# **National News**

# **Cabinet Approvals**

- The Union Cabinet, chaired by PM Narendra Modi, has approved the 26.463 km Rithala-Narela-Nathupur (Kundli) corridor under Delhi Metro's Phase-IV, to be completed in 4 years at a cost of ₹6,230 crore. Implemented by DMRC, this elevated extension of the Red Line will comprise 21 stations, enhancing connectivity across Delhi, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh, including areas like Narela, Bawana, and Kundli. The project aims to reduce road congestion and pollution while boosting the region's economy. With over 56% construction completed for Phase-IV's 65.202 km priority corridors, Delhi Metro currently operates 12 lines spanning 392 km and 288 stations, serving up to 78.67 lakh passenger journeys daily, making it India's largest metro network and a vital lifeline for the NCR.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by PM Narendra Modi, has approved the establishment of 28 new Navodaya Vidyalayas (NVs) in uncovered districts under the Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme at a total cost of ₹2,359.82 crore over five years (2024-29). These fully residential, co-educational schools will provide quality education from Classes VI to XII, predominantly for rural students, benefiting 15,680 students and creating 1,316 permanent jobs, along with opportunities for local vendors and workers. Currently, 653 of the 661 sanctioned NVs are functional, with nearly 49,640 students admitted annually to Class VI through a selection test. The schools, aligned with the National Education Policy 2020 and designated as PM Shri schools, have seen increased enrollment from girls (42%), SC (24%), ST (20%), and OBC (39%) students. Known for their excellent CBSE board results, NV students excel in engineering, medicine, armed forces, and civil services, showcasing the success of the scheme in promoting inclusive and quality education.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by PM Narendra Modi, has approved the opening of 85 new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) across the country under the Civil/Defence sector, along with the expansion of KV Shivamogga, Karnataka, by adding two sections to each class. This initiative, requiring an estimated ₹5,872.08 crore over eight years (2025-26 onwards), aims to provide quality education to 82,560 additional students and create 5,388 permanent jobs. KVs cater primarily to the children of transferable and non-transferable Central Government and Defence employees, as well as others in remote and underdeveloped areas. Established in 1962, KVs are known for their high-quality education, innovative pedagogy, and infrastructure, and are now designated as PM Shri schools under the National Education Policy 2020. With 1,256 functional KVs (including three abroad in Moscow, Kathmandu, and Tehran) and 13.56 lakh students enrolled, these schools consistently achieve top results in CBSE board exams, making them highly sought-after institutions for quality education.
- The Geological Survey of India (GSI) will collaborate with The Research Institute for Geo-Hydrological Protection (CNR-IRPI), Italy, through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) approved by the Union Cabinet on December 6, 2024. This partnership focuses on enhancing India's Landslide Early Warning Systems (LEWS) to international standards through collaborative research, aiming to improve landslide forecasting and mitigation, thereby preventing disasters like the Wayanad landslide in Kerala. GSI's National Landslide Forecasting Centre (NLFC) in Kolkata is already operational, providing daily landslide forecasts for Kalimpong, Darjeeling (West Bengal), and Nilgiri (Tamil Nadu), with testing underway in 13 additional districts. CNR-IRPI, a leader in developing regional LEWS models with advanced nowcasting capabilities, will contribute its expertise to integrate GSI's landslide maps with PM Gati Shakti, enhancing resilience in vulnerable hilly terrains. The collaboration plans to expand LEWS coverage with improved spatial and temporal resolutions across highly landslide-prone regions, ensuring sustainable development and environmental protection.

### **Parliament News**

### Lok Sabha Passes Railways (Amendment) Bill 2024 Amid Disruptions

The Lok Sabha passed the Railways (Amendment) Bill, 2024 during the Winter Session despite disruptions, with Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw addressing concerns over potential privatisation. The bill aims to subsume the Railway Board Act, 1905, into the Railways Act, 1989, simplifying the legal framework while empowering the Railway Board with statutory powers. Opposition leaders raised concerns over privatisation, centralisation of authority, and representation of marginalised communities, which the minister dismissed as unfounded.

### **Key Provisions of the Bill**

**Statutory Powers to Railway Board**: Grants the central government authority to determine the board's composition, qualifications, and terms of service, ensuring operational flexibility.

**Simplified Legal Framework**: Merges provisions of the Indian Railway Board Act, 1905, into the Railways Act, 1989, eliminating the need for dual references.

**Enhanced Connectivity**: Facilitates superfast train operations and expansions, including rerouting through Thawe Junction in Bihar, to benefit local communities and pilgrims.



### **Ministerial Clarifications and Achievements**

Privatisation Concerns Dismissed: Vaishnaw assured that railway assets remain government-owned, describing privatisation fears as a "fake narrative."

**Decentralisation Emphasised:** Highlighted 100% delegation of tendering powers to zone general managers, accelerating project approvals and decentralisation.

Improved Passenger Services: Cited plans for 13,000 additional trains and ongoing production of 10,000 general coaches to cater to low-income passengers.

