged in **bilateral trade**.
- During Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto's visit to India, five Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) were signed to strengthen bilateral ties. The agreements cover key areas including health cooperation, maritime safety and security, traditional medicine quality assurance, digital development, and a cultural exchange program (2025-2028), aimed at enhancing collaboration in these sectors and fostering mutual understanding.



- UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan declared 2025 as the "Year of Community" with the slogan "Hand in Hand" to promote unity and inclusion. The initiative focuses on strengthening social bonds, encouraging volunteering, and celebrating cultural diversity through various programs and events, reflecting the UAE leadership's commitment to building a cohesive and empowered community.
- On January 30, 2025, **Niger** became the first **African** country to eliminate **onchocerciasis** (river blindness) as a public health threat, joining **Colombia**, **Ecuador**, **Guatemala**, and **Mexico** in this achievement. This milestone reflects significant progress in controlling neglected tropical diseases, particularly in **sub-Saharan Africa**, and underscores global efforts to tackle parasitic diseases.

VISITS

India Visits By Foreigners

- Microsoft Chairman and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Satya Nadella made a visit to India on January 2025 as a part of the Microsoft AI (Artificial Intelligence) Tour with an aim for expansion and investment plans to make India a leader in AI. IndiaAI, an Independent Business Division (IBD) under the Digital India Corporation, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Microsoft to drive the adoption and development of artificial intelligence (AI) in India. Establish "AI Catalysts," a Center of Excellence, to promote rural AI innovation in Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities and equip 100,000 AI innovators and developers through hackathons, community building, and an AI marketplace. Microsoft announced a USD 3 billion investment in India over the next two years to enhance AI and cloud infrastructure and skilling initiatives in India.
- Singapore President Tharman Shanmugaratnam, visited India from January 14 to 18, 2025, marking his 1st bilateral state visit to India. He was accompanied by Chee Hong Tat, Minister for Transport and 2nd Minister for Finance of Singapore; and Sim Ann, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of National Development of Singapore. President of Singapore Tharman Shanmugaratnam and President of India Droupadi Murmu jointly unveiled the 60th Anniversary Commemorative logo at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi. The logo celebrates six decades of strong ties between India & Singapore. During his visit, several Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) were signed between the Odisha government and Singaporean organizations.
- Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto chief guest at India's 2025 Republic Day parade, strengthening India-Indonesia relations and supporting the Act East Policy. This visit aims to enhance strategic cooperation, defense ties, and economic engagement. The two nations share over 2,000 years of cultural and commercial ties, with Indonesia's traditions influenced by the Ramayana and Mahabharata.

RBI's Financial Stability Report, 2024

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released its **Financial Stability Report (FSR)** for December 2024, providing a comprehensive analysis of the Indian financial system's health. The FSR is published **biannually**, typically in June and December, offering insights into the stability and resilience of the financial sector.

Key Highlights from the RBI Financial Stability Report, December 2024

- 1. **Asset Quality of Banks**: The gross non-performing assets (NPAs) ratio of Indian banks has declined to a 12-year low of 2.6% as of September 2024. This improvement is attributed to recoveries, write-offs of legacy bad loans, and a reduction in the growth of bad assets.
- 2. **Projections for NPAs**: The report projects that the gross bad loan ratio may rise to 3% by March 2026 under a baseline scenario, and could reach up to 5.3% under high-risk scenarios. Despite these potential increases, the RBI assures that no bank is expected to fall below the minimum capital requirement of 9% even in adverse conditions.



- Economic Growth Forecast: The RBI anticipates a GDP growth rate of 6.6% for the fiscal year 2024-25, indicating a positive outlook for the Indian economy following a slowdown in the first half of the fiscal year.
- Liquidity Deficit: The banking system is facing a significant liquidity deficit, which is expected to widen further in the upcoming quarter. As of December 23, 2024, the liquidity deficit stood at 2.43 trillion rupees, driven by tax outflows and the central bank's foreign exchange interventions. Market participants suggest that measures such as open market bond purchases and potential cuts in the cash reserve ratio (CRR) may be considered to address this issue.
- Regulatory Compliance: The report notes a 47% decline in monetary fines imposed by the RBI from June to November 2024, totaling nearly Rs 30 crore, compared to over Rs 57 crore in the same period the previous year. This decrease reflects improved regulatory compliance across banks and financial institutions.
- 6. Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs): The balance sheets of NBFCs have strengthened, with stress tests indicating that even under high-risk scenarios, their capital requirements would remain well above the minimum needed level.

Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Report on Trend and Progress of Banking in India 2023-24

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released the "Report on Trend and Progress of Banking in India 2023-24," offering a comprehensive analysis of the banking sector's performance during the fiscal year 2023-24. This annual report provides insights into various facets of the banking industry, including asset quality, profitability, capital adequacy, and emerging challenges.

Key Highlights from RBI Report on Trend and Progress of Banking in India 2023-24

1. Asset Quality of Banks:

The gross non-performing assets (NPAs) ratio of Indian banks has fallen to a 12-year low of 2.5% as of September 2024, the lowest since 2012. This improvement is attributed to recoveries, write-offs of legacy bad loans, and more effective management of asset quality. The reduction in bad loans is reflective of better risk management and recovery efforts.

2. Projections for NPAs:

The Indian banking sector has witnessed a significant 19% increase in credit growth during 2023-24, reflecting positive economic growth and robust demand for loans. The growth in advances is particularly strong in sectors like infrastructure, housing, and personal loans. The optimistic credit outlook is also indicative of an improving economic environment in India.

4. Digital Transformation in Banking:

The Indian banking sector has been undergoing a digital revolution, with an increase in online and mobile banking transactions. The launch of Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) pilots further highlights the sector's move towards embracing cutting-edge digital financial solutions. Digital banking continues to grow rapidly, helping increase financial inclusion and improving customer experiences.

5. Strong Capital Adequacy:

The Capital-to-Risk-Weighted Assets Ratio (CRAR) of Indian banks stood at 16.8% as of September 2024, significantly higher than the regulatory minimum of 9%. This indicates that Indian banks are in a strong position to absorb any shocks, with robust capital buffers ensuring financial stability.

6. Increasing Bank Frauds:

The report highlighted an alarming increase in bank frauds, with fraud-related cases seeing a significant rise in the first half of FY25. This trend is expected to continue, raising concerns about cybersecurity and internal controls in the banking sector. The RBI is likely to take measures to mitigate these risks going forward.

Detailed Analysis of each point

1. Asset Quality Improvement:

The banking sector has made significant strides in enhancing asset quality. The GNPA ratio's decline to 2.5% in September 2024 reflects effective recovery efforts and prudent lending practices. The reduction in Net NPAs to 0.57% indicates improved asset quality and better risk management.





2. Profitability Growth:

SCBs have demonstrated consistent profitability, with a RoA of 1.4% and RoE of 14.6% in 2023-24. This sustained growth underscores the sector's resilience and operational efficiency.

3. Capital Adequacy:

The CRAR of 16.8% as of September 2024 surpasses the regulatory minimum, ensuring banks have sufficient capital buffers to absorb potential losses and support growth.

4. Credit Growth:

The 19% increase in advances highlights robust credit demand, indicating confidence in economic recovery and expansion.

5. Digital Transformation:

The rise in digital banking transactions and the initiation of CBDC pilots reflect the sector's commitment to modernization and financial inclusion.

6. Emerging Risks:

The projected increase in the GNPA ratio to 3% by March 2026 and the rise in bank fraud cases necessitate enhanced risk management and vigilance.

RBI's Guidelines on Government Debt Relief Scheme

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has issued detailed guidelines for lenders participating in the **Government Debt Relief Scheme**, aiming to provide structured relief to borrowers facing financial distress. This initiative aligns with the **RBI's ongoing efforts** to enhance financial stability and support economic recovery.

Crux of the Guidelines

The RBI's guidelines outline the framework for lenders to offer debt relief to borrowers impacted by financial challenges. The scheme is designed to facilitate the restructuring of loans, ensuring that borrowers receive the necessary support while maintaining the integrity of the financial system.

Key Components of the Scheme

Eligibility Criteria: The scheme targets borrowers who have demonstrated a consistent repayment history but are currently facing financial difficulties due to unforeseen circumstances.

Restructuring Framework: Lenders are permitted to restructure loans by extending repayment periods, reducing interest rates, or converting a portion of the debt into equity, subject to specific conditions.

