Government Initiatives to Support Women Employees and Entrepreneurs in India

The Government of India has launched several initiatives aimed at promoting gender equality in the workplace and supporting women entrepreneurs. These initiatives focus on creating a safe, secure, and non-discriminatory environment for women employees while also fostering women-owned enterprises. Through legislative measures and various programs, the government seeks to ensure that women have equal opportunities for career growth, business development, and social security.

Legal Framework for Women's Empowerment in the Workplace The Companies Act, 2013: Ensuring Gender Diversity in **Corporate Boards**

The Companies Act, 2013, administered by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, contains provisions designed to ensure a gender-equal environment in corporate India. One key provision under the Act mandates that **listed companies** and other **public** companies with a paid-up share capital of Rs. 100 crore or more, or turnover of Rs. 300 crore or more, must appoint at least one woman director on their boards. This requirement is outlined in **Section 149** of the Companies Act, which is complemented by Rule 3 of the Companies (Appointment and Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014.

In addition, companies must include a statement in their **Board** Report, which is attached to the annual financial statement, confirming compliance with the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. This ensures that companies have a mandatory Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address any grievances related to workplace harassment.

Government Schemes Supporting Women Entrepreneurs

The Government of India has introduced a variety of schemes aimed at empowering women entrepreneurs by offering financial support, training, and capacity building.

Credit Guarantee Scheme for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGS) Under the Credit Guarantee Scheme for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGS), women entrepreneurs receive additional benefits compared to other entrepreneurs. This initiative is designed to provide financial support and guarantees to small businesses, helping women access capital to start or grow their enterprises.

Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) The Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) is a significant credit-linked subsidy scheme designed to generate employment opportunities in rural and urban areas. This program has a substantial focus on women beneficiaries, who receive higher subsidies compared to other non-special category applicants. PMEGP has been instrumental in promoting women entrepreneurship in India, especially in small-scale manufacturing and service sectors.

Stand-Up India Scheme (SUI)

The Stand-Up India Scheme (SUI) encourages entrepreneurship among women, Scheduled Caste (SC), and Scheduled Tribe (ST) borrowers. The scheme facilitates loans ranging from Rs. 10 lakh to Rs. 1 crore for greenfield enterprises. Each bank branch is mandated to provide loans to at least one woman borrower and one SC/ST borrower to promote economic inclusion and entrepreneurship in these communities.

Yashasvini Initiative

Launched on 27 June 2024, the Yashasvini initiative focuses on empowering women entrepreneurs, especially those in Tier-II/III towns. This program aims to enhance the capacity building of women entrepreneurs and to provide them with the necessary tools and support to establish and grow their businesses.

Legislative Provisions for Women's Protection and Welfare In addition to promoting entrepreneurship, the Government of India has enacted several laws to ensure safe, secure, and nondiscriminatory workplaces for women. These provisions also extend to maternity benefits and protection against sexual harassment at the workplace.

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (commonly known as the SH Act) provides a comprehensive legal framework for the prevention and redressal of sexual harassment in the workplace. The law mandates the constitution of an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) in organizations with 10 or more employees. In cases where the workplace has fewer than 10 employees, or when the complaint is against the employer, a Local Committee (LC) must be formed by the District Officer.

To facilitate the filing of complaints, the revamped Sexual Harassment electronic-Box (SHe-Box) was launched by the government on 29 August 2024. This initiative provides a centralized platform for women to file complaints related to sexual harassment, regardless of their employment status or the sector they work in.

Maternity Benefits and Workplace Equality

The Maternity Benefit (Amendment) Act, 2017 requires establishments with 50 or more employees to provide a creche facility for women employees. This measure ensures that working mothers have access to childcare facilities while maintaining their professional responsibilities. Additionally, the Code on Social Security, 2020 and the Code on Wages, 2019 provide maternity benefits and emphasize the need for gender equality in the workplace.





Supporting Working Mothers

To support working mothers, the government introduced the "Palna" scheme on 1 April 2022. This Centrally Sponsored Scheme provides daycare facilities to ensure that working mothers can balance their professional and parental responsibilities while their children receive care and protection during working hours.

Govt Adds 10 New Commodities to e-NAM for Better Market Access

The Indian government has expanded the scope of the National Agriculture Market (e-NAM) by adding 10 new agricultural commodities for trading. With this inclusion, the total number of commodities on the e-NAM platform has reached 231. The move is aimed at improving price realization for farmers and ensuring a more transparent and efficient trade system.

What Are the 10 New Commodities Added to e-NAM?

The newly introduced commodities include both raw and valueadded agricultural products:

- Dried Tulsi Leaves
- Besan (Chickpea Flour)
- Wheat Flour
- Chana Sattu (Roasted Chickpea Flour)
- Water Chestnut Flour
- Asafoetida
- Dried Fenugreek Leaves
- Water Chestnut
- Baby Corn
- Dragon Fruit

Among these, items like Chana Sattu, Water Chestnut Flour, Asafoetida, and Dried Fenugreek Leaves are categorized under secondary trade. Their inclusion is expected to help Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) gain better market access for processed and value-added products.