### **Historical Context and Need for Amendments**

Legislative Evolution: The Indian Railways Act, 1890, governed railway operations until replaced by the Railways Act, 1989, which lacked statutory provisions for the Railway Board.

Simplification Goal: By incorporating the Railway Board Act of 1905, the amendment aligns historical provisions into a single, comprehensive framework for efficiency.

### Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 Set To Introduce in the Lok Sabha

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is set to introduce the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 in the Lok Sabha on 2nd December, 2024. The bill aims to amend several key banking-related legislations, including the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, the State Bank of India Act, 1955, and the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Acts of 1970 and 1980. The amendments are expected to enhance the functioning and regulation of the banking sector, and the bill will be considered for debate and passage in the lower house of Parliament.

Key Amendments in the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024

### 1. Definition of Fortnight for Cash Reserves

### **Current Definition**

The RBI Act defines a "fortnight" as the period from Saturday to the second following Friday (including both days) to calculate the average daily balance held by scheduled banks as cash reserves.

### **Proposed Amendment**

The Bill changes the definition of a "fortnight" to:

- The period from the 1st day to the 15th day of each month, and
- The period from the 16th day to the last day of each month.

### **Impact**

This change also applies under the Banking Regulation Act, where non-scheduled banks are required to maintain cash reserves.

### 2. Tenure of Directors of Co-operative Banks

### **Current Rule**

Directors of co-operative banks (except the chairman or whole-time directors) cannot hold office for more than eight consecutive

### **Proposed Amendment**

The Bill seeks to increase the tenure for directors of co-operative banks to 10 consecutive years.

### Impact

This extension is expected to provide stability in the governance of co-operative banks.

### 3. Prohibition on Common Directors in Co-operative Banks

### Current Rule

The Banking Regulation Act prohibits a director from serving on the boards of more than one bank, with exceptions for directors appointed by the RBI.

### **Proposed Amendment**

The Bill extends this exemption to the directors of central co-operative banks, allowing them to serve on the board of a state co-operative bank in which they are a member.

### **Impact**

This aims to enhance coordination and strengthen the leadership within the cooperative banking system.





### 4. Substantial Interest in a Company

### Current Rule

The Banking Regulation Act defines "substantial interest" as holding shares worth more than ₹5 lakh or 10% of the paid-up capital, whichever is less.

### **Proposed Amendment**

The Bill increases this threshold to ₹2 crore, allowing individuals and their families (spouse or minor children) to hold a larger stake before it is considered substantial.

This change is expected to relax restrictions on shareholding, particularly benefiting larger investors and corporate entities.

### 5. Nomination for Deposits and Bank Products

### **Current Rule**

The Banking Regulation Act allows **depositors to appoint a single nominee** for their deposits, articles, or lockers.

### **Proposed Amendment**

### The Bill allows up to four nominees for,

- Deposits (either simultaneously or successively).
- Other items like articles and lockers (successively).

### **Impact**

The Bill outlines that in case of simultaneous nominations, the distribution will be according to a declared proportion. For successive nominations, the person listed first in the order of nomination will have priority.

### Outcome

This will facilitate the distribution of assets and clarify the rights of multiple nominees.

### 6. Settlement of Unclaimed Amounts

### **Current Rule**

Under the State Bank of India Act and the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Acts of 1970 and 1980, unpaid or unclaimed dividends are transferred to an unpaid dividend account, and after seven years, they are moved to the Investor Education and Protection Fund (IEPF).

### **Proposed Amendment**

- The Bill widens the scope of funds that can be transferred to the IEPF, now including:
- Shares for which dividends have not been claimed for seven consecutive years.
- Interest or redemption amounts for bonds that remain unpaid/unclaimed for seven years.

### **Impact**

Individuals can claim unclaimed funds that have been transferred to the IEPF, helping to resolve outstanding claims and promote financial transparency.

### 7. Remuneration of Auditors

### Current Rule

The remuneration for auditors of banks is decided by the RBI in consultation with the central government.

### **Proposed Amendment**

The Bill empowers banks to determine the remuneration for their auditors independently.

### **Impact**

This amendment is expected to streamline the process and reduce bureaucratic involvement in the auditing procedures of banks.

### **State-wise December Month Important Events**

### **Arunachal Pradesh**

Mission Arun Himveer has been launched by the Arunachal Pradesh Government to improve market access for local farmers, SHGs, FPOs, and cooperatives. The Arunachal Pradesh Agriculture Marketing Board (APAMB) signed an MoU with ITBP to purchase fruits, vegetables, meat, and poultry directly from farmers. This initiative aims to boost economic growth in rural areas, support the Vibrant Village Programme, and promote reverse migration. A ₹4 crore revolving fund will ensure farmers receive 100% payments. (Click here to read article)



Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister has claimed that misinformation is being spread to mislead locals about the proposed Siang Upper Multipurpose Project (SUMP).