Regulatory Oversight: The RBI will monitor the implementation of the scheme to ensure compliance with established guidelines and to maintain financial stability.

Historical Context

This initiative builds upon previous measures taken by the RBI to address financial stress among borrowers. Notably, in 2016, **Hindustan Construction Company (HCC)** became the first firm to receive debt relief under the RBI's Scheme for Sustainable Structuring of Stressed Assets (S4A), which allowed banks to convert a portion of the company's loans into equity or debentures.

Implications for Lenders and Borrowers

For Lenders: The guidelines provide a structured approach to managing distressed assets, enabling banks to offer relief to borrowers while safeguarding their financial interests.

For Borrowers: The scheme offers a pathway to financial recovery, allowing businesses and individuals to restructure their debts and continue operations without the immediate threat of insolvency.

RBI's 2024-25 Report on State Finances

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) recent report, "State Finances: A Study of Budgets of 2024-25," highlights significant improvements in the fiscal health of state governments post-pandemic, while also identifying areas requiring further attention.

Fiscal Consolidation Achievements

Gross Fiscal Deficit (GFD): States have successfully contained their consolidated GFD within 3% of GDP during 2022-23 and 2023-24, with a budgeted GFD of 3.2% for 2024-25.

Revenue Deficit: Maintained at a low 0.2% of GDP during 2022-23 and 2023-24.

Capital Expenditure: Increased from 2.4% of GDP in 2021-22 to 2.8% in 2023-24, with a further budgeted rise to 3.1% in 2024-25, indicating a focus on developmental spending.



Debt Levels and Liabilities

Outstanding Liabilities: Declined from 31% of GDP at end-March 2021 to 28.5% at end-March 2024, yet still above the pre-pandemic level of 25.3% at end-March 2019.

Contingent Liabilities: State guarantees have risen from 2% of GDP at end-March 2017 to 3.8% by March 2023, posing potential fiscal risks.

Subsidy Expenditures

Rising Subsidies: Significant increases in spending on subsidies, including farm loan waivers and free or subsidized services like electricity, transport, and gas cylinders, have been noted. For instance, 14 states have implemented income transfer schemes for women, totaling approximately ₹2 lakh crore, or about 0.6% of GDP.

Power Sector Concerns

Discom Losses: Power distribution companies have accumulated losses amounting to ₹6.5 lakh crore by 2022-23, equivalent to around 2.4% of GDP, despite multiple reform attempts.

Recommendations for Fiscal Sustainability

Debt Consolidation: The RBI emphasizes the need for a credible roadmap for debt consolidation, particularly for states with elevated debt levels, recommending clear, transparent, and time-bound strategies aligned with macroeconomic objectives.

Expenditure Efficiency: States are urged to enhance expenditure efficiency through outcome-based budgeting and to rationalize subsidies to prevent the crowding out of productive expenditures.

Fiscal Framework Reforms: Adoption of risk-based fiscal frameworks with provisions for counter-cyclical policies, along with strengthening State Finance Commissions, is advised to ensure fiscal discipline and adequate fund transfers to local bodies.

ECONOMY & BUSINESS

GDP & GROWTH RATE as per October 2024

- India's economy is projected to grow at **6.5-6.8%** in FY2025, driven by **domestic consumption**, **infrastructure development**, and **digitisation**, with growth rising to **6.7-7.3%** in FY2026. However, challenges like **geopolitical tensions**, **trade disputes**, and **global liquidity** may affect the long-term outlook. India's **resilience** in **services**, **manufacturing exports**, and **stable capital markets** can offset global uncertainties and support growth.
- India's GST collection growth slowed to 7.3% YoY in December 2024, with gross revenue at ₹1.77 lakh crore, compared to ₹1.65 lakh crore in December 2023. This marks the slowest growth in three months, reflecting a slight dip in consumer spending post-holidays. Despite this, GST revenues remained above ₹1.7 lakh crore for 10 consecutive months, with the December quarter averaging ₹1.82 lakh crore (up 8.3% YoY). Domestic transactions grew by 8.4% to ₹1.32 lakh crore, while revenue from imports rose by 3.9%. Net GST collections grew 3.3% YoY, influenced by higher refunds.
- India's coffee exports reached a record \$1.14 billion between April and November FY24, marking a 29% growth from the previous year. This surge is driven by rising global demand for Robusta coffee and challenges in major coffee producers like Brazil and Vietnam. India's premium coffee, especially from Karnataka, is gaining traction in markets like Italy, Russia, UAE, Germany, and Turkey. Total exports for FY24 are projected to reach \$1.28 billion, a 12.22% increase.



- India achieved a 36% reduction in GDP emission intensity from 2005 to 2020, aligning with its climate action targets under the Paris Agreement. In 2020, total greenhouse gas emissions were 2,959 million tonnes (excluding LULUCF), showing a 7.93% decrease from 2019. This progress supports India's goal to meet its Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) target of a 45% emissions reduction by 2030.
- Nomura revised its forecast for India's fiscal year 2025 GDP growth to 6.7%, down from 6.9%, following a 6.7% growth in the
 April-June quarter, below expectations. Key factors influencing the downgrade include reduced government spending during
 elections, weak consumer demand due to high interest rates and moderating wage growth, and a slowdown in industrial activity,
 reflected in declining sales of passenger and commercial vehicles.
- The Government of India plans to update the base year for calculating GDP from 2011-12 to 2022-23 to better reflect the current economic landscape. This is the first revision in over a decade. A 26-member Advisory Committee on National Accounts Statistics (ACNAS), chaired by Biswanath Goldar, has been formed to identify new data sources and refine the methodology for compiling National Accounts Statistics.
- India's GDP is projected to grow by 6.4% in 2024-25, down from 8.2% in 2023-24. Key sectors showing strong growth include Agriculture (3.8%), Construction (8.6%), and Financial, Real Estate, and Professional Services (7.3%). Private Final Consumption Expenditure is expected to rise by 7.3%, reflecting stronger consumer spending, while Government Final Consumption Expenditure is forecasted at 4.1%, signaling increased government spending.
- India's GDP growth forecast for FY25 has been revised down to 9.7%, slightly below the earlier estimate of 10.5%. Despite this, the government's fiscal deficit target of 4.9% of GDP remains on track. To offset the lower growth, capital expenditure will be reduced by ₹1–1.5 trillion, ensuring fiscal discipline and keeping the deficit within the target of ₹16.13 trillion.
- SBI has revised its GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 6.3%, slightly lower than the NSO's projection of 6.4%. The adjustment reflects concerns over slowdown in lending and manufacturing, along with a high base effect. Key factors include agriculture growth of 3.8%, a slowdown in industry (6.2%) and services (7.2%), and a rise in private consumption (7.3%). Investment growth is expected at 6.4%, lower than the previous year. Despite these challenges, per capita nominal GDP is set to rise by ₹35,000.
- India's economy is projected to grow by **6.6% to 6.8%** in **FY2025-26**, reflecting its resilience and role in regional economic growth. Bank of Baroda forecasts **6.8%** growth, driven by strong indicators like increased air passenger traffic, higher PMI, GST collections, and enhanced rabi crop sowing, supporting agricultural growth and overall economic expansion.
- India's **GDP** growth is projected to rise to **6.7%** in FY25, after moderating to **6.4%** in the current fiscal year, down from **8.2%** previously. Food inflation declined, with CPI inflation cooling to **5.2%** in December. This trend, alongside stable non-food inflation at **3.1%**, may pave the way for a potential rate cut by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).
- India is projected to become the world's **fourth-largest economy** by 2026, surpassing **Japan**, driven by **6.8% GDP growth** in FY2024-25 and **7.7% growth** in FY2025-26, according to **PHDCCI**. Strategic policies aim to boost economic **resilience** and **sustainable development**.
- India is projected to remain the fastest-growing major economy, with a 6.7% growth rate for fiscal years 2025-26 and 2026-27, according to the World Bank. Key drivers include the expanding services sector, strengthening manufacturing, and government initiatives to improve logistics infrastructure and tax reforms.
- FICCI revised India's economic forecast, projecting a 6.4% GDP growth and 4.8% CPI-based inflation for fiscal year 2024-25, reflecting a cautious outlook due to global uncertainties and domestic challenges.
- The IMF has revised India's FY25 economic growth forecast to 6.5%, down from earlier projections, citing global economic uncertainties, domestic inflation, and investment slowdown. Despite this, the IMF maintained a stable outlook for FY26. The revision reflects challenges impacting India's post-pandemic recovery, including geopolitical risks and inflation.
- The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) projects India's GDP growth at 7% for FY 2025-26, driven by rising private investments and employment generation. A CII survey reveals that 75% of respondents view the economic climate as favorable for investments, with 70% of firms planning to invest in FY'26.
- Deloitte India has revised its GDP growth projection for the fiscal year 2024-25 to a range of 6.5% to 6.8%, citing global trade
 uncertainties and domestic challenges. The firm emphasizes the need for cautious optimism as the economy navigates these
 complexities.