Why Was This Expansion of e-NAM Needed?

e-NAM, launched in 2016, is an online trading platform designed to create a unified national agricultural market. It connects farmers to **Agricultural Produce Market Committee (APMC)** mandis, ensuring a competitive and transparent price discovery system. The addition of new commodities aligns with the government's efforts to:

- Increase **market opportunities for farmers** by allowing more products to be traded online.
- Improve **price transparency and efficiency** through a standardized grading system.
- Support FPOs and small-scale producers in selling valueadded products.

This initiative follows extensive consultations with stakeholders to ensure better price realization and market access for farmers across the country.

How Will These New Commodities Benefit Farmers?

The Directorate of Marketing and Inspection (DMI) has introduced tradable parameters for these commodities, helping farmers secure fair pricing based on standardized quality checks. This move is expected to:

- Provide greater market reach by enabling farmers to sell beyond local mandis.
- Ensure **better income generation** through transparent price discovery.
- Promote agriculture diversification by encouraging the production and trade of high-value crops like baby corn and dragon fruit.

The Small Farmers Agribusiness Consortium (SFAC) under the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare manages the e-NAM platform, ensuring smooth operations and policy implementation.

Aero India 2025: India's Largest Defence Expo Begins

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated Aero India 2025, the 15th edition of India's premier aerospace and defence exhibition, on February 10, 2025, at Yelahanka Air Force Station, Bengaluru. This five-day event, regarded as Asia's largest in the sector, is a key platform showcasing India's advancements in defence technology, aerospace innovations, and global collaborations.

What Makes Aero India 2025 the Largest Edition Yet?

The scale of Aero India 2025 is unprecedented, spanning 42,438 square meters with participation from 30 defence ministers, 43 military chiefs, and representatives from 90 countries. The exhibition features an extensive display of 70 fighter jets, transport aircraft, and trainer aircraft, along with 30 helicopters performing aerial maneuvers.

One of the major highlights is the presence of Russian and American fifth-generation stealth fighter jets, including the Russian Su-57 and Lockheed Martin's F-35 Lightning II. Their participation signals India's growing stature as a global defence and aerospace hub.









Another key attraction is the India Pavilion, which showcases over **275 cutting-edge defence exhibits**. Notable innovations on display include the Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA), Combat Air Teaming System (CATS), and Twin-Engine Deck-Based Fighter (TEDBF). Alongside, the iDEX Pavilion, dedicated to Indian defence startups, features indigenously developed advanced technologies, reinforcing India's push for self-reliance in defence.

How is the Indian Government Supporting Defence Growth?

The Indian government has made a strong commitment to defence modernization. The Union Budget 2025-26 allocated ₹6.81 lakh crore to the Ministry of Defence, with ₹1.80 lakh crore set aside for capital acquisition. Importantly, 75% of this modernization budget is earmarked for domestic procurement, strengthening the Indian defence ecosystem.

Rajnath Singh also emphasized public-private collaboration in boosting India's defence manufacturing capabilities. A notable example is the Tata Advanced Systems Limited-Airbus joint venture for manufacturing C-295 transport aircraft in Gujarat. Such initiatives highlight the growing synergy between the government, private companies, and international defence firms.

How is India's Defence Industry Growing in Manufacturing and **Exports?**

India's domestic defence production is set to exceed ₹1.25 trillion (\$14.24 billion) by March 2025, a major boost to its Make in India initiative. This growth is driven by indigenous production of advanced fighter jets, missiles, drones, and defence systems. On the export front, India's defence exports are expected to cross ₹210 billion, setting a new record. The Indian government has been aggressively promoting defence exports, securing deals with countries in Southeast Asia, the Middle East, and Africa.

Aero India's Journey from 1996 to 2025

Since its launch in 1996, Aero India has grown into one of the world's most significant aerospace exhibitions. The 2023 edition recorded over seven lakh visitors, representatives from 98 countries, and 809 exhibitors, resulting in over ₹75,000 crore in MoUs and technology transfers. The 2025 edition aims to exceed these milestones, reinforcing India's strategic position in global aerospace and defence.

Aero India 2025 is not just about showcasing military strength; it represents India's ambitions to become a global defence hub, attract foreign investments, and strengthen international defence collaborations. The event reflects India's vision for selfreliance, technological innovation, and strategic global partnerships in the aerospace sector.