### Assam

- Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma announced a complete ban on beef in hotels, restaurants, and public places across the state, effective immediately. This move amends existing laws, extending the ban beyond the 5-km radius around temples and religious sites to include all public functions and events. (Click here to read article)
- India has achieved a milestone in wildlife conservation with the first-ever satellite tagging of a Ganges River Dolphin (Platanista gangetica) in Assam. This initiative, part of Project Dolphin, was a collaboration between the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Assam Forest Department, and Aaranyak, funded by the National CAMPA Authority. The tagging aims to enhance understanding of the species' migratory patterns and habitat use.

### Bihar

- Bihar's sex ratio at birth has declined to 882 females per 1,000 males in 2023-24, down from 894 in 2022-23, highlighting a severe gender imbalance. In response, the state has committed to stricter enforcement of the PC-PNDT Act and launched awareness campaigns to combat female foeticide and improve gender parity, positioning Bihar among India's worst-performing states in terms of child gender ratio. - NTPC plans to set up a nuclear power project in Bihar as part of its strategy to diversify its energy portfolio and expand non-fossil energy capacity. The company has approached the state government for land allocation to move forward with the project, which aims to meet future energy demands. (Click here to read article)

### Haryana

On Gita Jayanti 2024, Bhopal set a Guinness World Record with over 5,000 Acharyas reciting 'Karma Yog' from the Bhagavad Gita, while Kurukshetra saw 1.5 crore people globally joining via an online platform. The event in Bhopal highlighted spiritual empowerment, with funds transferred to the Ladli Behans welfare scheme. In Kurukshetra, 18,000 children chanted the Gita's verses, and leaders like Haryana CM Nayab Singh Saini and Union Ministers emphasized the Gita's impact on personal and societal growth. ### Karnataka

Uber has launched the 'Moto Women' pilot program in Bengaluru, offering an on-demand bike taxi service exclusively for female riders and drivers. The initiative focuses on safety, empowerment, and privacy, addressing concerns over bike taxi operations in Karnataka. Currently, around 300 women drivers are employed, providing a secure and flexible transportation option. (Click here to read article)

### Kerala

Kerala ranks fifth in the India Skills Report 2025, with an impressive 71% employability rate. The state is recognized for its talent, workplace inclusivity, and effective education and skill development. The report also highlights India's leadership in AI skill penetration and the transformative impact of AI on the workforce. Kerala secures the fifth position nationally, after Maharashtra, Delhi, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. (Click here to read article)

### Maharashtra

- Devendra Fadnavis has been elected as the leader of the Maharashtra BJP legislature party, paving the way for his third term as Chief Minister. Alongside him, Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar will serve as deputy chief ministers. The BJP won a historic 132 seats in the 2024 Maharashtra elections, contributing to the Mahayuti coalition's total of 230 seats, securing a commanding majority. (Click here to read article)
- Nitin Gadkari, Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways, inaugurated India's first bio-bitumen-based National Highway stretch on NH-44 in Mansar, Nagpur, Maharashtra. The stretch uses lignin-based bio-bitumen technology developed by Praj Industries in collaboration with CSIR-CRRI, NHAI, and Oriental. This milestone represents a significant advancement in **sustainability** and **self-reliance** in India's road development sector.
- The World Bank approved a \$188.28 million loan to Maharashtra to boost economic growth in its underdeveloped districts. Provided by the IBRD, the loan has a 15-year maturity with a five-year grace period. The project aims to enhance district-level governance, improve e-governance services, and encourage private sector involvement to accelerate economic development and **job creation**. - The Central government and Asian Development Bank (ADB) have signed a \$42 million loan to strengthen coastal and riverbank protection in Maharashtra. The project will address coastal erosion using hybrid approaches like offshore reefs and beach nourishment, while enhancing the resilience of tourism and fisheries sectors. It also promotes community inclusion, focusing on disaster preparedness with the involvement of women, youth, and vulnerable groups. (Click here to read article)



### Manipur

Manipur commemorated Nupi Lal Numit 2024, honoring the courage of women in the Nupi Lal uprisings of 1904 and 1939. Led
by Chief Minister N. Biren Singh at the Nupi Lal Memorial Complex, the event highlighted Manipuri women's pivotal role in
history and their continued progress. The Chief Minister emphasized women's empowerment and called for peace and unity
across the state. The uprisings were key moments in Manipuri history, with women protesting against British colonial injustices,
leading to significant political and social changes. (Click here to read article)