ECONOMY NEWS

- India's **net direct tax collection** reached ₹16.90 lakh **crore** by **January 12, 2025**, a **15.88% increase** year-on-year. Key highlights include ₹8.74 lakh **crore** from **personal income tax**, ₹7.68 lakh **crore** from **corporate tax**, and ₹44,538 **crore** from **Securities Transaction Tax (STT)**, reflecting robust economic activity and market trading.
- India's retail inflation dropped to 5.22% in December 2024, from 5.48% in November, mainly due to slower food price increases, especially in vegetables, cereals, and pulses. Food inflation fell to 8.39%, while core inflation decreased to 3.5%. Rural areas saw inflation at 5.76%, compared to 4.58% in urban areas.



- India's wholesale price inflation rose to 2.37% in December 2024, up from 1.89% in November. Key drivers included manufactured products (+2.14%), non-food articles (+2.46%), and fuel and power (improved deflation of -3.79%). - The global ratings agency Moody's has downgraded India's economic growth forecast for the fiscal year 2024-2025 to 7%, down from the 8.2% growth recorded in the previous fiscal year.

BUSINESS NEWS

- Reliance Industries, led by Mukesh Ambani, acquired Karkinos Healthcare for ₹375 crore through Reliance Strategic Business Ventures Ltd (RSBVL). The deal involves 10 million equity shares and 36.5 million optionally convertible debentures. Karkinos, founded in 2020, specializes in early cancer detection and management, with partnerships across 60 hospitals and plans for a 150-bed cancer hospital in Imphal, Manipur.
- The **Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT)** has partnered with **boAt**, an Indian audio and wearables brand, to support DPIIT-recognized startups in the D2C and manufacturing sectors. The collaboration aims to provide mentorship, resources, and guidance, helping startups scale locally and globally. Key initiatives include tailored mentorship programs covering stages like prototype development, with expert support from both boAt's industry expertise and government
- BharatPe, India's leading fintech company, plans to sell up to 25% of its 49% stake in Unity Small Finance Bank to raise around \$800 million (Rs 6,500 crore). This move aims to meet RBI's regulatory requirements. BharatPe has appointed Rothschild & Co to manage the stake sale.
- Suzuki Motor Corporation will acquire a 26% stake in NDDB Mirda Ltd, a bio-gas venture by the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB), with an initial investment of ₹8.84 crore. The deal supports Suzuki's use of Compressed Bio-Gas (CBG) for enhancing vehicle performance and sustainability. Suzuki has the option to increase its stake to 49% over time.
- Bajaj Broking has partnered with Tamilnad Mercantile Bank (TMB) to offer a 3-in-1 account that integrates banking, broking, and investment services. TMB customers can now trade online, access a unified platform, and benefit from easy fund transfers, reduced paperwork, and advanced trading features supported by research insights for informed decisions.
- Ahead of the Maha Kumbh Mela (January 13 February 26, 2025) in Prayagraj, PhonePe has partnered with ICICI Lombard to offer specialized insurance for attendees. Coverage options include ₹59 for train/bus travelers and ₹99 for domestic flight travelers. The insurance provides hospitalization up to ₹50,000, personal accident cover up to ₹1 lakh, OPD treatment, trip cancellation up to ₹5,000, and more, including baggage loss and missed flight reimbursements.
- Swiggy launched 'Snacc' on January 7, 2025, in select Bengaluru areas, offering snacks, beverages, and meals with a 15-minute delivery promise. The app features a menu with items like chocolate cookies, Indian breakfast, coffee, eggs, and sandwiches. Collaborating with brands like Blue Tokai and The Whole Truth, Snacc operates independently from Swiggy's Bolt. In a competitive quick commerce market, Zomato (with Blinkit's Bistro), Zepto, and Magicpin (with magicNOW) have also introduced rapid food delivery services.
- India aims for \$100 billion in combined exports from the Food & Beverage (F&B), agriculture, and marine sectors over the next five years, with a targeted 14-15% annual growth. This goal was highlighted by Piyush Goyal at Indusfood 2025. Last year, India achieved \$50 billion in exports, with contributions from APEDA and MPEDA.
- India's factory output surged by 5.2% in November 2024, the highest in six months, driven by a favorable base effect and increased demand during the festive season. The cumulative growth for April-November 2024 stands at 4.1%, down from 6.5% in the same period last year, reflecting a slowdown. Key contributors include manufacturing, capital goods, and consumer durables.
- On January 10, 2025, the Indian rupee hit an all-time low of ₹86 against the US dollar, driven by factors such as the strengthening US dollar, FII outflows (₹7,170.87 crore on January 9), and rising crude oil prices. These factors contributed to a significant depreciation of the rupee, marking economic challenges.
- In December 2024, e-way bills reached 8.8 crore, marking a 9.3% increase from the previous month and a 7.4% rise from December 2023. This reflects a strong economic recovery, driven by increased transportation and trade movements. The surge aligns with seasonal trends, highlighting higher consumption during the festive season.
- NPCI International Payments Ltd (NIPL) has partnered with UAE-based fintech firm Magnati to enable Unified Payments Interface (UPI) transactions for Indian travelers in the UAE. This collaboration aims to integrate UPI into the UAE's payment ecosystem, allowing Indian visitors to make seamless payments using their preferred method.



- Shriram Housing Finance has rebranded as Truhome Finance following its acquisition by Warburg Pincus and QIA, Qatar's sovereign wealth fund. The rebranding reflects the company's focus on enhancing accessibility to affordable home loans across diverse socio-economic segments.
- The government has launched Entity Locker, a secure, cloud-based digital platform developed by the National eGovernance Division (NeGD) under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY). Building on the success of DigiLocker, Entity Locker is designed to streamline the management, verification, and secure sharing of documents for a wide range of entities, including corporations, MSMEs, trusts, startups, and societies. By leveraging advanced technology, the platform aims to enhance operational efficiency and establish a more secure and efficient digital governance system.
- In a decisive move to address liquidity constraints in the Indian banking system, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has conducted a series of Variable Rate Repo (VRR) auctions, infusing a substantial ₹76,000 crore into the financial ecosystem. This initiative aims to alleviate the liquidity deficit and stabilize short-term interest rates, particularly the call money rates, which had been trading above the RBI's repo rate of 6.5%.
- Bharti Airtel and Bajaj Finance have formed a partnership to create one of India's largest digital platforms for financial services, leveraging Airtel's customer base and distribution network with Bajaj Finance's diverse product offerings. The collaboration aims to enhance financial inclusion through a seamless user experience on the Airtel Thanks App, offering products like gold loans and business loans. This strategic move builds on India's growing digital infrastructure, with a focus on underserved regions and accessible financial solutions.
- Tata AIG General Insurance Company has launched CyberEdge, a comprehensive cyber insurance solution designed to protect
 Indian businesses from escalating cyber risks. This initiative aligns with the company's strategic goal to capture 25% of the cyber
 insurance market within the next five years.
- Tata AIA Life Insurance has unveiled 'Shubh Muhurat,' a life insurance solution designed to assist families in financially preparing
 for their children's weddings. This initiative aims to address the escalating costs associated with weddings in India, a sector valued
 at over ₹10.7 lakh crore in 2024.
- Skydo Technologies, a Bengaluru-based fintech firm, has received in-principle authorization from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to function as a Payment Aggregator-Cross Border (PA-CB) entity. This approval underscores Skydo's commitment to providing compliant, seamless, and cost-effective cross-border payment solutions for Indian exporters.
- Shri Vikram Dev Dutt, Secretary of the Ministry of Coal, virtually inaugurated digital classrooms in government schools across
 Jharkhand. These classrooms are part of 'Digi Vidya,' a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative by Coal India Limited (CIL)
 subsidiaries. The event was attended by Shri PM Prasad, Chairman of CIL, Smt. Rupinder Brar, Additional Secretary of the
 Ministry of Coal, and other senior officials.
- The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) issued notices to Ola and Uber over claims of differential pricing based on mobile operating systems, with iPhone users allegedly charged higher fares than Android users. Union Minister Pralhad Joshi directed the CCPA to investigate, ensuring consumer rights and fair trade practices. In response, both companies denied the allegations, stating they do not differentiate pricing based on the mobile device used and are willing to cooperate with the CCPA.
- In 2024, **UPI** accounted for **83**% of India's **digital transactions**, up from 34% in 2019, highlighting its rapid adoption. The total transaction volume exceeded **208.5 billion**, while traditional payment methods like **NEFT**, **RTGS**, and **IMPS** saw a decline from **66**% in 2019 to **17**% by 2024.
- The Government of India has approved a ₹500 crore capital infusion into the Industrial Finance Corporation of India (IFCI) for 2024-25. This move, aimed at strengthening IFCI's financial health, comes ahead of its restructuring and consolidation. The infusion includes ₹499.99 crore for share capital subscription and efficient use of savings to avoid extra cash outflow.
- CheQ, an Indian fintech company, has launched Wisor, India's first Al-driven credit card expert. Wisor offers personalized credit assistance with an intuitive Q&A interface, comprehensive spend analysis across cards and merchants, and optimized rewards management. This tool helps users maximize credit card rewards and manage spending efficiently with personalized insights.
- The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) is facing a slowdown, with recovery rates for banks dropping from 40% in 2022-23 to 28% in 2023-24. This decline, due to prolonged resolution timelines and the erosion of non-performing assets (NPAs), has led banks to explore alternative recovery methods. The number of cases admitted to the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) also decreased, from 501 to 417 cases.
- India's foreign exchange reserves declined to \$625.87 billion as of January 10, 2025, from \$634.59 billion the previous week. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has been intervening in the forex market to stabilize the rupee, which has depreciated against the U.S. dollar, leading to a depletion of reserves amidst global economic challenges.
- Jio has launched JioSoundPay, a free feature on the JioBharat phone to simplify UPI payments for small businesses in India. This
 feature provides instant, multilingual audio confirmations for every transaction, helping small merchants like kirana stores,
 vegetable vendors, and roadside eateries handle payments seamlessly, reflecting Jio's commitment to simplifying digital tools
 for everyday users.