Henley Passport Index 2025: Singapore Ranks No. 1, India at 80th

The 2025 Henley Passport Index, compiled by Henley & Partners, ranks 199 passports based on their visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to global destinations. The rankings are based on International Air Transport Association (IATA) data, highlighting global mobility trends. Singapore holds the top spot, while India ranks 80th, sharing the position with Algeria, Equatorial Guinea, and Tajikistan. The report also highlights countries gaining or losing mobility privileges over the years.

NITI Aayog Unveils Report on State Higher Education

NITI Aayog has launched a policy report titled 'Expanding Quality Higher Education through States and State Public **Universities'.** Released by Vice Chairman Suman Bery, along with key officials from NITI Aayog and the Department of Higher Education (DHE), the report is a first-of-its-kind policy document focused on State Public Universities (SPUs). It provides detailed quantitative analysis on key aspects such as quality, funding, governance, and employability over the past decade. The report presents nearly 80 policy recommendations and a strategic roadmap to enhance India's higher education landscape, aligning with the goals of NEP 2020 and India's vision for Viksit Bharat 2047.

Key Highlights of the Report

India's Rank in Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI) 2024

Corruption remains a significant global challenge, affecting governance, democracy, and development. The Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI) 2024, released by Transparency International, ranks India at 96th position out of 180 countries, with a score of 38—a decline from 39 in 2023 and 40 in 2022. The CPI evaluates nations based on perceived levels of public sector corruption, using a scale from 0 (highly corrupt) to 100 (very clean).

Key Findings of CPI 2024

India's Ranking and Score

- India ranked 96th out of 180 countries.
- Score: 38 (down from 39 in 2023 and 40 in 2022).
- India ranked 93rd in 2023 and 40th in 2022.



The discussions emphasized AI's potential in innovation, economic growth, and bridging the digital divide. Leaders from various countries participated, highlighting the importance of global collaboration in AI.

Inauguration of Indian Consulate in Marseille

PM Modi and President Macron jointly inaugurated the Indian Consulate General in Marseille, a move symbolizing India's strengthening diplomatic footprint in France. This marked a historic moment as it was the first time a French President participated in the inauguration of a foreign consulate. The new consulate is expected to improve consular services, enhance trade relations, and boost cultural and educational exchanges between the two nations.

Tribute to Indian Soldiers in World Wars

During his visit, PM Modi paid homage at the Mazargues War Cemetery in Marseille, where Indian soldiers who fought in the World Wars are buried. This act of remembrance underscored the historical ties between India and France and highlighted the sacrifices made by Indian soldiers in global conflicts. President Macron also participated in the tribute, further strengthening the shared history between the two countries.

How Did the Visit Advance India-France Nuclear and Energy Cooperation?

Partnership in Nuclear Fusion Technology

PM Modi visited the International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor (ITER) facility in Cadarache, where India is a key partner. ITER is one of the world's most ambitious nuclear fusion research projects, aimed at developing clean and sustainable energy. The visit reinforced India's commitment to advanced scientific collaboration and highlighted France's role in helping India expand its energy capabilities.

Declaration on Small Modular Reactors

A major outcome of the visit was the signing of a declaration between India and France to establish a partnership on advanced and small modular nuclear reactors. The agreement aims to enhance cooperation in nuclear energy, particularly in developing innovative solutions for sustainable power generation. This marks a crucial step in India's efforts to expand its nuclear energy capacity while maintaining strong international partnerships.

PM Modi's visit to France in 2025 reinforced India's deepening ties with France across multiple sectors, from AI and nuclear energy to business and trade. The visit not only strengthened strategic cooperation but also paved the way for long-term collaborations that will shape the future of India-France relations.

One Year of PM Surya Ghar: A Bright Milestone

The PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana (PMSGMBY) marks its first anniversary on February 13, 2025, celebrating a year of promoting affordable solar energy for Indian households. Launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on February 13, 2024, the scheme aims to install rooftop solar panels in one crore households by March 2027, reducing electricity costs and promoting sustainability. The scheme has significantly boosted India's renewable energy sector and contributed to environmental conservation.

Wholesale Price Index (WPI) for January 2025: Inflation Rate and Key Highlights

The Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has released the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) for January 2025, reporting an annual inflation rate of 2.31% (provisional) compared to January 2024. The increase in inflation is primarily due to the rising prices in the categories of manufactured food products, food articles, non-food articles, and textiles. The month-over-month (MoM) WPI change for January 2025 stood at (-) 0.45% compared to December 2024, indicating a marginal decline in wholesale prices.

Key Trends in WPI Components for January 2025

The WPI is broadly categorized into three major groups: **Primary** Articles, Fuel & Power, and Manufactured Products. The trends in these categories for January 2025 are as follows:

1. Primary Articles (Weight: 22.62%)

- The index for **Primary Articles** declined by **2.01%**, decreasing from 193.8 (December 2024) to 189.9 (January 2025, provisional).
- Food Articles: Prices saw a decline of 3.62% in January 2025 compared to December 2024.
- Crude Petroleum & Natural Gas: Prices increased by 6.34%, indicating rising energy costs.
- Non-Food Articles: Prices increased by 0.66%.
- Minerals: A marginal increase of 0.22% was recorded.