### Madhya Pradesh

- Madhya Pradesh has been recognized by the Wall Street Journal as a "Go-To Global Destination for 2025," highlighting its heritage, wildlife, and natural beauty. The state features iconic UNESCO World Heritage Sites like Khajuraho, Panna, and Bandhavgarh, along with vibrant cultural experiences and nine Tiger Reserves. The Madhya Pradesh Tourism Board is actively promoting these attractions to enhance global travel interest. (Click here to read article)
- IndiGoReach launched the Zero Waste Airport Project at Indore Airport in collaboration with the Airports Authority of India (AAI) and AAS Foundation. The initiative aims to minimize environmental impact using the 4R strategy: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Recover. The project focuses on sustainable waste management, behavioral change, and stakeholder engagement, targeting both airport staff and passengers. (Click here to read article)
- Ratapani Tiger Reserve, located in Madhya Pradesh, has been officially designated as India's 57th Tiger Reserve. Spanning 1,271.4 sq km, it includes a 763.8 sq km core area and a 507.6 sq km buffer area. This move strengthens India's commitment to tiger conservation and reinforces Madhya Pradesh's status as the "Tiger State of India".
- The 10th International Forest Fair in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh, runs from December 17 to 23, 2024. The fair focuses on sustainable forest practices, empowering women in the forestry sector, and promoting minor forest produce. The theme, "Women Empowerment through Minor Forest Produce," highlights that 50% of the workforce in this sector is women. The event fosters collaboration among government officials, traders, producers, scientists, and policymakers. (Click here to read article)

### Rajasthan

Amit Shah, Union Home Minister, unveiled an 11-ft tall statue of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel in Jodhpur, Rajasthan. The statue, weighing 1,100 kg and made of multiple metals, stands on an 8-ft pedestal. Shah highlighted Patel's contributions to India's unity and his recognition under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership. ### Telangana

- Telangana has joined India's mineral auction regime, auctioning two limestone blocks in Sultanpur and Saidulnama to NCL Industries and Deccan Cement. - The Telangana government, under CM A. Revanth Reddy, will launch the Rythu Bharosa Scheme after Sankranti, providing ₹15,000 annual subsidies to farmers. - Google and the Telangana government have signed an agreement to establish the Google Safety Engineering Centre (GSEC) in
  Hyderabad, Google's second such center in Asia Pacific. The center will focus on Al-driven security, advancing cybersecurity
  capabilities, and creating employment opportunities. GSEC will enhance cybersecurity for businesses, governments, and
  citizens, while strengthening Hyderabad's position as a global leader in IT and cybersecurity. (Click here to read article)

### **Tamil Nadu**

The New Pamban Bridge, India's first vertical lift railway sea bridge, is replacing the 105-year-old Pamban Bridge to improve connectivity between the Indian mainland and Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu. The 2.05 km bridge, costing Rs 535 crore, features a fully automated vertical lift span for 22 meters of air clearance for ships. Designed for double tracks and high-speed trains, it began construction in February 2020, with completion expected by June 30, 2024, after delays due to the pandemic. The original bridge was decommissioned in December 2022.

### **West Bengal**

West Bengal has gained international recognition with UNESCO declaring it a top destination for heritage tourism. Chief Minister
Mamata Banerjee highlighted the state's growth in religious, heritage, and tea tourism, driving job creation for youth. The focus
on enhancing religious sites and heritage spots is elevating the state's position in India's tourism sector. (Click here to read article)



### Uttarakhand

- Uttarakhand, known as "Devbhoomi," is set to become the first Indian state with a dedicated Yoga Policy, aiming to make it a global yoga destination. Building on Rishikesh as the "Yoga Capital of the World," the policy, led by Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami, integrates yoga, Ayurveda, and wellness to boost tourism, health, and employment, aligning with the success of the AYUSH policy. - Uttarakhand will be the first Indian state to implement the **Uniform Civil Code (UCC)** starting January 2025, fulfilling a promise by **Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami**. The UCC aims to standardize personal laws on **marriage, divorce, inheritance,** and **adoption** across religions and castes, excluding tribal communities. The **UCC Bill** was passed in February 2024 and received **presidential assent** in March 2024, marking a significant legal reform in India. (Click here to read article)
- Uttarakhand unveiled the mascot, logo, jersey, anthem, and tagline for the 38th National Games 2025 at Maharana Pratap Sports College, Dehradun. The Games, scheduled from January 28 to February 14, 2025, highlight the state's rich heritage and athleticism. The mascot "Mauli" is inspired by the Monal, the state bird, symbolizing ambition. ### **Uttar Pradesh**