- CRED has launched the beta version of the e₹ wallet, making it the first fintech platform to adopt India's central bank digital currency (CBDC), the e-rupee. This initiative, in collaboration with the RBI and YES Bank, enables users to store and transact using digital currency, marking a significant step in India's digital payments transformation.
- The Indian government has launched the **Mutual Credit Guarantee Scheme (MCGS-MSME)** with a ₹100 crore corpus to boost the **MSME manufacturing sector**. The initiative aims to enhance **credit availability** for MSMEs, enabling them to acquire essential equipment and machinery without requiring **collateral**.
- Tata Steel has become the first Indian company to develop hydrogen-compliant pipes for transporting hydrogen, marking a significant step in India's clean energy transition. The API X65 pipes, produced at Tata Steel's Khopoli plant and made from steel at its Kalinganagar facility, align with India's National Hydrogen Mission and global sustainability goals. This innovation highlights Tata Steel's commitment to clean energy and infrastructure development.
- The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) is enforcing new compliance measures for UPI transactions starting February 1, 2025. UPI transaction IDs will now be strictly alphanumeric, with special characters like @, #, \$, % banned to enhance security, ensure uniformity, and improve transaction efficiency in India's growing digital payments ecosystem.
- The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has introduced a new directive to protect senior citizens
 from sharp increases in health insurance premiums. Insurers are now restricted from raising premiums for individuals aged 60
 and above by more than 10% per year without prior approval. This initiative aims to ensure affordable and accessible health
 insurance for the elderly.

Government Forms Committee to Update WPI Base Year

On January 2, 2025, the Government of India established an 18-member committee to revise the base year of the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) from 2011-12 to 2022-23. This initiative aims to enhance the accuracy of factory-gate inflation measures, reflecting structural changes in the economy over the past decade.

Committee Leadership and Composition

The committee is chaired by Professor Ramesh Chand, a member of NITI Aayog. It includes experts from various sectors, such as economics, finance, and statistics, ensuring a comprehensive approach to the revision process.

Terms of Reference

The committee has been tasked with:

- 1. Commodity Selection: Identifying commodities for inclusion in the WPI and Producer Price Index (PPI) for the 2022-23 base year, considering structural economic changes.
- 2. Price Collection System Review: Evaluating and recommending improvements to the existing price collection methodology.

- 3. **Computational Methodology**: Proposing computational methods for WPI and PPI.
- 4. **PPI Compilation Methodology**: Assessing and suggesting enhancements to the PPI compilation methodology approved by the Technical Advisory Committee on Statistics of Prices & Cost of Living.
- 5. Transition Roadmap: Developing a plan for transitioning from WPI to PPI.
- 6. Reliability Enhancements: Recommending measures to improve the reliability of WPI and PPI data.

The committee is expected to submit its final report within 18 months.

Context and Implications

The last revision of the WPI occurred in 2015, updating the base year from 2004-05 to 2011-12. The upcoming revision to 2022-23 aims to incorporate significant economic developments, including the expansion of the service sector, which constitutes over half of India's economic output. Transitioning to a Producer Price Index (PPI) will provide a more comprehensive measure of inflation at the producer level, encompassing both goods and services.

RBI Constitutes New Advisory Committee for Bank Licensing

On January 20, 2025, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) established a new **Standing External Advisory Committee (SEAC)** to evaluate applications for **Universal Banks and Small Finance Banks (SFBs).** This committee is chaired by former **RBI Deputy Governor M. K. Jain** and comprises five members.

Committee Composition and Tenure

The SEAC includes:

- M. K. Jain: Chairperson and former Deputy Governor, RBI.
- Revathy Iyer: Director, Central Board, RBI.
- Parvathy V. Sundaram: Former Executive Director, RBI.
- **Hemant G. Contractor**: Former Managing Director of State Bank of India and former Chairman of the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority.
- N. S. Kannan: Former Managing Director and CEO of ICICI Prudential Life Insurance.

The committee's tenure is set for three years, with secretarial support provided by the RBI's Department of Regulation.

Background and Evolution

This initiative follows the **precedent set in March 2021**, when the RBI formed a similar committee led by former **Deputy Governor Shyamala Gopinath**. The SEAC's role is to assess applications for Universal Banks and SFBs, ensuring applicants meet the necessary criteria. Notably, applications from existing SFBs seeking Universal Bank licenses may bypass this vetting process, as their credentials were previously evaluated during their initial licensing.

Current Applications Under Review

The RBI is currently reviewing applications from:

- Annapurna Finance: Seeking a Universal Bank license.
- AU Small Finance Bank (AU SFB): Applied for a Universal Bank license.
- Fino Payments Bank: Applied for an SFB license.
- VFS Capital: Applied for an SFB license.

Waqf Amendment Bill Cleared by Joint Parliamentary Committee: Key Changes and Implications

The Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) approved the Waqf Amendment Bill, a significant legislative reform aimed at restructuring the management of Muslim charitable properties in India. The bill proposes 44 amendments to the existing framework, with the JPC approving 14 key alterations. This article delves into the specifics of the bill, its proposed changes, and the political dynamics that shaped its approval.

What is Waqf Amendment Bill?

The Waqf Amendment Bill seeks to overhaul the administration of Waqf properties across the country by introducing 44 changes to the current system. These changes were drafted and tabled in the Lok Sabha in August 2024. The bill aims to bring about greater inclusivity and transparency in the functioning of Waqf boards and the

Central Waqf Council.

- **Key Objective**: Improve the governance of Waqf properties to benefit marginalized communities, including the Pasmanda Muslims.
- Amendments Proposed: A total of 66 amendments were suggested—23 by MPs from the ruling BJP and 44 by opposition members.

Political Dynamics of the Committee

The Joint Parliamentary Committee tasked with examining the bill comprises 31 members from both houses of

Parliament:

- Ruling Party Representation: 16 MPs from the BJP and its National Democratic Alliance (NDA) allies.
- Opposition Representation: 13 MPs, including one from the YSR Congress Party and one nominated member.



Waqf Board Amendment Bill 2024-Voting on Amendments

During the committee's deliberations:

- The 14 amendments approved were proposed by the ruling BJP and NDA members.
- The 44 amendments proposed by the opposition were rejected, with voting largely along party lines (16 in favor of the BJP's stance vs. 10 opposing).