2. Fuel & Power (Weight: 13.15%)

- The index for **Fuel & Power** increased by **0.47%**, rising from 149.9 (December 2024) to 150.6 (January 2025, provisional).
- Mineral Oils: Prices increased by 0.71%.
- Electricity: Prices rose by 0.20%.
- **Coal:** Prices remained unchanged compared to the previous month.

3. Manufactured Products (Weight: 64.23%)

- The index for Manufactured Products increased by 0.14%, from 143.0 (December 2024) to 143.2 (January 2025, provisional).
- Out of 22 manufacturing sub-sectors, 15 groups recorded price increases, 5 groups recorded declines, and 2 groups remained unchanged.

WPI Food Index and Inflation Trends

WPI Food Index (Weight: 24.38%)

The WPI Food Index, which includes food articles from Primary Articles and food products from Manufactured Products, declined from 195.9 (December 2024) to 191.4 (January 2025).

Annual Inflation Rate in the WPI Food Index

The inflation rate for WPI Food Index declined from 8.89% (December 2024) to 7.47% (January 2025), indicating a slowdown in food inflation.

Final Index for November 2024

- The final WPI for November 2024 was revised to 156.4, with an annual inflation rate of 2.16%.
- The final figures are based on updated data sources and response rates.

Compilation and Revision Policy

- The response rate for WPI compilation in January 2025 stood at 90.4%.
- The final WPI for November 2024 was compiled at a 95.5% response rate.
- Provisional figures undergo revision after 10 weeks as per the DPIIT revision policy.

Future WPI Releases

- The WPI for February 2025 is scheduled for release on March 17, 2025.
- DPIIT releases WPI data monthly on the 14th (or the next working day if the 14th is a holiday).
- The WPI is compiled using data from institutional sources and selected manufacturing units across India.

National Affairs

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the extension of the National Commission for Safai Karamcharis (NCSK) for three more years, until March 31, 2025. Established in 1993, the NCSK promotes the welfare of Safai Karamcharis (sanitation workers) by addressing their challenges and recommending programs to eliminate inequalities. It also monitors working conditions, health, safety, wages, and investigates grievances related to the non-implementation of welfare schemes. (Click here to read article)





- Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla announced the extension of translation services to six additional languages-Bodo, Dogri, Maithili, Manipuri, Sanskrit, and Urdu. 

Science and Technology News

Israeli researchers from the University of Haifa have discovered brain mechanisms involved in recognizing others' emotional states. Their study, published in Current Biology, highlights the medial prefrontal cortex (mPFC)'s role in emotional recognition and behavior. This breakthrough could have implications for treating social disorders like autism, where emotional perception and social interaction are often challenging. (Click here to read article)





- ISRO and IIT Madras have developed the IRIS (Indigenous RISC-V Microprocessor for Space Applications), an indigenous semiconductor chip. This achievement supports India's Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, aiming for selfreliance in space technology and reducing reliance on foreign tech. (Click here to read article)
- India launched 'Srjanam', the first automated biomedical waste conversion system, at AIIMS Delhi on February 10, 2025. Inaugurated by Dr. Jitendra Singh, this eco-friendly and cost-effective innovation, developed by CSIR-NIIST, aims to reduce environmental hazards by eliminating the need for incineration, offering an alternative to traditional biomedical waste disposal methods. - A research team led by Professor Wang Min from the Institute of Vertebrate **Paleontology** Paleoanthropology has discovered two Jurassic-era bird fossils in Fujian Province, China, dated to about 149 million years ago. The findings, published in Nature, challenge prior assumptions about bird evolution and show greater diversification by the end of the Jurassic period. The discovery of Baminornis zhenghensis, the oldest shorttailed bird, extends the origin of this feature by 20 million years, refining the understanding of avian evolution. - The European Space Agency's (ESA) Euclid telescope, launched on July 1, 2023, began its six-year mission to explore the dark Universe. In September 2023, during initial testing, Euclid discovered a rare Einstein Ring in NGC 6505, located 590 million light-years away. The ring, formed by gravitational lensing from a distant galaxy 4.42 billion lightyears away, underscores **Euclid's** capabilities in uncovering cosmic secrets, advancing our understanding of gravity, dark matter, and dark energy. - The International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor (ITER), under construction in France, is the world's largest tokamak-based fusion reactor. A collaborative project involving 35 nations, including the US, China, India, and EU, ITER aims to develop magnetic confinement fusion as a sustainable, carbon-free energy source. Its main goal is to achieve **burning plasma**, where the fusion reaction sustains itself. While not generating electricity, ITER will be a critical step toward future commercial fusion power plants. 
Obituaries News