- The Uttar Pradesh government has declared the Maha Kumbh area in Prayagraj as the new Maha Kumbh Mela district ahead of the January 2025 Kumbh Mela. - India's tiger population has grown significantly, reaching 3,682 in 2022, up from 1,411 in 2006, reflecting a 6% annual increase in monitored areas. This growth is attributed to conservation efforts under Project Tiger and the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). Key regional trends include a rise in Central India and Eastern Ghats (1,033 to 1,439), Shivalik-Gangetic Plains (646 to 819), and Sundarbans (88 to 101), while Northeastern India saw a decline, particularly in Arunachal Pradesh (29 to 9). - India has declared snakebite a notifiable disease, aiming to reduce the high mortality and morbidity rates, particularly in rural and tribal areas. This move, announced by the Union Health Ministry in November 2024, mandates reporting of all snakebite cases in healthcare facilities. - The **SMILE** sub-scheme, a **central government initiative**, aims to rehabilitate individuals, including **children**, involved in **begging**. Implemented across 81 cities in 26 states and Uts, it focuses on areas with significant religious, historical, or tourist importance. - India has been chosen to chair the 68th Session of the UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND), marking its first time in this role. Ambassador Shambhu S Kumaran assumed the chairmanship, overseeing global drug policy and international cooperation on drug control. The CND monitors drug trends, advises member states, and oversees international drug conventions, functioning under United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), based in Vienna, and is a functional commission of the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). - The Supreme Court of India granted a permanent commission to Lt. Col. In the Army, who was unfairly denied the same benefits as her male counterparts. The court highlighted gender discrimination and ruled that the officer should have received age relaxation like others in similar positions. The event celebrates the talent and entrepreneurial spirit of Divyang artisans and entrepreneurs, aiming to enhance the visibility and economic independence of persons with disabilities (PwDs). - The Supreme Court Collegium, led by CJI Sanjiv Khanna, recommended the appointment of seven Additional Judges as Permanent Judges for the Delhi, Karnataka, and Punjab & Haryana High Courts. The appointments include Justice Shalinder Kaur and Justice Ravinder Dudeja (Delhi), Justice Ramachandra Huddar, Justice Venkatesh Naik Thavaryanaik, Justice Vijaykumar Patil, and Justice Rajesh Rai Kallangala (Karnataka), and Justice Harpreet Singh Brar (Punjab & Haryana). This move addresses judicial vacancies in the High Courts.(Click here to read article)
- India joins 197 nations at the 16th Conference of the Parties (COP) of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), which commenced on December 2, 2024, in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, marking the convention's first-ever session in West Asia. Union Minister Bhupender Yadav and Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini lead India's delegation, presenting the ambitious Aravalli Green Wall Project and showcasing India's commitment to combating desertification. Theme and Focus: The 16th COP centers on the theme "Our Land. Our Future," emphasizing sustainable land management to reverse desertification and land degradation globally. Historic Context: The UNCCD, one of the three agreements from the 1992 Rio Earth Summit, entered into force in 1996 and includes 197 parties. The conference occurs biennially, with COP15 held in May 2022 in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire.
- India's first diabetes biobank has been established in Chennai through a collaboration between the ICMR and the Madras Diabetes Research Foundation (MDRF). The biobank will collect, process, store, and distribute biological samples to study diabetes, its causes, variations, and related disorders, advancing scientific research and contributing to global health research. - India has achieved a milestone in decarbonizing the steel sector with the release of its first-ever Taxonomy of Green Steel by Shri H.D. Kumaraswamy, Union Minister of Steel & Heavy Industries. The scheme is a response to alleged negligence by the BJP-led Central government regarding the Prime Minister Awas Yojana (PMAY). At the launch, held at the Nabanna Secretariat, Rs 60,000 was distributed to 42 beneficiaries from 21 districts. A survey identified over 28 lakh beneficiaries, with an additional 16 lakh expected to receive housing assistance before the 2026 Assembly elections.

- Javier Milei, Argentina's President, was granted Italian citizenship due to his Italian ancestry, sparking criticism in Argentina. Testing is expected after 2027. InspeCity has raised \$1.5 million, while Orbital Lasers has secured \$5.8 million. - Rodrigo Rato, former IMF Chief and Spain's Deputy Prime Minister, was sentenced to four years, nine months, and one day in prison by a Madrid court for corruption, tax offences, and money laundering. - Aisake Valu Eke has been elected as Tonga's new Prime Minister following the abrupt resignation of Siaosi Sovaleni. This political

- An Azerbaijan Airlines Embraer 190 jet crashed near Aktau, Kazakhstan, after being rerouted due to heavy fog. The flight, en route from Baku to Grozny, had 62 passengers and 5 crew members onboard. Several passengers were injured in the emergency landing, with a passenger capturing footage of the incident. The crash underscores the risks of rerouting and the unpredictability of air travel emergencies. (Click here to read article)
- China has approved the construction of the world's largest dam on the Yarlung Zangbo (Brahmaputra) River in Tibet, raising strategic and environmental concerns for India and Bangladesh. In response, India is building its own dam in Arunachal Pradesh. - The Ocean Anoxic Event 1a (OAE 1a), occurring 120 million years ago, was triggered by massive volcanic eruptions releasing CO<sub>2</sub>, causing global warming and oceanic anoxia. This event disrupted marine ecosystems, leading to plankton extinction and the formation of black shale deposits. Volcanic activity, particularly from the Ontong Java Nui complex, caused oceanic oxygen depletion, creating anoxic marine basins like the Black Sea. - A federal-level emergency was declared in Russia following a catastrophic oil spill on December 15, caused by damage to two Russian-flagged oil tankers near the Kerch Strait. Kuwait also honored PM Modi with its highest civilian award, 'The Order of Mubarak Al-Kabeer,' in recognition of his role in fostering bilateral ties.
- External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar concluded a tour to Qatar and Bahrain from December 6-9. In Qatar, he attended the Doha Forum, discussed regional conflicts, and met key leaders to strengthen bilateral ties. In Bahrain, he co-chaired the India-Bahrain High Joint Commission, explored new areas of cooperation, addressed the Indian community, and visited the historic Shreenathji Temple.