Details of the Approved Amendments

- Inclusion of Non-Muslim Members: The composition of state Wagf boards will now allow for non-Muslim CEOs and at least two non-Muslim members.
- Changes in the Central Waqf Council: The council will now include a union minister, three Members of Parliament, two ex-judges, four individuals of 'national repute,' and senior government officials. None of these members are required to belong to the Islamic faith.
- Property Ownership Disputes: Section 3C(2) of the bill empowers the state government, through the jurisdictional Collector, to determine whether a property claimed as Waqf is actually government land. This change shifts the authority from Waqf Tribunals to Collectors.

Rejected Opposition Amendments

The opposition's proposed changes, aimed at strengthening the autonomy of Waqf boards and safeguarding against government overreach, were voted down. Key suggestions included:

- Increasing representation from minority communities.
- Retaining the Waqf Tribunal's authority in property disputes.
- Ensuring transparency in the appointment of board members.

Opposition members alleged bias in the voting process, highlighting the dominance of the ruling party in the JPC.

Timeline and Next Steps

- Initial Deadline: The committee was originally required to submit its report by November 29, 2024.
- Extension: The deadline was extended to February 13, 2025, coinciding with the final day of the Budget Session.
- Final Voting: The approved amendments will be confirmed through voting on January 29, 2025.
- Report Submission: The final report is expected by January 31, 2025.

Impact of the Proposed Changes

On Waqf Property Management

The bill introduces significant changes to the way Waqf properties are governed:

- Greater government oversight through the inclusion of non-Muslim members.
- A shift in dispute resolution authority from Waqf Tribunals to state-appointed Collectors.

On Minority Representation

While the amendments aim to enhance inclusivity, critics argue that the inclusion of non-Muslim members could dilute the communityspecific focus of Waqf boards.

On Marginalized Communities

The government asserts that the bill will benefit poor and Pasmanda Muslims by improving the efficiency and transparency of Waqf property administration.

Hanley Passport Index 2025

India's ranking in the Henley Passport Index for 2025 has dropped to 85th, five points lower than its 80th position in 2024. The index, based on data from the International Air Transport Authority (IATA), is a globally recognized tool for assessing passport mobility. Singapore retains its top spot for the second consecutive year, while Japan ranks second after holding the top position from 2018-2023.

India Ranked Second for Cyberattacks in 2024

In 2024, India became the second most targeted nation globally for cyberattacks, with 95 entities falling victim to data theft, according to CloudSEK's ThreatLandscape Report 2024. The United States topped the list with 140 attacks, while Israel ranked third with 57 attacks.

Key Findings from the Report

Sector-Specific Impact: The finance and banking sectors were the most affected, with 20 victims. Other impacted sectors included government (13 victims), telecommunications (12), healthcare and pharma (10), and education (9).





- Major Data Breaches: Significant breaches included the leak of 850 million records of Indian citizen data from Hi-Tek Group, customer data from Star Health and Allied Insurance, and 2TB of data from Telecommunications Consultants India.
- Ransomware Incidents: The report identified 108 ransomware incidents in India, with Lockbit being the most active group, responsible for over 20 incidents. Other notable groups included Killsec and Ransomhub.

Historical Context

India has faced significant cyber threats in the past. In 2018, it ranked second globally for data breaches, with over 690 million internet subscribers and a growing number of breaches in both private and public sectors.

Implications

The surge in cyberattacks underscores the critical need for robust cybersecurity measures across all sectors in India. The rapid digitization of services has exposed vulnerabilities, making it imperative to enhance security protocols to protect sensitive data and maintain public trust.

Edelman Trust Barometer 2025 Rankings

The Edelman Trust Barometer 2025, an annual survey by the global communications firm Edelman, revealed key insights into public trust levels in government, businesses, media, and NGOs. This year, India has slipped one rank to the third spot globally in terms of overall trust, despite its score remaining unchanged. The study, released ahead of the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting, highlighted significant disparities in trust levels across income groups and nations.

Key Highlights of the Edelman Trust Barometer 2025

India's Position in Trust Rankings

India ranked third globally in terms of trust in institutions (government, businesses, media, and NGOs). The top three positions were as follows:

- 1. China
- 2. Indonesia
- 3 India
 - India lost its second position to Indonesia, which achieved an increased score despite India's score remaining stable.
 - India ranks 13th in trust for companies headquartered in Indian origin, with Canada, Japan, and Germany topping this specific category.

Trust Gap Between Income Groups in India

- However, the low-income group trusts Indian institutions less, placing India in the 3rd position globally, following China and Indonesia.

India submitted its 4th Biennial Update Report (BUR-4) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) on 30th December, 2024. This report builds upon the Third National Communication (TNC) and provides a comprehensive update on India's National Greenhouse Gas (GHG) inventory for the year 2020. It also includes critical information on national circumstances, mitigation actions, and the associated finance, technology, and capacity-building needs.

Union Minister for Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, Shri Bhupender Yadav, highlighted India's leadership in sustainablea growth, emphasizing Prime Minister Narendra Modi's commitment to balancing economic progress with meaningful climate action.

Key Highlights of BUR-4 Report

- 1. GHG Inventory for 2020
- Total GHG emissions in 2020,
- Without LULUCF (Land Use, Land-Use Change, and Forestry): 2,959 million tonnes of CO₂ equivalent (CO₂e).

- Reduction In Emissions: A 7.93% decrease in total GHG emissions compared to 2019.

Despite contributing minimally to historical and current global emissions, India remains proactive in combating climate change, aligning with the principles of equity and Common but Differentiated Responsibilities and Respective Capabilities (CBDR-RC), as stated in the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement.

Decline in Student Enrolment: UDISE+ Report 2023-24

The Ministry of Education's Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) report for 2023-24 reveals a significant decline in student enrolment, marking a notable shift from the stable figures observed in previous years.

What is UDSIE+?

UDISE+ (Unified District Information System for Education Plus) is an online data collection system developed by the Department of School Education & Literacy in 2018-19. It was introduced to replace the manual paper-based data collection process, with improvements in data capture, mapping, and verification.

Key Findings

Overall Enrolment Decline

The total student enrolment decreased to 24.8 crore in 2023-24, a drop of over one crore compared to the previous years. This marks a 6% decline from the 26.02 crore recorded in 2018-19.

Gender-wise Enrolment Trends

Boys: Enrolment fell from 13.53 crore in 2018-19 to 12.87 crore in 2023-24, a 4.87% decline.

Girls: Enrolment decreased from 12.49 crore in 2018-19 to 11.93 crore in 2023-24, a 4.48% decline.

Regional Variations

Bihar: Enrolment dropped from over 2.49 crore in 2018-19 to over 2.13 crore in 2023-24, a decrease of over 35.65 lakh students.

Uttar Pradesh: Enrolment fell from 4.44 crore in 2018-19 to 4.16 crore in 2023-24, a reduction of 28.26 lakh.

Maharashtra: Enrolment decreased from over 2.32 crore in 2018-19 to 2.13 crore in 2023-24, a decline of 18.55 lakh students.

School Infrastructure:

- Over 90% of schools have basic amenities like electricity and gender-specific toilets.
- 57.2% of schools have functional computers.
- 53.9% of schools have internet access.
- 52.3% of schools are equipped with ramps.



Implications

The substantial drop in enrolment raises concerns about the effectiveness of current educational policies and the need for targeted interventions. The data collected through UDISE+ will be crucial in informing future strategies aimed at improving student enrolment and retention rates across various states and demographics.

DEFENCE

- Vitul Kumar, a 1993-batch IPS officer from the Uttar Pradesh cadre, has been appointed as the officiating Director General (DG) of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) following the retirement of Anish Dayal Singh on December 31, 2024. Kumar, currently serving as Special Director General, will lead the CRPF during a crucial period, especially with challenges in Chhattisgarh and Manipur, ensuring continuity in leadership until a permanent successor is named.
- The **Abdali Missile** (Hatf 2) is a **short-range**, **road-mobile** ballistic missile developed by **Pakistan Space Research Commission** (SUPARCO). It has a **range** of **180-200 km**, a **payload** of high explosives or submunitions, and uses an **inertial guidance system**. The missile is transported on a **Transporter-Erector-Launcher** (TEL) vehicle, which elevates and launches the missile. Its **destructive power** is moderate, suitable for targeting **military bases**, **airfields**, and **critical infrastructure**.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi commissioned three significant naval assets—INS Surat, INS Nilgiri, and INS Vagsheer—at the Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL) in Mumbai. This event underscores India's commitment to enhancing its maritime capabilities and achieving self-reliance in defense production.
- DRDO unveiled the HIMKAVACH multi-layer clothing system, designed to improve military personnel's efficiency in extreme cold, tested between +20°C to -60°C. It offers insulation, breathability, and moisture protection, with outer layers repelling water and wind, and inner layers trapping heat.
- India successfully conducted field trials of the Nag Mk 2 Anti-Tank Guided Missile (ATGM) at Pokhran Field Firing Range,
 Rajasthan. Developed by DRDO, the missile is part of India's Integrated Missile Development Program and enhances the Indian
 Army's anti-tank warfare capabilities. The Nag Mk 2 features infrared and fire-and-forget technology, making it a precise and
 versatile weapon system.
- The Defence Research & Development Laboratory (DRDL), a Hyderabad-based facility under the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), has made significant strides in developing next-generation hypersonic technology. This advanced technology revolves around the Supersonic Combustion Ramjet (Scramjet), a revolutionary propulsion system designed for hypersonic missiles. Recently, DRDL achieved a historic milestone by successfully conducting a ground test of an Active Cooled Scramjet Combustor for 120 seconds, marking a first for India. This accomplishment brings India closer to operationalizing hypersonic missiles capable of unprecedented speed and agility.
- India became an Observer State in the Eurodrone programme, led by Airbus Defence and Space under the Organisation for Joint
 Armament Cooperation (OCCAR). The programme, involving Germany, France, Italy, and Spain, focuses on developing a Medium
 Altitude Long Endurance Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (MALE RPAS) for ISTAR, maritime surveillance, and more. The
 Eurodrone is expected to enter service by 2030, enhancing India's defence collaboration with European nations.

- India and the U.S. will collaborate on the **co-production** of **sonobuoys** to enhance the **Indian Navy's** submarine detection capabilities. The **final assembly** of U.S.-specification sonobuoys will take place in India, with production set to begin by **2027**. The partnership involves **Ultra Maritime** and **Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL)**, boosting India's **undersea warfare** capabilities.

ARMY, NAVY & AIR FORCE NEWS

- The Indian Army unveiled a statue of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj at Pangong Tso in Ladakh on December 26, 2024, symbolizing India's strategic and cultural assertion near the India-China border. Installed by the Fire and Fury Corps at 14,300 feet, the statue honors Shivaji's legacy of valor and foresight, while reinforcing India's position along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). This move, part of a broader infrastructure push, aims to enhance mobility, surveillance, and defensive readiness but has sparked debates over cultural relevance, consultation, and ecological concerns.
- Raksha Mantri Rajnath Singh chaired a meeting with Ministry of Defence (MoD) Secretaries, designating 2025 as the 'Year of Reforms'. This initiative aims to transform India's Armed Forces into a technologically advanced, combat-ready force for integrated multi-domain operations. The focus will be on modernizing defence infrastructure, fostering efficiency, innovation, and collaboration across stakeholders.
- On January 1, 2025, Air Marshal Jeetendra Mishra took command of the Indian Air Force's Western Air Command, succeeding
 Air Marshal Pankaj Mohan Sinha. Commissioned in 1986 as a fighter pilot, Mishra has over 3,000 flying hours and holds degrees
 from prestigious institutions like the National Defence Academy and Royal College of Defence Studies. His career includes key
 roles such as Commanding Officer, Chief Test Pilot, and Deputy Chief of Integrated Defence Staff.
- India and the U.S. have partnered to co-produce sonobuoys for the Indian Navy to enhance undersea domain awareness (UDA).
 The collaboration between Ultra Marine (UM) and Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL) aims to manufacture sonobuoys to U.S. Navy standards under the 'Make in India' initiative. These sonobuoys will improve submarine detection in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), strengthening maritime security and interoperability with allied nations like Australia and Japan.
- Indian Navy's second Multi-Purpose Vessel (MPV), 'Utkarsh', was launched at L&T Shipyard, Kattupalli, Chennai.
- The event, attended by Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh, marks a significant step in India's indigenous shipbuilding and self-reliance in defense manufacturing. The vessel is designed for a multi-dimensional role, reflecting its name, meaning "Superior in Conduct."
- The Indian Armed Forces are conducting Exercise Devil Strike from January 16 to 19, 2025, under the leadership of the Indian
 Army. The exercise aims to boost combat readiness by simulating high-intensity combat operations, featuring advanced
 strategies and innovative combat techniques. It will test synchronization between various military branches, ensuring a
 coordinated response to external threats and strengthening national security.
- Indian Navy celebrated the 'Year of Naval Civilians' at the Dr DS Kothari Auditorium, New Delhi. The event, attended by Raksha Mantri, honored the crucial contributions of Naval Civilians in supporting the Navy's operations. It showcased their dedication, innovation, and service through exhibitions, performances, and awards.



Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh flagged off 'SANJAY – The Battlefield Surveillance System (BSS)' from the South Block, New Delhi. This indigenously developed system marks a major milestone in India's defense technology, strengthening the surveillance capabilities of the Indian Army. SANJAY is designed to enhance battlefield transparency, improve situational awareness, and optimize intelligence collection, thus transforming the battlefield in the era of modern warfare.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

SATELLITES LAUNCHES

- India's space journey takes a giant leap as ISRO successfully launched the SpaDeX mission to demonstrate space docking capabilities, marking a key milestone in space exploration. Launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC SHAR) on December 30, 2024, the PSLV-C60 rocket carried two small spacecraft, SDX01 (Chaser) and SDX02 (Target), to low-Earth orbit. This mission sets the stage for autonomous docking and undocking technologies, positioning ISRO as the fourth global player in this field after Russia, the US, and China.
- Blue Origin is set to launch its New Glenn rocket on January 10, 2025, from Cape Canaveral, marking a key milestone in space exploration. The rocket, standing at 320 feet tall, can carry up to 45 metric tons to low Earth orbit (LEO). Powered by seven BE-4 engines, the mission will deploy a Blue Ring payload tug and a hoisting platform. Key objectives include design validation, payload deployment, and earning NSSL certification. Notably, the rocket's reusable first stage will land on the marine vessel "Jacklyn", promoting sustainability.
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully docked two satellites in space, marking India as the fourth country to achieve this feat after the United States, Russia, and China. The docking process, part of the SpaDeX (Space Docking Exercise) mission, demonstrates ISRO's capability to conduct autonomous satellite docking. This milestone is critical for future missions like Chandrayaan-4 and the planned Bharatiya Antariksh Station.
- ISRO achieved a major milestone in space docking with the SpaDeX mission, testing spacecraft rendezvous, docking, and undocking technologies. On January 12, 2025, ISRO successfully brought SDX01 (Chaser) and SDX02 (Target) within 3 meters of each other. This positions India as the 4th country to accomplish this complex maneuver, following the USA, Russia, and China.
- ISRO achieved a historic milestone with its 100th launch from Sriharikota. The GSLV-F15 rocket successfully placed the NVS-02 navigation satellite into Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO), boosting India's NavIC system and enhancing its self-reliance in satellite navigation.

NATIONAL

- IIT Madras has partnered with the Ministry of Agriculture to launch Project VISTAAR, aimed at digitalizing India's agricultural extension system. The project will enhance access to advisory services, innovative technologies, and government schemes. It will also integrate solutions from over 12,000 agriculture-focused start-ups through the Centre for Research on Start-ups and Risk Financing, improving crop production, marketing, and supply chain management.
- Microsoft, under CEO Satya Nadella, has partnered with the Indian government and businesses to boost AI development in India.
 Collaborating with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) under the IndiaAI Mission, the focus is on fostering an inclusive AI ecosystem, promoting ethical AI, and investing \$3 billion in cloud and AI infrastructure over two years.
 This initiative aims to accelerate AI adoption, skilling, and innovation across the country.
- IIT-Madras has commissioned Asia's largest shallow wave basin at its Discovery campus in Thaiyur, Chennai, developed using indigenous technology. The facility, in collaboration with NTCPWC and the Ministry of Shipping, simulates complex wave and current interactions. It supports coastal engineering, port research, and climate change studies, enabling testing of coastal structures, floating solar plants, and post-impact analyses.
- The Western Ghats has been identified as a key hotspot for threatened freshwater species in the IUCN Red List assessment. The study reveals that one-quarter of global freshwater species face high extinction risk, with the Western Ghats being crucial for biodiversity conservation. The assessment covers 23,496 species, including crustaceans, fishes, and odonates, highlighting key extinction risks and threats.
- India's private space sector achieved a milestone with Pixxel and Digantara launching satellites aboard a SpaceX rocket. Pixxel deployed hyperspectral imaging satellites to monitor agriculture, defense, and climate, with high-resolution imagery for vegetation, water, and atmospheric conditions. Their first "Firefly" satellites offer six times the resolution of standard systems, and the company plans further expansion. Digantara launched the SCOT satellite, a commercial tracker for space objects as small as 5 cm in Low Earth Orbit (LEO), addressing space debris and congestion. Both missions focus on sustainability and space safety.