## **Monetary Policy Meeting Dec 2024**

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) conducted its latest bi-monthly Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting in December 2024. Governor Shaktikanta Das announced several crucial measures and projections to address current economic challenges while maintaining stability. Here's a detailed breakdown:

### CRR Cut by 50 Basis Points to 4%

To tackle liquidity concerns, the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) was reduced by 50 basis points to 4%. This move aligns with the RBI's neutral policy stance, aimed at ensuring economic stability without disruptive interventions.

### Repo Rate Unchanged at 6.5%

The MPC decided by a 4-2 majority to maintain the repo rate at 6.5%. The Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) rate and the Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) rate were also retained at 6.25% and 6.75%, respectively. This cautious approach reflects the central bank's focus on balancing inflation and growth.

### **GDP Growth Forecast Lowered for FY25**

The RBI revised the GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 6.6%, down from the earlier projection of 7.2%. Governor Das attributed the adjustment to weaker-than-expected Q2 growth and specific challenges in the manufacturing sector. Despite this, high-frequency indicators suggest potential stabilization ahead.

### **Inflation Projections for FY25**

The RBI forecasted an inflation rate of 4.8% for FY25. Food inflation is expected to persist during Q3 but may ease from Q4 onward. Quarterly projections are as follows:

- Q3 FY25: 5.7%
- Q4 FY25: 4.5%
- Q1 FY26: 4.6%
- Q2 FY26: 4.0%

### Support for the Agricultural Sector

In a significant move, the RBI increased the collateral limit for agricultural loans from Rs 1.6 lakh crore per borrower to Rs 2 lakh crore.

This aims to enhance financial support for farmers and boost credit availability in the sector.

### **Introduction of SORR Benchmark**


The RBI proposed a new benchmark, the Secured Overnight Rupee Rate (SORR), to strengthen market-based pricing mechanisms and enhance transparency in monetary operations.

### **New Communication Initiative: RBI Podcasts**

The RBI plans to launch podcasts as a communication tool to improve public engagement and transparency. This initiative reflects the central bank's commitment to leveraging technology for better outreach.

### **Measures to Attract Foreign Capital**

To boost foreign investments, the RBI raised interest rate ceilings on FCNR-B deposits and increased FCNR deposit rates. These measures aim to attract higher foreign portfolio inflows, which have totaled \$9.3 billion so far in FY25.





### **Addressing Unclaimed Deposits**

The RBI directed banks to segregate unclaimed deposit accounts using Direct Benefit Transfers (DBT). This step aims to ensure transparency and efficiency in beneficiary identification while facilitating the seamless flow of DBT funds.

### **Challenges in Domestic Consumption**

Private consumption growth slowed to 6% in the September quarter from 7.5% earlier, reflecting a decline in urban demand. Fixed investment growth also dipped to 5.4%. However, government consumption rebounded by 4.4%, driven by election-related activities.

These measures and insights reflect the RBI's balanced approach to addressing economic challenges while fostering growth and stability. The central bank continues to monitor developments closely, ensuring proactive and effective policymaking.

### **GDP & GROWTH RATE** as per October 2024

- India's **GST revenue** grew by **8.5%** to **₹1.82 lakh crore** in November 2024, driven by a **9.4%** increase in **domestic transactions**. Key figures include **Central GST** at ₹34,141 crore, **State GST** at ₹43,047 crore, **Integrated IGST** at ₹91,828 crore, and **Cess** at ₹13,253 crore. This follows a record **₹2.10 lakh crore** collection in April 2024. (Click here to read article)
- Morgan Stanley revised India's GDP growth projection for FY25 to 6.3% from 6.7%, following a 5.4% GDP growth in Q2 FY25, the lowest since March 2023. The slowdown is attributed to weaker private consumption and capital expenditure, though the services sector remained resilient. Despite this, Morgan Stanley expects a recovery in H2 FY25, driven by government spending, improved rural demand, and easing financial conditions. (Click here to read article)
- The OECD has upgraded India's GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 6.8%, citing strong public infrastructure spending, private consumption, and agricultural recovery. This growth momentum is expected to continue through FY25 and FY26, driven by investment and rural income growth. - Retail inflation for agricultural and rural workers declined in October 2024, easing to 5.96% for farm workers and 6% for rural laborers, down from 6.36% and 6.39% in September. This reflects an improvement compared to October 2023 inflation rates. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for both groups rose slightly, indicating a small increase in the cost of living. CPI-AL was 1,315 points and CPI-RL was 1,326 points, showing an uptick from September. (Click here to read article)
- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has downgraded India's GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 6.5% and FY26 to 7%, citing weak
  industrial output, low public spending, and tight monetary policies. Q2FY25 saw a slowdown to 5.4% growth. Despite these
  challenges, India's economy remains supported by strong agriculture, resilient services, and falling crude oil prices. (Click here to

- India's GDP growth projections for FY25 have been downgraded by multiple agencies due to global and domestic challenges.