- ISRO achieved a milestone in space agriculture by successfully germinating black-eyed pea (lobia) seeds aboard its Compact Research Module for Orbital Plant Studies (CROPS). The CROPS-1 Mission demonstrated plant growth in a spacecraft's controlled environment, simulating Earth-like conditions. This breakthrough highlights the potential for sustainable food sources for longduration space missions, addressing astronauts' nutritional and psychological needs.
- Sarla Aviation, a Bengaluru-based aerospace startup, has unveiled 'Shunya,' India's first electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) air taxi prototype. This marks a significant advancement in urban air mobility, aiming to alleviate traffic congestion and pollution in Indian cities.
- DeepSeek is a leading AI company specializing in machine learning (ML), natural language processing (NLP), and data analytics to develop intelligent solutions for various industries. By combining advanced AI technologies with real-world problem-solving, DeepSeek aims to create scalable, efficient, and ethical AI solutions to benefit businesses, governments, and individuals.
- India is set to launch its first human-operated underwater submersible as part of the Deep Ocean Mission. Initially designed for depths of 500 meters, it aims to reach 6,000 meters by next year, marking a significant step in deep-sea exploration, resource identification, and advancing marine and space technologies.
- Recent findings show the Magnetic North Pole is shifting rapidly toward Siberia and Russia, impacting navigation, animal migration, and communication systems. Earth's geomagnetic field is dynamic, caused by molten metals in the outer core. The Magnetic North Pole was first located in 1831 by James Clark Ross and has been moving ever since.
- **BIMTECH** has launched **BIMCOIN**, a **blockchain-powered digital currency** for secure and efficient transactions on its campus. This makes BIMTECH the first business school in India to adopt such technology, following IIT Madras. The initiative marks a forwardthinking approach to integrating blockchain technology into the academic setting.

INTERNATIONAL

- Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV), discovered in 2001, causes respiratory infections similar to RSV. It affects children, the elderly, and immunocompromised individuals. Symptoms include cough, fever, runny nose, and shortness of breath. HMPV spreads via respiratory droplets and can cause bronchitis or pneumonia in severe cases. No specific antiviral treatment or vaccine is available. Recently, India reported cases in Bengaluru, and China saw a rise in cases. Preventive measures include handwashing, wearing masks, and avoiding close contact.
- A fragment of the original Wright Flyer fabric from the 1903 Kitty Hawk flight will be unveiled at the Frontiers of Flight Museum, Dallas, on October 2, 2025. Donated by Neil Armstrong's family, this piece was carried by Armstrong during the Apollo 11 mission in 1969, symbolizing the link between early aviation and space exploration. The exhibit will also feature an authentic Apollo 11 patch.
- Blue Origin successfully launched its New Glenn rocket on its maiden test flight, named after John Glenn, the first American to orbit Earth. The 320-foot rocket carried a prototype satellite into orbit during a six-hour mission, with the second stage reaching a high orbit to minimize space debris. This milestone marks Blue Origin's entry into competitive space exploration alongside SpaceX and NASA.
- Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD), also called "Zombie Deer Disease", is spreading among wildlife like deer, moose, and elk. While concerns about its transmission to humans have arisen, especially in hunters consuming infected meat, the evidence linking CWD to Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (CJD) in humans remains inconclusive. Further research is needed to assess the actual risk of human transmission.
- The Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) has discovered a new species of Indo-Burmese pangolin, Manis indoburmanica, which diverged from the Chinese pangolin around 3.4 million years ago. Using advanced genetic tools to analyze mitochondrial genomes, this groundbreaking find sheds light on the species' unique evolutionary history and underscores its importance for pangolin conservation and biodiversity in the Indo-Burma region, a global biodiversity hotspot.
- Elon Musk's X (formerly Twitter) is set to launch X Money, a digital wallet powered by Visa, as part of its strategy to evolve into a "super app". This move aims to integrate payment services with its existing features, competing with apps like WeChat, offering everything from **messaging** to **financial transactions**.
- Alibaba launched a new AI model, claiming it outperforms DeepSeek, ChatGPT, and Llama in natural language processing. The model boasts improved natural language understanding, context-aware responses, and better performance in handling complex queries. With increased efficiency, scalability, and real-time response capabilities, Alibaba aims to position itself as a strong competitor in the Al landscape.
- Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla will become the first Indian astronaut to pilot a space mission to the International Space Station (ISS) as part of Axiom Mission 4 (Ax-4), a private spaceflight scheduled for spring 2025. The mission, in collaboration with NASA, will see astronauts conduct research, educational outreach, and commercial activities aboard the SpaceX Dragon capsule. This milestone continues India's space exploration journey, following Rakesh Sharma's historic flight.



Sunita Williams, an Indian-origin astronaut, has set a new record for the longest spacewalking time by a woman, surpassing Peggy Whitson's previous record. Williams now has 62 hours and 6 minutes of spacewalking time across nine spacewalks. This milestone was achieved during a maintenance spacewalk on the International Space Station (ISS) alongside astronaut Butch Wilmore, as they remain stranded on the ISS since June 2024 due to technical issues with Boeing's Starliner spacecraft.

- Jasprit Bumrah became the fastest Indian bowler to reach 200 wickets in Test cricket during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy at the MCG in Melbourne, achieving the milestone in just 44 Tests, surpassing Mohammed Shami. His performance in the Boxing Day Test, including four wickets in the first innings, solidified his position among the fastest bowlers globally to 200 Test wickets.
- The Santosh Trophy 2024 final witnessed West Bengal clinching their record 33rd title with a 1-0 victory over Kerala at Gachibowli Stadium, thanks to Robi Hansda's decisive goal in added time, making him the tournament's top scorer with 12 goals.
- Devajit Saikia, former Assam cricketer, become the new BCCI secretary, while Prabhtej Singh Bhatia from CSCS take over as treasurer. Both are set to be elected unopposed at the BCCI Special General Meeting (SGM) on January 12, 2025, in Mumbai.
- Martin Guptill, New Zealand's prolific opener, retired after a 14-year career. He scored 14,877 runs across formats, including 7,346 runs in ODIs, ranking third on New Zealand's all-time list. His record 237* in the 2015 World Cup remains the highest individual score. Guptill also led New Zealand in T20Is with 3,531 runs and scored 2,586 runs in Test matches, with three centuries.
- Shreyas Iyer has been appointed captain of Punjab Kings for the IPL 2025 season. The announcement was made during a segment on 'Bigg Boss', where Iyer was joined by teammates Yuzvendra Chahal and Shashank Singh.
- Jasprit Bumrah (India) and Annabel Sutherland (Australia) were awarded the ICC Men's and Women's Players of the Month titles, recognizing their exceptional performances in international cricket.
- Smriti Mandhana set a record for the fastest century by an Indian in women's ODIs during the 3rd ODI against Ireland Women at Rajkot. Leading in Harmanpreet Kaur's absence, Mandhana's performance, along with a strong partnership with Pratika Rawal, bolstered India's dominant display in the series.
- In a remarkable achievement, **Arshdeep Singh** has overtaken **Yuzvendra Chahal** to become **India's highest wicket-taker in T20 Internationals.** This milestone was reached during the first T20I against England on January 22, 2025, at Eden Gardens in Kolkata.
- The Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) has introduced a new World Cricket Connects advisory board, which will replace the club's previous World Cricket Committee. In a significant development for global cricket, Jay Shah, the current ICC Chair and former Secretary of the BCCI, has been named as one of the 13 founding members of the newly formed advisory board.
- Former Australian cricket captain **Michael Clarke** has been inducted into the prestigious **Australian Cricket Hall of Fame**, becoming the 64th cricketer to receive this remarkable honor. The announcement, which has been widely celebrated, was made at the iconic **Sydney Cricket Ground (SCG)**, a venue that holds significant sentimental value in Clarke's illustrious career. The induction acknowledges Clarke's exceptional contributions to Australian cricket, both as a player and as a leader.
- Australia won the ICC Women's Championship for the third consecutive time, securing 39 points from 24 matches. The

This historic win marks the first Men's Final between the World No. 1 and No. 2 since 2019, and Sinner's straight-set victory highlights his growing dominance in men's tennis.