• India's current account deficit (CAD) for Q2 FY2024-25 moderated to \$11.2 billion (1.2% of GDP) from \$11.3 billion (1.3% of GDP) due to strong services exports and improved net services receipts. Despite a higher merchandise trade deficit of \$75.3 billion, driven by increased imports, services exports in categories like computer services, business services, travel, and transportation grew significantly. - India's FDI rose by 45% to USD 29.79 billion in H1 of FY 2024-25, driven by growth in services, computer, telecom, and pharma sectors. The July-September quarter saw a 43% increase, totaling USD 13.6 billion. Maharashtra was the top recipient. Key investors included Mauritius, Singapore, and the US, with non-conventional energy also attracting significant FDI. (Click here to read article)
- The National Small Industries Corporation Limited (NSIC) achieved a milestone by paying a record Rs. 37.97 crore dividend to the Government of India for FY 2023-24. - India's retail inflation is projected to have fallen to 5.53% in November, down from 6.21% in October, primarily due to moderating vegetable prices, especially tomatoes. However, **core inflation** and volatile food prices remain concerns. **Food inflation** decreased to **9.04%**, driven by lower vegetable prices, though some items like **potatoes** and **garlic** continued with high inflation. - India's net direct tax collections for FY 2023-24 have risen by 16.45% to Rs 15.82 lakh crore by December 17, driven by a 21% increase in advance tax payments. This growth reflects improved tax collection mechanisms and efforts to reduce the fiscal deficit, with contributions from corporate tax, personal income tax, securities transaction tax (STT), and other levies. 

The U.S. military successfully tested its Long-Range Hypersonic Weapon (LRHW), also known as "Dark Eagle," at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station, Florida. The missile reached speeds over 3,800 miles per hour (Mach 5) and demonstrated its ability to strike distant, well-defended targets. This milestone in hypersonic technology brings the weapon closer to operational deployment by 2025. (Click here to read article)

#### **DEAL & MoU's**

- Adani Defence has delivered the Drishti-10 Starliner drone to the Indian Navy, enhancing India's maritime surveillance capabilities. The drone features 36-hour endurance, 450 kg payload, and is NATO certified for all-weather military operations.
   Designed for intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance (ISR), it offers persistent, autonomous monitoring of maritime threats, supporting satellite communication-based operations.
- The Biden administration has approved a \$1.17 billion deal under the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) program to provide advanced communication systems, sensors, and logistical support for India's Sikorsky MH-60R helicopters. This deal strengthens the India-US defense partnership and aims to counter challenges in the Indian Ocean Region. The MH-60R helicopters are equipped with anti-submarine warfare capabilities, including Mk 54 torpedoes and Hellfire missiles, along with advanced radar and sonar systems.



- Amit Shah, India's Union Home Minister, announced the creation of a comprehensive anti-drone unit to counter drone-related threats, particularly along borders. A laser-equipped anti-drone gun mount system has been developed through collaboration with the BSF, Ministry of Defence, DRDO, and Indian research departments. The system has significantly improved drone interception, with the neutralisation rate along Punjab's International Border rising from 3% to 55%. (Click here to read article)
- India is finalizing a **USD 4 billion** defense deal with **Russia** to acquire an advanced **Voronezh radar** system, enhancing missile detection and air defense. observe its outer atmosphere. The mission aims to demonstrate precise formation flying and advance understanding of space
weather. The satellites were placed in a highly elliptical orbit with a perigee of 600 km and an apogee of 60,000 km. (Click here