ATHLETIC & FOOTBALL

- Lionel Messi, captain of Argentina's football team, was awarded the United States Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest civilian honor. Messi is the second footballer ever to receive this recognition, after Megan Rapinoe in 2022. He could not attend the White House ceremony due to prior commitments.
- Anju Bobby George, a 2003 World Championships bronze medalist, was appointed Chairperson of the Athletics Federation of India (AFI) Athletes Commission. The commission includes prominent retired athletes, with Neeraj Chopra, a two-time Olympic medalist, as a key male member. It reflects progress towards gender parity, with six women out of nine members.

OTHER SPORTS NEWS

- Koneru Humpy, at 37, won her second Women's World Rapid Chess Championship in New York, marking a triumphant return after contemplating retirement. Her journey highlights resilience, passion for chess, and the ability to balance motherhood, family support, and a challenging chess career.
- Lakshya Sen, India's badminton star, secured third place at the inaugural King Cup International Badminton Open in Bangkok, Thailand. The 23-year-old from Almora defeated Alex Lanier in the bronze-medal playoff, showcasing his consistency and **resilience** despite a narrow loss in the semifinals.
- Kerala won their first-ever Senior National Men's Handball Championship title, defeating Chandigarh 34-31 in a thrilling final. The team's success was marked by standout performances, with Devendar named the Best Player and Rahul awarded Best **Goalkeeper** for his exceptional efforts.
- Haryana Steelers won their first-ever Pro Kabaddi League (PKL) title by defeating Patna Pirates 32-23 in the final at the Shree Shiv Chhatrapati Sports Complex, Pune. The victory was driven by strong performances from key players, with solid offensive and defensive strategies maintaining their control throughout the match.
- Hemanth Muddappa, also known as the "Drag King" of Indian motorsport, won a triple crown at the final round of the MMSC FMSCI Indian National Motorcycle Drag Racing Championship at the Madras International Circuit. This victory brought his total National titles to 15, solidifying his status as India's most decorated motorsport athlete, despite competing with a fractured thumb from a previous crash.
- The World Blitz Championship title was controversially shared by Magnus Carlsen and Ian Nepomniachtchi at the FIDE Rapid and Blitz Championship in New York, sparking outrage in the chess world. A video surfaced showing the players possibly strategizing to pressure FIDE into allowing the co-win, leading to accusations of match-fixing and manipulation of tournament rules. Prominent grandmasters and analysts have strongly criticized the decision.
- The inaugural Kho Kho World Cup began on January 13, 2025, at the Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium in New Delhi, with 23 nations participating. The opening ceremony featured cultural performances and the unveiling of the World Cup trophy, marking a

significant step in promoting Kho Kho, an indigenous Indian sport, on the international stage.

- Indian grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi triumphed in Titled Tuesday by defeating World No. 1 Magnus Carlsen and World No. 2 Fabiano Caruana. Erigaisi scored 10 points out of **11 rounds**, showcasing his dominance in the competition.
- PV Sindhu, the two-time Olympic medallist, has entered a multi-year partnership with **PUMA India**, marking the brand's official entry into the **badminton** domain. This collaboration aims to tap into the sport's growing popularity, with a fan base of 57 million in India. PUMA seeks to strengthen its presence in India's expanding sports market, while Sindhu continues to inspire millions with her achievements.

Earth Breaches 1.5°C Limit for the First Time in 2024	 In a landmark event for climate change, 2024 became the first year in recorded history when the mean global temperature exceeded the critical 1.5°C threshold above pre-industrial levels, as reported by the Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S). This breach marks a dangerous trajectory for global warming, bringing humanity closer to a point of no return. Climate experts warn that if this trend continues without drastic emission cuts, global temperatures could exceed the 2°C limit by 2050, with devastating consequences for ecosystems, economies, and human livelihoods. 		
Global Water Cycle Disruption in 2024 Caused Wayanad Landslides	• The 2024 Global Water Monitor Report highlights significant disruptions in the global water cycle due to climate change, which led to devastating water-related disasters worldwide. These events caused over 8,700 deaths, displaced 40 million people, and resulted in economic losses exceeding \$550 billion.

	• The report emphasizes how extreme weather events, such as landslides, floods, and droughts, are becoming more frequent and intense due to global warming, affecting ecosystems, livelihoods, and infrastructure. Among the major events highlighted, the Wayanad landslides in India stood out as a particularly destructive disaster.		
2025 Southern California Winter Wildfires	 In January 2025, Southern California experienced a severe wildfire outbreak that devastated large portions of Los Angeles, including celebrity homes and neighborhoods like Hollywood Hills. Wildfires such as the Palisades fire, Eaton fire, Sunset, Hurst, and Lidia fires led to significant destruction, killing 10 people, displacing 130,000 individuals, and delaying the Oscars nominations. Despite winter traditionally being an off-season for wildfires, these fires are particularly intense due to three main contributing factors: wet weather followed by dry conditions, Santa Ana winds, and climate change. 		
Banded Royal butterfly (Rachana jalindra indra)	 The Banded Royal butterfly (Rachana jalindra indra) was discovered in Sepahijala Wildlife Sanctuary, Tripura, on May 5, 2021, marking a key addition to the state's biodiversity. This rare species, now documented in the Munis Entomology & Zoology journal, is protected under the Indian Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, listed in Schedule II. The discovery highlights the importance of ecological research and wildlife protection in the region. 		

Miscellaneous

- The 2025 Tibet Earthquake, measuring 7.1 on the Richter scale, struck the Tibetan Plateau on January 5, 2025, causing widespread destruction and displacing thousands. The event highlighted the seismic vulnerability of the region, a geologically active area, and drew international concern.
- The ongoing Maha Kumbh Mela has witnessed a remarkable collaboration between the International Society for Krishna
 Consciousness (ISKCON) and the Adani Group, which has significantly enhanced the food distribution services at the event. This
 partnership ensures that nearly one lakh people are provided with nutritious meals daily during the 45-day spiritual gathering.
- Yala Glacier, situated in Nepal's Langtang National Park, has been a focal point for glaciological studies due to its significant retreat over recent decades. Recent analyses predict that this glacier may vanish by the 2040s, underscoring the profound impacts of climate change on the Himalayan cryosphere.
- A significant historical artifact, a Umamaheshwara metal sculpture, has been unearthed in Taggunje, Ajri village, Kundapura taluk, Udupi district, Karnataka. This intricate sculpture, believed to have been created in the 17th century using a 12th-century style, showcases a rare blend of Shaiva-Shaktha and Naga cult traditions, according to T. Murugeshi, a retired Associate Professor of Ancient History and Archaeology.
- In December 2024, the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) resumed excavations at the historic Buddhist complex in Ratnagiri,
 Odisha, after a 60-year hiatus. Spearheaded by ASI's superintending archaeologist D B Garnayak, the project seeks to further uncover Ratnagiri's rich history and explore material evidence of Odisha's connection to Southeast Asia's cultural and maritime heritage.
- The national capital is set to host the much-awaited New Delhi World Book Fair 2025, a grand celebration for readers, authors, and publishers alike. This event, scheduled to run from February 1 to February 9, 2025, will take place at the Bharat Mandapam in Pragati Maidan. With over five decades of legacy, the book fair promises to be a vibrant confluence of literature, culture, and knowledge.
- A tragic stampede at the Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj on January 29, 2025, resulted in 30 deaths and over 60 injuries. The Uttar Pradesh government formed a three-member judicial commission to investigate the disaster, headed by retired High Court judge Harsh Kumar. The panel, which also includes D.K. Singh and V.K. Gupta, has a one-month deadline but aims for an expedited inquiry.
- A groundbreaking study, "Antiquity of Iron: Recent Radiometric Dates from Tamil Nadu" by K. Rajan and R. Sivanantham, challenges the timeline of the Iron Age in India, suggesting it began as early as 3345 BCE in Tamil Nadu, much earlier than previously thought. The study used advanced techniques like Accelerator Mass Spectrometry (AMS) and Optically Stimulated Luminescence (OSL), providing evidence that iron technology was in use in the region, making it the oldest recorded in the world.