- ISRO and the European Space Agency (ESA) have signed a landmark agreement to boost collaboration in human space exploration. The partnership will focus on astronaut training, mission implementation, and joint research experiments. Signed by ISRO Chairman S. Somanath and ESA Director General Dr. Josef Aschbacher, the agreement establishes a strong framework for cooperation, enhancing the relationship between the two space agencies. The project, which represents the first of its kind in India, is being developed as part of a collaboration between the Indian Railways, IIT Madras' Avishkar Hyperloop team, and TuTr, an innovative startup incubated at IIT Madras.
- On December 12, 2024, ISRO successfully conducted a sea-level hot test of its CE20 cryogenic engine at the ISRO Propulsion Complex in Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu. This critical test demonstrated the engine's restart systems and showcased innovations like the Nozzle Protection System to mitigate challenges. The CE20 engine, with a thrust of 19 tonnes (upgraded to 22 tonnes), enhances India's space exploration capabilities, enabling heavier payload launches and contributing to missions like Chandrayaan-3 and Gaganyaan. This positions India among the few countries with indigenous cryogenic engines.
- The Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog, and UNDP, in partnership with Citi Foundation, launched the 7th edition of the Youth Co:Lab National Innovation Challenge for 2024-2025. Introduced in India in 2019, the initiative has empowered over 2,600 youth-led social innovation teams. This year, it focuses on social entrepreneurship to enhance opportunities and well-being for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), advancing Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). - India's first Undergraduate Minor Programme in Quantum Technologies, launched by AICTE and National Quantum Mission (NQM), will begin in the next academic session. Targeting engineering students in their third or fourth semester, the program focuses on subjects like quantum mechanics, quantum computing, quantum cryptography, and quantum algorithms. This initiative aims to develop a skilled workforce in quantum technologies, contributing to cybersecurity, artificial intelligence, and high-performance computing while advancing India's position in the global quantum arena. - A recent study by The Azadi Project and Refugees International highlighted "gross violations of constitutional and human rights" regarding the detention of Rohingya refugees in India. The study revealed that many Rohingya refugees remain incarcerated even after serving their prescribed sentences.
- Sea otters are helping control the population of green crabs, an invasive species, in California's Elkhorn Slough National Estuarine Research Reserve.
- The Balkan Blues, a traditional musical form, was recently included in UNESCO's National Inventory of Intangible Cultural Heritage.
- The vasilopita is an integral part of Greek New Year celebrations. The Vasilopita is a traditional Greek cake baked to celebrate the New Year.
- NASA scientists announced that the Parker Solar Probe survived the closest-ever approach to the Sun. Parker Solar Probe was developed as part of NASA's Living With a Star program, which aims to explore the Sun-Earth system and its impact on life and society.
- Egypt has tested a new 10-kilometre extension to the Suez Canal as it tries to minimise the impact of currents on shipping and increase the key waterway's capacity.
- Amid an online spat between Elon Musk and other right wing supporters in the US over H-1B visas, Donald Trump has said he has always liked the visas.
- In Cameroon, the NGO Papaye International runs a sanctuary for the Orphaned Chimpanzees on three islands in the **Douala-Edea** national park. The Cameroon Islands refer to the chain of volcanic islands associated with the Cameroon Volcanic Line, a unique geological formation stretching from the Gulf of Guinea into the mainland of Africa. The key islands associated with it are Annobón (Pagalu), São Tomé, Príncipe etc.
- **NATO** to enhance military presence in Baltic Sea after undersea power and internet cables cut.
- Researchers have developed a cost-effective point-of-care diagnostic service, FELUDA, for detecting H. pylori and its antibiotic resistance mutations in rural areas of India with limited access to diagnostic labs.
- A study by the Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore, reveals that the introduction of smart classrooms under the Smart Cities Mission has led to a 22% increase in overall enrolment in 19 cities from 2015-16 to 2023-24.
- The number of annual malaria cases declined from 7.5 crore at the time of independence to 20 lacs by 2023, with over a 97 percent reduction.
- China has approved the construction of the world's largest hydropower dam close to the Indian border, raising concerns in riparian countries — India and Bangladesh.
- On December 26, India commemorated the 125th Birth Anniversary of Udham Singh-a symbol of courage, justice, and unwavering determination.
- Australia's House of Representatives recently passed the "Online Safety Amendment (Social Media Minimum Age) Bill, 2024". The Bill imposes an obligation on certain social media platforms to take reasonable steps to prevent children under 16 years of age from having an account.
- India has sent a humanitarian aid consignment of 1,000 metric tonnes to Lesotho to assist with food security and nutritional needs.
- Rwanda has successfully managed its first-ever Marburg Virus Disease (MVD) outbreak and officially declared it over.
- Recent research highlights three geological sites along the Denali Fault that were once a united feature but were later separated by tectonic activity. The Denali Fault is a major intracontinental dextral (right lateral) strike-slip fault in western North America, spanning from northwestern British Columbia, Canada, to central Alaska, USA.
- Sagar Island in West Bengal, where the Gangasagar Mela takes place every January, is experiencing severe climate change impacts. Sagar Island, also known as Ganga Sagar or Sagardwip, is located in the Ganges delta on the continental shelf of the Bay of Bengal.
- J&K Chief Minister said his government will ensure that famed Pashmina shawls were not considered in the higher slabs of Goods and Services Tax (GST).





- As per the journal Nature, evidence supports an older age for the formation of the Moon, around 4.51 billion years ago. The Moon is thought to have been formed through a **collision between the early Earth and a Mars-sized protoplanet**.
- Masali village has become India's first solar-powered border village. It is situated in Banaskantha district of Gujarat. It is located 40 km from the Pakistan border The village of 800 people now has 119 houses with solar rooftops, generating over 225 kilowatts of electricity. This initiative, part of the PM Suryaghar Yojana, was carried out under the Border Development Project. Masali is the second solar village in Gujarat, after Modhera, and the first in a border area in India.
